8. The committee moved to allow approval of all constitutions that do not have a letter of affiliation. However, the Student Activities Office must receive the letter by the end of three regular term school months from the date the original constitution was approved. If the organizations do not follow this compliance, their constitutions will be revoked at the end of the three month period. Regular term school months do not include the summer vacation.

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY COMMITTEE
ANNUAL REPORT TO THE UNIVERSITY SENATE
for
1985/1986

Members of the 1985/86 Committee were Michael Anderegg (English), Richard Beringer (History), Donald Bostrom (Accounting), William Dando (Geography), Patricia Fry (Law), William Gard (History), F.D. Holland, Jr. (Geology), Virginia Norman (Nursing), Cara Samek (Student representative), Rosine Tenenbaum (Languages), and Rocky Wells (Student representative). F.D. Holland, Jr. served the Committee as Chairperson.

The Committee met five times during the year, centering most of its attention on the uses for income earned on the Chester Fritz bequest to the Library and other funding issues as well as the prospect of automating library services and operations. Pervading all discussions was general agreement that a larger share of University appropriated funds would better contribute to the maintenance of a quality Library.

In that earnings from the Chester Fritz bequest to the Library began to materialize, the Committee determined, with the Director, that a \$45,000 augmentation to appropriated book monies be made available through the Book Monies Allocation Formula and that additional periodicals titles be purchased at about the \$10,000 level. Some policy guidelines for the purchase of the additional periodical titles were developed and a systematic scheme, commencing with a "call" for suggested titles in December, was initiated. After substantial effort on the parts of faculty and Library staff, 160 additional titles were ordered at a final cost of just under \$11,000. It should be pointed out that with considerable effort on the parts of faculty and Library staff the periodicals collection was evaluated during the prior year, that effort resulting in the cancellation of 33 gift and 71 paid titles (as reported last year).

In August, the Director received from Rita Reusch, Director of the Law Library, a well-documented request for financial assistance from Chester Fritz Library funds. Following extended discussion, the Committee found no resolution to and took no action on the request.

The Committee urged that the Director enter into detailed planning discussions with various University officials on the matter of automating library services and operations on an integrated campus-wide basis. It is the understanding of the Committee that only the earnings on

amounts received from the Fritz bequest in excess of one million dollars will be used for automation, and that it is hoped that appropriated and foundation funds will contribute to the system's support. This matter was presented to the Senate in greater detail as an Interim Report dated April 15, 1986 and received by the Senate on May 1, 1986.

Admission to the
Center for Teaching and Learning

Regardless of the college in which their degree is being earned, students intending to complete a teacher education program must apply to the Center for Teaching and Learning. Admission is required for enrollment in the core course of each program for students entering the junior year in fall, 1987.

Students normally apply for admission while enrolled in the entry level course of each program. Core and entry level courses for the Center's programs are:

Students transferring an entry level course from another institution may apply at the time of admission to the university. Admission materials may be secured in the Office of the Dean, Center for Teaching and Learning

Admission to the Center requires evidence of commitment, experience, and interests appropriate to becoming a teacher, ability to express oneself clearly and effectively, and a 2.5 GPA. A personal interview may be part of the application process. Applicants will be notified of their status within fifteen school days of receipt of completed application materials.

Student progress in the Center is closely monitored and formally reviewed before admission to student teaching.

Admission to Student Teaching
(Elementary)

Entry into elementary student teaching requires satisfactory completion of each course in junior TEAM with a minimum grade of C, satisfactory completion of a field experience, an overall GPA of 2.5 based on at least 76 hours of work, and the recommendation of the elementary education faculty for all students admitted to the Center for Teaching and Learning during or after fall, 1987.

Admission to Student Teaching
(Secondary)

Application for student teaching for spring semester must be submitted by the preceding October 1 and for fall semester by the preceding February 15. To be admitted to student teaching, the student will have completed or be enrolled in the courses of the major and
