Sioux Top Midwest Ice Loop

Perched atop the standings in the Midwest Hockey League, University of North Dakota's Sioux skaters are still carrying their unbeaten season record, now standing at 12 games.

The latest Sioux victories were two overtime triumphs at Houghton, Mich., over stubborn Michigan Tech. The games, won by scores of 5-4 and 6-5, saw the Sioux the hardest pressed they have been this season but they showed even more determination and will to win than in their previous close ones.

Squad Undermanned

Coach Cliff Purpur had to do some shifting of material, with a regular wing ill and several others injured and forced to miss all or part of the Michigan Tech frays. They were the first road games of the season for the Sioux.

Semester exams will occupy the squad until the end of the month, when they resume

league activities in a twogames series at Minnesota. This is expected to be the hardest series to date and several hundred fans from here are taking a special train to Minneapolis for the games, January 30-31.

Face Gophers Here

The following week, the Gophers play twice here, February 6-7, in one of the features of the annual Blue Key Winter Carnival.

North Dakota's 12 points which top the Midwest loop were gained in victories over Michigan State, Michigan Tech and Denver. Still on the schedule, in addition to the Minnesota games, are two each with Michigan, at Ann Arbor, and two with Colorado College, in the Winter Sports building.

Louis Bogan's basketball

squad appears to have righted itself after a bad start and the Sioux are holding down third place in the North Central conference with a 3-3 record,

The outlook was gloomy when the Sioux left for their third road trip, which listed games at South Dakota State and at Augustana. But they battled to an overtime 76-72 win over the Jackrabbits and the next night outlasted Augustana, 75-67, to bounce back into the conference race.

A non-loop victory followed, over Tennessee A. and I., and that was the first victory of the season for the Sioux on their home court. The score was 68-61 and the defeat was only the second in 13 games for the Southerners, 1952 national Negro Champions.

Geology Building Needed

The need for a new geology building on the campus is stressed in an editorial in the current issue of the Williston Basin Oil Review.

Pointing out that the geology enrollment at the University has doubled in the past two years, the monthly publication declares "it is the obligation of the state of North Dakota to see that our University students have the opportunity to obtain the technical training necesary to enter this growing and increasingly important industry in North Dakota."

At present, 220 students are enrolled in geology at UND with 78 either majoring or having expressed a desire to major in geology.

Growth Cited

"Twelve years ago there were only 50 in this department and during the war years the enrollment shrank even farther," the editorial continues.

"The current boom in geology enrollment is a direct result of the intensive search for oil in the Williston basin.

"The present 'geology building' on the campus is a temporary wood structure which was secured from the Sioux Falls Air Base in 1948, Equip-
