Dear Mr. Langer:

I am again asked to forward a number of documents concerning Dr. Martin Sandberger, condemned to execution at Nurnberg. These testimonies were meant for the Supreme Court. For obvious reasons they were not sent there, but rather to the District Court of Columbia.

German radio has brought the information that a special commission has been appointed to investigate certain cases at Landsberg and elsewhere, and that in the meantime the executions are deferred. It was also stated that you, Mr. Langer, will serve on said committee.

The relatives of the condemned Dr. Martin Sandberger request me to ask you whether you, when over there in Germany, would be willing to receive for an interview Attorney K. O. Mintzel in Nurnberg, who is Sandberger's lawyer. I should be pleased to have your office inform me as to whether you could possibly grant the people involved this favor.
