

Again - please come.



Editor's note: This is a reprint of a letter mailed by Ray Patton, President.





I am sending you a booklet copy of the account of the 164th Infantry Regiment Guadalcanal Campaign (1942-1943) written by LTC Samuel Baglien, Executive Officer of the unit during the campaign. My friendship with Col. Baglien began with my retirement to Yucca Valley in 1969 where it was my good fortune to meet him as an earlier retiree there. He and I became friends as members of both the American Legion and The Retired Officers Association. A copy of his obituary is also enclosed.

I had this booklet made up as a memorial to "Colonel Sam" as well as to the memory of those North Dakotans who served in the Guadalcanal Campaign and especially the many who made the supreme sacrifice with their lives. All this will be without cost to the recipients: NDNG Headquarters, the 164th Infantry Association, North Dakota State University, members of Colonel Baglien's family and a few individuals who are interested. My complimentary copy to NDSU will be in memory of Major Stafford Ordahl and Captain George Newgard whom I knew in R.O.T.C. at NDSU.

In a letter from NDNG Headquarters it was suggested that your association might be interested in also receiving a copy of the booklet. I then had sufficient copies made up for the library of each city who had a unit in the campaign, hoping that the 164th Infantry Association will be able and willing to forward the booklets to the pertinent libraries if I send them to you in bulk.

My own interest in the NDNG goes back to my Headquarters Company, Fargo, membership (1927-1930). Upon graduation from North Dakota State University in 1930, I received my commission in the U.S. Army Reserve and served on active duty from June 27, 1941 to January 12, 1946 receiving my commission as Major AUS Reserve, retired in 1968 at age 60.

I hope that I will hear from you shortly regarding your ability to forward the booklets to the pertinent libraries, then I will send them to you.
