MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE MEETING

April 30, 1981

A motion was made to approve the minutes of the meeting on April 2, 1981. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried.

The Chair announced that Mr. Ring will call to order the first meeting of the ad hoc committee to examine the implications of the Institutional Goals Inventory in comparison with the Ten-Year Plan.

5.

Mr. Wermers presented the tentative list of Candidates for Degrees in May, 1981, and moved that the list be approved for recommendation to the State Board of Higher Education for the awarding of the degrees indicated, upon satisfactory completion of the work of the present semester. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. (See attachment #1.)

6.

Carla Hess presented the Committee on Committee's ballot for election to Senate committees. It was mentioned that Jackie McElroy, currently serving on the Faculty Research Committee, and David Payne, currently serving on the ROTC Committee, would be on leave during the 1981-82 academic year. There being no objection, it was decided that the nominee for the Faculty Research Committee who receives the third highest number of votes would serve in place of Ms. McElroy and the nominee for the ROTC Committee who receives the second highest number of votes would replace David Payne on that committee. The Chair called for nominations from the floor. The following were nominated to serve on the Faculty Research Committee: Brian Paulson, Henry Stinnet, Richard Crawford, and Fred Schneider. The Senate proceeded to vote. (The results of the election are indicated on attachment #2 and will be published in the University Newsletter.) Mr. Markovich commended the Committee on Committees for a job well done.

7.

Thomas Robinson, Chairman of the Fringe Benefits Committee, presented the report of that committee. Mr. Tomasek moved acceptance of the report. Mr. Hampsten seconded the motion which was voted upon and carried. (See attachment #3.)

8.

Mohan Wali, Chairman of the Honorary Degrees Committee, presented the report of that committee. A motion was made to accept the report. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. (See attachment #4.)

9.

Alice Clark presented the attached University budget figures for 1981-82. (See attachment #5.) Discussion followed. Mr. Bolonchuk moved that the Senate formally thank Alice Clark for bringing this report to them. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried.

Alice Clark reported that the FAR form has been revised but must be brought to the Senate, in the fall, for approval. Therefore, the same FAR form will used this fall since the Senate will not meet in time for approval and distribution of the revised form. It is planned that the revised form will be used for the second semester, 1981–82.

11.

John Whitcomb, Chairman of the Academic Policy Committee, presented the following recommendation:

That there be established a "Course Visitor" Program which would work as follows:

The "Course Visitor's" Program would allow any adult who is not currently enrolled in a credit course at UND to become a "Course Visitor" in classes offered through the Evening Classes Office. A "Course Visitor" would have the privilege of attending those undergraduate courses approved by the instructors simply by securing a "Course Visitor's" Permit from the Evening Classes Office for a fee of \$10.00 per course. The "Course Visitor" would not go through the registration process, would not have to complete an application form and would not have to do homework assignments or take examinations. No grades would be given to "Course Visitors" and no permanent records would be kept of their attendance. At the discretion of the instructor, "Course Visitors" would be allowed to participate to the degree they wish. Enrollment would be dependent upon permission of the instructor and availability of space. Participation in this program would be limited to two semesters.

Robert Boyd moved approval of the recommendation. The motion was seconded and discussion followed. Mr. Omdahl moved to amend the motion by deleting the word, adult, and inserting the word, person. The motion to amend was seconded, voted upon and carried. The original motion, as amended, was voted upon and carried.

12.

Mr. Wermers moved the recommendation from the Academic Policy Committee that the time for adding a full-term course be changed from seven to ten class days. The motion was seconded and discussion followed. The motion was voted upon and carried.

13.

Mr. Schubert moved the recommendation from the Administrative Procedures Committee that the final decision in determining if a student shall be allowed

to drop a course(s) after the last day to drop a course and add a course after the last day to add, shall be a decision of the college in which the student is enrolled. The University Administrative Procedures Committee will serve as the committee to hear all appeals regarding late drops and adds from students and faculty. This policy is to become effective with the beginning of the fall semester of the 1981-82 academic year. The motion was seconded and discussion followed. Mr. Dobesh moved to rerefer this item to the Academic Policy Committee for a report. The motion to refer was seconded and discussion followed. The motion was voted upon and carried.

14.

Mr. Bryan requested that Scot Stradley, Chairman of the Student Policy Committee, present the proposed revision of the <u>Code of Student Life</u>. There being no objection, Mr. Stradley presented attachment #6. Mr. Bryan moved adoption of the revision. Ms. Wilborn seconded the motion and discussion followed.

Mr. Simmons moved that the revision be referred back to the Student Policy Committee so that a compromise between that committee and Student Senate can be achieved. The motion to refer was seconded, voted upon and defeated.

Mr. Kasdan moved to amend the motion by striking, 1-2B.2. Review and recommend constitutional revisions of the Student Senate and its committees. The motion to amend was seconded and discussion followed. The motion to amend was voted upon and carried.

Mr. Simmons moved to amend by striking, 1-2B.4. The motion to amend was seconded, voted upon and defeated.

Mr. Kasdan moved to amend the motion by changing 1-7E., in the second sentence, the word fifth back to tenth. The motion was seconded and discussion followed. The motion to amend was voted upon and carried. The following editorial change was also made to the second sentence: to add the word, such, at the beginning of the sentence.

The original motion, as amended twice, was voted upon and carried.

15.

Mr. Tomasek moved to adjourn. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried. The meeting adjourned at 5:38 p.m.



RE: 1981 Report

Milton Winger is secretary and other elected members are Richard Kauffman, Robert Kemper, Michael Polovitz, and Marie Zimmerman. Fred MacGregor, Personnel director, meets with the committee as an ex-officio member. The committee met seven times, beginning in August, and will probably have one more meeting this spring.

As you all know, state supported fringe benefits was not an area of big success for state employees during the 1981 legislative session. About this same time last year it appeared we might get at least one of three benefits: dental insurance, disability insurance, or additional employer contribution to retirement. Unfortunately, the final budget for the 1981-83 biennium contained none of these benefits. On the positive side, however, the state continues to pay the Blue Cross and Blue Shield premium. The present rate for the paid-in-full family plan is about \$1050 per year, and it will probably increase about 20% in July.

We are pleased to report inauguration of two new benefits sponsored by UND during the 1980-81 school year. We feel the \$5000 of basic life insurance paid by the University, with the options to purchase supplemental and dependent life insurance, makes a good addition to our existing fringe benefits. 2392 employees are covered by the basic \$5000 plan, 456 elected \$10,000 additional coverage, 1034 elected \$20,000 additional coverage, and 852 elected the dependent coverage. A total of 226 persons went through the I HELP screening tests during the three-day period January 20-22. We hope something like this can continue on an annual basis. Nancy Furstenberg and a number of medical students helped make I HELP possible.

A series of five pre-retirement seminars, under the direction of Fred MacGregor and Tom Robinson, was held during 1980-81. In addition to our own personnel, invitations to attend were extended to members of the Grand Forks and East Grand Forks public school systems, and faculty at Mayville State College.

Updating of the fringe benefits and retirement benefits brochures will take place before August. Much of that work will be done by the Personnel Office. Close cooperation between Fred MacGregor and this committee has greatly facilitated the work on fringe benefits.

The Committee met once this academic year to consider one nomination for an honorary degree. The recommendation of the Committee was presented to the University Senate on April 2, 1981. The Senate approved the committee recommendation.

1981 - 82 BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS

The following 1981-82 budget recommendations are based on 1981 10% catchup plus biennial expectations of 9% / 8% and the receipt of 11.5 New positions each year of the biennium.

- In keeping with VPAA and Presidential commitments and the University-wide goal of increasing faculty salaries, the 10.0% and the 9.0% was given across the board on all base BUDGETS.
- 2. In keeping with the ten-year plan and a University-wide concern about graduate education, the GTA stipend base was increased to \$4,500 with the VPAA making up the \$15,474 difference.
- 3. The Summer School base was increased by 10.0% and 9.0% in keeping with the University priority to raise faculty salaries.
- 4. Chair stipends were increased by 10.0% and 9.0% in keeping with the VPAA and Presidential priority and the Coroc Report.



RE: Request Revision of Code of Student Life, Sections 1-2, 1-3, & 1-7

Student Policy Committee has approved the following proposed revision of the <u>Code</u> of Student Life and requests approval from University Senate.

- 1-2 Jurisdiction of Student Policy Committee
- A. Student Policy Committee (SPC) as a standing advisory committee of the University Senate has review and recommending responsibility for the out of classroom life of students. As such, it has general responsibility for all student organizations. This includes official recognition as a UND student organization. Student Governmental bodies do not fall within the definition of a student organization. The committee has ten members: five students appointed by Student Senate for one year renewable terms, four five faculty appointed by University Senate for three year terms, and-the-Vice-President-for-Student-Affairs. The Vice President for Student Affairs serves as an advisor without vote.
- B. Responsibilities of the committee include: 1---Review-and-recommend-action-regarding-constitutions-of-student-organizations.

2---Review-policies-and-regulations-concerning-the-student's-life-outside-the elassroom;

3---The-Student-Policy-Committee-may-also-recommend-policy-changes-and-recommend implementation-of-existing-policies-to-Student-and-University-Senates-and-the Office-of-Student-Affairs-

- 1. Formulate policy for official recognition of UND student organizations and review, approve, and revoke constitutions of student organizations.
- 2. Review and recommend constitutional revisions of the Student Senate and its Committees.
- 3. Make recommendations on matters pertaining to student life, out of classroom activities, and student welfare brought to the Committee by members of the University community.
- 4. Make recommendations pertaining to general student welfare to other university committees and administrative entities.

NOTE: crossed out sections are to be deleted; underlined sections added.

- 5. Investigate policies and regulations that affect general student welfare.
- 6. Initiate and encourage action and changes which would benefit students.
- 7. Serve as an appellate body for hearing disputes within and between recognized student organizations with authority to lessen but not increase sanctions imposed or recommended by other bodies.
- 1-3 Applying for Recognition as a Student Organization
- A. (as is)
- B. (as is)
- C. When a group is ready to apply officially to SPC for recognition it must submit four twelve copies of its constitution to the secretary of the Committee in the Vice President for Student Affairs Office. The Committee will meet with the group and review its constitution. If the constitution is approved the group is an officially recognized UND student organization.
- 1-7 Conduct Review
- A. A conduct review of any organization may be initiated by the Student-Pelicy Committee Dean of Students Office at the request of any recognized campus organization, staff, faculty, or student. Prior-to-disciplinary-action-or-sanction-by SPC-the-following-procedures-must-be-followed:
- 1 --- Specific-charges-must-be-made;
- 2---Accused-organizations-must-be-notified-of-charges;
- 3---Accused-organizations-must-have-the-option-of-a-hearing-with-SPC-

Prior to disciplinary action or sanction, the Dean of Students Office shall investigate the alleged violation. After completing a preliminary investigation, the Dean may:

- 1. Find no basis for the complaint and dismiss the allegation as unfounded; or
- 2. Summon the officers of the organization for a conference and then either dismiss the allegation; or
- 3. Proceed administratively by assessing the penalty appropriate to the charges, informing the officers of the organization of such action in writing and of the appeals procedure; or
- 4. Prepare a complaint based on the allegation and refer the case to the Student Policy Committee.
- B. Student-Policy-Committee The Dean of Students Office has the following disciplinary sanctions for dealing with groups that have been found in violation of University policies.
- 1 -- Restrictions-on-programs-or-activities;
- 2---Designation-of-an-alternative-category-of-recognition
- 3 --- Probation-with-a-directive-for-action;
- 4---Removal-of-recognition-and-privileges-associated-therewith-
- 1. Written Reprimand--written reprimand refers to official censure of a student organization's conduct for violation of a regulation of the campus community and/or procedures of order, respect for property and consideration for others. A written reprimand involves a status of warning for a designated period of time.

- 2. Warning Probation--warning probation indicates that further violations of regulations by a student organization will result in more severe disciplinary action. Warning Probation shall be imposed for a period of not more than one year. The student organization shall be removed automatically from warming probation when the imposed period expires.
- 3. Conduct Probation--conduct probation indicates further violations may result in removal of recognition and privileges associated therewith. Conduct probation may not be imposed for more than one calendar year.
- 4. Suspension-suspension is a temporary withdrawal of recognition. Notification of the suspension will include conditions of the suspension and terms for re-recognition. Suspension would normally be for at least the remainder of a semester in which the penalty is imposed.
- 5. Indefinite Suspension--indefinite suspension is a withdrawal of recognition with no definite time limit and which carries conditions which must be met before the student organization may be reinstated. Reinstatement after an indefinite suspension involves the following procedure:
 - a. The organization applies to the Dean of Students for reinstatement.
 - b. The Dean investigates.
 - c. The Dean may then either grant the reinstatement, consult with SPC about the matter, or deny the application. A denial may be appealed by the student organization to SPC.
- C. SPC or the Dean as part of the disciplinary process may impose specific conditions and/or require the student organization to make restitution for damage to or misappropriation of property. Reimbursement may take the form of appropriate service to repair or otherwise compensate for damages.
- D. (as is, the "old" 1-7-C)
- E. The actions of the Student-Pelicy-Committee Dean of Students Office may be appealed to Student Policy Committee and then to the University Senate Executive Committee. Appeals to each body shall be made in writing on or before the tenth fifth class day after the decision of the Student-Pelicy-Committee appellate body. The notice shall contain the organization's name, date of the decision or action if any, and the name of the organization's representative if any. All parties involved shall receive notification of the appeal and subsequent actions.
- F. A student organization whose recognition has been eancelled-by-SPE suspended by Dean of Students Office or by SPC may not apply for re-registration within the six months following date of cancellation unless otherwise specified by SPC.
