Leteck April 18th, 1918. Mr. Kersey E. Gowin. Minot. N. Pak. Dear Zersey: I am in receipt of your favor of April 16thand am glad to know that things are coming along fast. I am leaving for Pargo tonight and would suggest that if you want to get in touch with me for the next day or two that you address me in care of the Gardner Hotel and elso address me at Bismarck as I might get back sonner than I expect. If you think I should be up there I will come any time you say. There is no way in which I can get Judge Coffe to come through. When I was State's Attorney of Morton County I tried it and he will not give us the names. If you think I should be up there at the time the arrests take place, drop me a line and tell me when to come. We surely went to make a good thorough job of it.
