Dear Governor Langer:


At different times we have received requests from our State Office for a report on a client who has written to you complaining of the way we are taking care of his case.

In order for us to give you the proper information, we suggest that a copy of the client's letter accompany your request for a report on the case. In this way we will be in a better position to cope with the situation.

We are not surprised to know that clients write to you and to others complaining of the treatment they receive from us, as it is practically impossible for us here at the County Office to know the exact circumstances at all times, among the 700 families that we are responsible for. We have a County Advisory Committee consisting of 7 members living in various parts of the County. Every case is acted on and recommended for definite disposal by this Committee. We meet on an average of once every 3 weeks. With roads blocked, it is impossible for us to make many home visits, although during the year 1936 we called on over 300 farm homes in Mercer County.

We shall appreciate your cooperation in handling this work, and will at all times be glad to give you desired information.
