Dear Mr. Grimson:

I am in receipt of a letter from Judge
W. J. Kneeshaw in which he speaks of you most
highly and in which he states that he has
considered the case of State Vs. Steppe most
carefully and that he is satisfied with the
way it was disposed of.

Inasmuch as you and Judge Kneeshaw both
feel that the case was handled properly, and
in view of the statements of Mrs. [redacted] and daughter
when they were here, I know of nothing that I can
do to help them and as far as I am concerned the
case is terminated. I know of nothing I could
do under any power given me by law after Judge
Kneeshaw has made his findings.
