MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE MEETING

January 9, 1969

There being no corrections, the minutes of the December 5, 1968, meeting were ordered approved as submitted.

4.

Mr. Behsman moved that the Department of Education be allowed to employ the Pass-Fail marking system, beginning with the Second Semester of the 1968-1969 academic year, with respect to students enrolled in Student Teaching Laboratory and Supervised Student Teaching courses as follows:

Elementary Education

Educ. 455 - Student Teaching Laboratory	4 sem. hrs.
Educ. 456 - Supervised Student Teaching in the Elementary Schools	3 - 12 sem. hrs.

Special Education

Educ. 458 - Supervised Student Teaching in the Elementary Schools	2 - 6 sem. hrs.

Secondary Education

Educ. 476 - Supervised Student Teaching in the Secondary Schools	2 - 8 sem. hrs.

Since the Pass-Fail marking system would be compulsory for all students enrolled in the above named courses, the credit hours earned would not be used in determining the student's over-all grade point average. Also, this procedure would not preclude the possibility of enrollment in one course each semester during the junior or senior year under the existing Pass-Fail system. The motion was seconded. Discussion followed. Mr. Skidmore moved to amend the motion by substituting the words "Satisfactory-Unsatisfactory" in place of "Pass-Fail" in the first and second sentences in the motion. The motion to amend was seconded, voted upon, and carried. The amended motion was then voted upon and carried.

Mr. Behsman moved that the Department of Education be allowed to employ the Satisfactory-Unsatisfactory marking system, beginning with the Second Semester of the 1968-1969 academic year, with respect to students enrolled in Practicum, Observation and Micro-Teaching courses as follows:

Elementary Education

Educ. 340E - Practicum: Observation and Micro-Teaching 2 sem. hrs.

Secondary Education

Educ. 340 - Practicum: Observation and Micro-Teaching 2 sem. hrs.

Since the Satisfactory-Unsatisfactory marking system would be compulsory for all students enrolled in the above named courses, the credit hours earned would not be used in determining the student's over-all grade point average. Also, this procedure would not preclude the possibility of enrollment in one course each semester during the junior or senior year under the existing Pass-Fail system. The motion was seconded and discussion followed. The motion was voted upon and carried.

Mr. Behsman moved that the Department of Education be allowed to employ the Satisfactory-Unsatisfactory marking system, beginning with the Second Semester of the 1968-1969 academic year, with respect to students enrolled in Education 201 - Introduction to Teaching, 1 semester hour. Since the Satisfactory-Unsatisfactory marking system would be compulsory for all students enrolled in the above named course, the credit hour earned would not be used in determining the student's over-all grade point average. Also, this procedure would not preclude the possibility of enrollment in one course each semester during the junior or senior year under the existing Pass-Fail system. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried.

5.

Mr. Ulven presented the list of candidates for degrees in February, 1969, and moved that they be approved for recommendation to the State Board of Higher Education for the awarding of the degrees indicated, upon satisfactory completion of the work of the present semester. The motion was seconded. Mr. Johnson requested permission to have Ray A. Kuran's name added to the list of candidates to receive a Master of Science degree. There being no objection permission was granted by unanimous consent. The motion was then voted upon and carried. (See attachment)

6.

Mr. Hampsten moved that a committee be established to review the implementation of the Senate resolution of 6 January 1966 regarding efforts to raise funds for the library and to report its findings to the Senate at the earliest practicable time; and that the committee, which is to include the chairman of the Library Committee and a representative scholar, involved with library use and research, from each of the three broad areas of scholarship is to be appointed by the President of the Senate in consultation with the chairman of the Library Committee. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried.

7.

Mr. Perrone presented material, for the information of the Senate, on the New School's involvement with two public school districts serving Indian populations and the BIA School at Turtle Mountain, and a prospective undergraduate program in elementary education for selected Indians from the Turtle Mountain reservation.

8.

Mr. Perrone requested permission to introduce a proposal for a system of evaluation of student course work in the New School. There being no objection permission was granted by unanimous consent. Mr. Perrone then presented this proposal. Mr. O'Kelly moved that this proposal be referred to the Academic Policies Committee for consideration and that it submit recommendations to the Senate at its next meeting. The motion to refer to committee was seconded, voted upon and carried.

9.

Mr. Caldwell requested permission to include on the agenda an item concerning the Satisfactory-Unsatisfactory grading system. There being no objection, permission was granted by unanimous consent. Mr. Caldwell moved that the Academic Policies Committee be instructed (1) to restudy the Pass-Fail system in the light of Senate actions subsequent to the adoption of that system approving the offering of other courses on a Satisfactory-Unsatisfactory basis; and (2) to endeavor to formulate a single regulation covering the offering of courses on a Satisfactory-Unsatisfactory basis. The motion was voted upon and carried.

10.

It was moved, seconded, voted upon and carried that the meeting adjourn at 5:15.
