A motion was made to approve the minutes of the meeting of December 1, 1977. The motion was seconded. Mr. Selbyg requested that a correction be made in

item 10 as he did not request permission to include in the minutes the reason he withdrew his item. Mr. Lewis stated that his name should replace Mr. Selbyg's. Mr. Penn said that a correction should be made in item 8, changing the word, Registrar, to Secretary of the Senate. The corrections were made. Mr. Pynn asked that the minutes, as corrected, be approved. The motion was voted upon and carried.

4.

Mr. Markovich moved a recommendation from the Senate Executive Committee to change the first sentence of the Senate Bylaws under Meetings to read: Items for the agenda shall be in the hands of the Secretary of the Senate not later than 14 days (exclusive of holidays) before a Senate Meeting. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. The Chair announced that this would be implemented for the March meeting.

5.

Mr. Lewis moved the following substitute motion:

Be it resolved that if the University is required to make financial reductions or adjustments which seriously affect the academic mission of the University in teaching and research, any such reductions or adjustments not take place initially or solely within the instructional budget. Initial consideration for reductions or adjustments in cases of financial exigencies will be given to the non-instructional budgets (notably the administrative and instructional support categories of the University of North Dakota budget), and proportionate reduction or adjustment in the non-instructional budgets must be a part of the total of any such reduction or adjustment.

In such cases, the University Senate shall elect a review committee with representation of administrative staff and tenured and non-tenured faculty to determine and establish the proportionate balance for financial reductions or adjustments within the categories of the University's budget.

The motion was seconded and discussion followed. Mr. Johnson moved to amend the motion by changing the words in the second paragraph, to determine and establish, to the words, to recommend. The motion to amend was seconded, voted upon and carried. Mr. Fletcher moved to amend the motion by removing the words in the second paragraph, proportionate balance for, and the word, proportionate, in the first paragraph. The motion was seconded and discussion followed. The motion to amend was voted upon and defeated. The substitute motion, as amended, was voted upon and carried.

6.

Ms. Schwartz moved that the University Senate shall designate a standing committee with substantial representation of nontenured as well as tenured faculty members whose responsibility it shall be to determine whether or not a demonstrable bona fide condition exists, or is imminent, which could result in decisions concerning the continuance of institutional programs and faculty appointments, reappointments

(or decisions not to reappoint), promotions, the granting of tenure, and dismissal because of financial exigency, that is, an imminent financial crisis which threatens the survival of the institution as a whole and which cannot be alleviated by less drastic means.

The motion was seconded. Discussion followed regarding whether a new committee should be established or whether a current committee should have this responsibility. Ms. Clark moved that the motion be referred to the Committee on Committees for resolution. The motion to refer was seconded and further discussion followed. Mr. O'Kelly requested that if the motion to refer was passed, it would include reporting back to the Senate at the March meeting. Ms. Clark accepted this change. The Chair asked if there was any objection to including the change in the motion. There being no objection, it was included. The motion to refer was voted upon and carried.

7.

Mr. Ronald Moe, Chairperson of the Academic Policy Committee, presented that committee's report. (See attachment #1.) Mr. Markovich moved acceptance of the report. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried.

8.

Mr. Ulven presented the report of the Academic Standards Committee and moved its acceptance. (See attachment #2.) The motion was seconded. Mr. Selbyg requested that the names of the committee members be included with the minutes. There being no objection to the request, the member's names are included in the report. The motion was voted upon and carried.

9.

Mr. F. D. Holland, Jr., Chairperson of the Library Committee, presented the revised system for distributing book monies. Mr. Rogers asked that another point be noted as part of the report and that is the concern with strengthening developing collections in certain areas. The Chair asked if there was any objection to including this point with the report and since there was none, it was included. Mr. Johnson moved that the Senate accept the report. (See attachment #3.) The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried.

10.

Mr. Sundre moved that the University Senate approve the preparation of a proposal, prepared jointly with North Dakota State University, requesting participation in the University of Mid-America to present to the North Dakota State Board of Higher Education for their sanction. The motion was seconded and discussion followed. Mr. Johnson moved to suspend the standing rule of the Senate on 5:30 p.m. adjournment until completion of the item under discussion. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. Discussion continued. Mr. Hamerlinck moved to vote immediately on the question. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. The original motion was voted upon and carried.

A motion was made to adjourn. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. The meeting adjourned at $5:50~\rm p.m.$

1977 ANNUAL REPORT

ACADEMIC POLICIES COMMITTEE

The elective members on the APC serve on an academic year basis. Hence, during the calendar year 1977 the APC was structured as follows.

Fourteen meetings were held throughout the calendar year and twelve agenda items were acted upon. Of the twelve, three engendered inputs to University Senate, four were disposed of within Committee and five are being carried over into 1978. A brief description of each follows.

Considerations Completed with Recommendations to Senate

Upon request by Senate the APC addressed the matter of drop dates for minicourses. This resulted in a recommendation back to Senate in March which read "that the drop date for less than full semester courses (mini-courses) be 2/3 of the completion time of those courses". This was subsequently ratified.

Upon request by the Graduate School the APC addressed the matter of instituting a new grading system. This resulted in a recommendation to Senate in March which read "that beginning with the fall semester of 1978-79, the University implement a grading system with

This was subsequently rejected.

Upon request by the Committee on Committees the APC formulated a revised statement of charge for itself. This was subsequently submitted to Senate through the Senate Executive Committee and action is pending.

Considerations Completed without Recommendations to Senate

Upon request by the Division of Continuing Education the APC considered extending the current 30 credit hour limitation for courses taken by correspondence. It was decided by Committee vote that present policy should be retained, in that any exceptions thereto which are deemed justifiable can be handled on a case-by-case basis by the Administrative Procedures Committee.

Upon request by some students the APC considered a new "grade bankruptcy" proposal. After considerable deliberation this was rejected by Committee vote.

Upon Request by some faculty members the APC undertook to weigh the merits of changing from the present S/U system to a counterpart P/F system. Arguments presented were deemed weaker for than against and, hence, the Committee voted to not recommend.

Of its own volition the APC decided to attempt to resolve the annually recurring question of whether or not students should be allowed to repeat courses in which grades of C or better have been earned. This undertaking resulted in the Committee's voting to retain the University's present policy concerning same, after it became evident that the academic community is basically evenly divided on this question.

Considerations Continuing

Upon request by the Vice President for Academic Affairs the APC undertook a comprehensive review of the Honors Program. This resulted in the establishment of an ad hoc subcommittee to which the review was assigned. Their final report has not yet been received by the APC but is expected shortly.

Upon request by the Dean for Student Development and the Vice President for Academic Affairs the APC initiated the drafting of a formal Student Academic Grievance Procedure. This document should be finalized early in the Spring Semester, 1978.

Upon request by an Academic Dean the APC undertook to review the University's current Baccalaureate degree granting policies. Results of this study should be forthcoming in early 1978.

Of its own volition the APC decided to initiate a comprehensive review of the S/U grading system. This review is just getting underway and will be assigned to an ad hoc subcommittee as was done with the review of the Honors Program.

Of its own volition the APC decided to also initiate a comprehensive review of the University's current drop/add policies. This review is also just getting underway and will be assigned to an ad hoc subcommittee as was done with the review of the Honors Program.

The Academic Standards Committee met 11 times during the last year. It considered applications for reinstatement from 93 former students and granted permission to re-enroll on academic probation to 71 of them. As its other main function it considered requests for grade forgiveness from 28 students and granted the request of 16.

Re: REVISED SYSTEM FOR DISTRIBUTING BOOK MONIES

Pursuant to a University Senate resolution of November 3, the University Library Committee (with the aid of the Library Staff) has arrived at a revised book monies distribution formula.

During the course of our deliberations inputs were sought from each of the departments; and, the resulting suggestions were carefully considered. We feel that the various concerns with respect to the presently-suspended formula have been adequately addressed in the new proposal, outlined below.

- I. Two-thirds of the University Library's monies available for books each year will be dedicated to the departments for purposes of initiating purchase requests through Library Staff; one-third will remain in the Library's general fund (application of this ratio will yield \$128,718 to the departments and \$64,359 to the general fund for the 1977/78 year).
- II. The formula, as such--to be applied to the monies dedicated to the departments--contains the following factors:
- A. A base amount for each department with a master's program equal to 0.4 percent of the total book monies available to the departments and a base amount for each department with a doctoral program equal to 0.8 percent of the total book monies available to the departments. A department with both a master's and doctoral program, thus, would have a total base equalling 1.2 percent of the total book monies available in any given year.

Rationale - Recognizes the need to support, on a "guaranteed" (regardless of enrollment) basis, graduate programs for which a University commitment has been made. Too, it recognizes research activity which is especially associated with the graduate degree departments.

Data - The most current Bulletin of the Graduate School.

B. Student credit hours (SCH's) attributed to each of the respective departments over the two semesters of the previous academic year, employed for each department as a ratio of total SCH's.*

Rationale - Recognizes the pressures on Library book collections resulting from numbers of people, at all levels, enrolled in the various programs.

- Research $\frac{\text{Data}}{(\text{e.g., Fall, 1976} \text{ and Spring, 1977} \text{ for the 1977/78 formula).}}$
- C. Full-time equivalent faculty (FTEF) attributed to each of the respective departments over the two semesters of the previous academic year, employed for each department as a ratio of total FTEF.*

Rationale - Recognizes the pressures on Library book collections resulting from the numbers of faculty associated with the various programs.

- Data FTEF as assigned by the Office of Institutional Research (e.g., Fall, 1976 and Spring, 1977 for the 1977/78 formula).
- D. Book cost/availability--number of new books published weighted (multiplied by) the average unit cost--in each of the disciplines corresponding to departments, employed for each department as a ratio of total cost/availability.*

Rationale - Attempts to ensure proportional or relative participation, by prices and number of available titles, in the corpus of new titles available.

Data - Titles available and average unit prices as assigned, on request, by Blackwell North America, Inc., largest jobber for academic books.

* The ratios obtained in B, C, and D are summed for each department in turn becoming a composite ratio for each department. The composite ratio is then applied to the corpus of monies remaining after the ratio representing factor A has been applied against available monies.

Finally, the monies available to the respective departments consist of the base amount (the application of the ratio representing factor A) together with the application of the composite ratio representing factors B, C, and D (see attachment).

RE: Comparisons of Suspended and Proposed Formulas for distributing Book Monies

The following points highlight the differences between the suspended formula for distributing book monies and the proposed formula as developed by the University Library Committee:

1) The proposed formula awards credit to graduate programs at a rate of 0.4 percent for masters and 0.8 for doctoral (1.2 percent if a program awards both degrees).

Under the suspended formula student credit hours were weighted for graduate level programs.

- 2) The proposed formula uses only unweighted student credit hours.
- 3) By the suspended formula, continuing serials obligations were considered in allocating monies to departments.

Under the proposed formula, periodicals are not a factor in determining allocations.

4) By the suspended formula, the availability of books (in terms of titles published per discipline) was factored twice (with and without cost).

Under the proposed plan, only the availability of books times the average cost is considered.
