

Population 6,500, Prevailing Winds, N.E. WATER FACILITIES

Water works system installed in 1885. Water supply from Missouri River which feeds well located two miles west of Post off. Three covered reservoirs, combined capacity seven million galls. located on bluff 160 ft above pumping station and 140 ft above business section of town. One Fairbanks—Morse compound duplex steam pump (16x24x 14x18) and one centrifugal pump capacity 1000 galls. per min. operated by electric motor against 200 ft, head.

Six miles of water pipes, 4"to 10" diam. New pumping station built and new mains laid in 1898 and 1905 which replaced almost all of original system. 73 double hydrants. "Domestic and fire pressure 85 lbs. per. sq. inch, gravity pressure only. Average daily consumption 1½ million galls.

One paid man constantly on duty at Figure Ho. One Yolunteer company of 13 men, paid on call. Three horses. One combination chemical, hook and ladder and hose Wagon, with one 40 gall chemical tank. Two hose carts 2500ft 21/2" cotton lined hose in good condition.
