At Least 5 Congressmen Will Attend Hearing

At least five members of the U. S. House subcommittee on irrigation and reclamation are expected at Devils Lake Oct. 30 for a hearing on the proposed Missouri Diversion plan.

Reps. Lee Metcalf (D-Mont.) and J. Edgar Chenowith (R-Colo.) are expected in addition to three previously announced. They are Reps. Wayne Aspinall (R-Idaho), E. Y. Berry (R-SD) and A. L. Miller (R-Neb.).

Fred J. Fredrickson, who is project coordinator for the state water commission at Washington, D. C., and other members of a planning committee met at Bismarck to complete plans for the Devils Lake hearing. So far 47 witnesses have indicated they will appear before the Congressional Subcommittee.
