MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE MEETING

December 6, 1973

1.

The December meeting of the University Senate was held at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, December 6, in Room 7, Gamble Hall. Mr. Tweton presided.

3.

The Chair asked if there were any corrections to the November minutes. Mr. Johnson moved to include the supplementary listing of courses acted upon at the November 1, 1973, meeting, which were omitted from the minutes. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried.

Mr. Mitchell moved to correct the minutes of November 15, to show that recommendation # 3 of the Academic Policies Committee was voted upon and carried. The motion was seconded. Discussion followed. The motion was voted upon and carried. There being no other corrections, the Chairman declared approval by unanimous consent of the minutes as corrected.

4.

Mr. Penn moved that the unfinished business from the last meeting be placed on the agenda at this time. The motion was seconded. There being no objection, the Chair declared the motion adopted by unanimous consent and called upon Mr. Whitcomb, Chairman of the Academic Policies Committee who presented recommendation # 4 of the committee report, which reads:

The University Bulletin, University Time Schedule of Classes, and all forms used by students, faculty or administration for implementation of the S-U grading system must include a warning such as the following:

"Students who utilize the S-U grading system are cautioned that they may encounter difficulty in having such credit accepted, should they attempt to transfer credit to another university, change majors, or make application for graduate or professional study."

Mr. Penn moved adoption of the proposed recommendation. The motion was seconded. Mr. Rushing moved to amend the motion by adding the words, "or evaluated," in the second sentence so that sentence shall read: "Students who utilize the S-U grading system are cautioned that they may encounter difficulty in having such credit accepted or evaluated, should they attempt to transfer credit to another university, change majors, or make application for graduate or professional study." There being no objection, the amendment was accepted. Mr. Penn moved to amend the motion by inserting the word, "appropriate," after the word, "all," in the first sentence so the recommendation shall read:

The University Bulletin, University Time Schedule of Classes, and all appropriate forms used by students, faculty or administration for implementation of the S-U grading system must include a warning such as the following:

"Students who utilize the S-U grading system are cautioned that they may encounter difficulty in having such credit accepted or evaluated, should they attempt to transfer credit to another university, change majors, or make application for graduate or professional study."

The motion to amend was seconded, voted upon and carried. The motion, as amended, was voted upon and carried.

5.

Mr. Koenig moved the approval of recommendation # 5 of the Academic Policies Committee which reads:

For mini-courses, the final drop date shall be fixed at one week before the end of each mini-course. (Mini-courses for this purpose are defined as courses at

least three weeks but not more than twelve weeks in duration.) Notification of this policy shall be made in the Time Schedule of Classes and announced at the beginning of each course.

The motion was seconded. Discussion followed. Mr. Robertson moved to refer the recommendation back to the Academic Policies Committee. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried.

6.

Mr. Penn moved the approval of recommendation # 6 of the Academic Policies Committee that the University attendance policy be changed to read:

It is the University policy that attendance in classes is expected of all students. Attendance and participation in class discussions are considered integral parts of a university education. However, grades will be a measure of a student's performance in required work during the semester and the final examination, not of his attendance. Except in seminar, laboratory or similar classes wherein participation is crucial, a student's grade may not be affected by the attendance standard of an individual instructor.

The motion was seconded. Mr. Robertson moved to amend the motion by deleting the word, "similar," in the last sentence. The motion was seconded. Discussion followed. The motion to amend was voted upon and carried. Mr. Phillips moved to amend by reversing the order of sentences one and two and deleting the remainder of the recommendation so that it would read: "Attendance and participation in class discussions are considered integral parts of a university education. It is the University policy that attendance in classes is expected of all students." The motion was seconded and discussion followed. Mr. Rude moved an amendment to the amendment to include a third sentence which reads: "However, grades will be a measure of a student's performance in required work during the semester and the final examination, not of his attendance." The motion was seconded. Discussion followed. Mr. Kolstoe moved to refer the original recommendation with all amendments back to the Academic Policies Committee. The motion was seconded. Discussion followed. The motion to refer was voted upon and lost. The motion to include the sentence, "However, grades will be a measure of a student's performance in required work during the semester and the final examination, not of his attendance," was voted upon and lost. Mr. O'Kelly moved and it was seconded that the amendment to reverse the order of the first two sentences and to delete the remainder of the paragraph be voted upon immediately. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. The amendment was voted upon and carried. Mr. Brown moved to amend the amended motion by adding: "Students will be informed, during the first class week, of the policy concerning attendance." The motion was seconded. Mr. Rude moved to postpone action until the next meeting. The motion was seconded, voted upon and lost. Mrs. Russell moved to amend the amendment by adding "in that course," to the sentence so that it would read: "Students will be informed, during the first class week, of the policy concerning attendance in that course." The motion to amend was seconded, voted upon and carried. Mr. Tomasek moved that a vote be taken immediately on the amendment to the amended main motion. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried.

The motion to amend the amended main motion was voted upon and carried. Mr. Ford moved to vote immediately on the amended main motion. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. Mr. Rude moved that there be a roll call vote. The motion was seconded, voted upon and lost. The main motion, as amended, was voted upon and carried.

7.

Mr. Johnson moved to suspend the standing rule regarding the 5:30 adjournment time to complete the agenda. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried.

8.

Mr. Ulven presented the tentative list of Candidates for Degrees in December, 1973, and stated that on page 7 of the agenda, the title of Degree of Bachelor of Science in Physical Education should be changed to read, Degree of Bachelor of Science in Health, Physical Education and Recreation. He also stated that the following candidates should be added to the list: Master of Arts, Lawrence E. Henneke and Shu-Mei Hwang; Master of Science, Robert D. Walker; Doctor of Education, Aron Sawatzky. Mr. Ulven moved that the list, as corrected, be approved for recommendation to the State Board of Higher Education for the awarding of the degrees indicated, upon satisfactory completion of the work of the present semester. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. (See attachment to Senate Agenda of November 29, 1973.)

9.

Mr. Omdahl, Chairman of the Committee on Committees, presented the report of the Committee on Committees. The Chair called for the election of the Administrative Procedures Committee. Mr. Omdahl presented the nominations from the Committee on Committees as follows: Ronald Apanian, Lloyd Jarman, Walter Koenig, Ernest Norman and LaVonne Russell. The Chair called for additional nominations from the floor. Mr. Reid nominated Gordon Iseminger. The Chair declared nominations closed. Mr. Penn moved that tabulation of the ballots for the Administrative Procedures, Codification and the Committee on Committees be accomplished after adjournment, be certified by the Senate Executive Committee and that the results be reported in the minutes. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. A ballot was taken and Mr. Apanian, Mr. Norman, Mr. Iseminger and Mrs. Russell were declared elected as members of the Administrative Procedures Committee.

10.

The Chair called for nominations for the election of one Senate member to the Codification Committee. Mr. Omdahl reported the nomination of Mr. Rushing by the Committee on Committees. The Chair asked for nominations from the floor and since there were none, a ballot was taken and Mr. Rushing was elected.

11.

The Chair called for nominations for the election of four Senate members to the Committee on Committees. Mr. Omdahl presented the nominations from the Committee on Committees as follows: Beulah Hedahl, Stanley Murray, Robert Nordlie, Monte Phillips and David Ramsett. The Chair called for nominations from the floor and since there were none, declared nominations closed. A ballot was taken and Miss Hedahl, Mr. Murray, Mr. Phillips and Mr. Ramsett were elected.

12.

Mr. Keonig moved for adjournment. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried and the meeting adjourned at 5:45 p.m.
