Dear Mrs. Chase:

Your letter commenting on my speech in behalf of the Indians is very much appreciated. You can be sure that I shall continue to fight for the Indians and their problems. I fully appreciate the troubles and hardships you are enduring.

I am enclosing the file of Mrs. Mary Many Wounds. Is this the file you want? Sorry to hear Mary died. She looked bad when I saw her last. Guess we all hae to go some time.

If you don't want this file, give it to Mary's people.

We are raising all the fuss we can about the way the Government is treating the Indians.
