I think I have told you that I am willing to give a hearing to everyone of your people who come here and are interested in the settlement of your relocation problems.

The same thing applies to Oscar Bear. I will try to arrange a hearing from him to testify as to his own opinions and any group he may represent out there.

I certainly will try to keep you informed as to the result of Mr. Bear's visit and I am also awaiting with interest the result of voting on Public Law 437.
