Dear Mr. Chapman:

I outlined to the discontented Indians of Fort Berthold Reservation, whom I think number a majority of the Indians, a letter, a copy of which I enclose.

I know of no other way to settle this continual turmoil among the Indians than to have a hearing before you on the subject. As you know, I have full confidence in you and have passed that word along to the Indians.

I think an airing of these grievances would finally bring about some unity. There may be nothing to their complaint and yet there may be, and that is what a hearing will determine.
