Dear Mr. Langer:

From all the correspondance that has transpired between the Sandbergers and me, I have learned to know them as as a people of high standard, thoroughly honorable, with a deep Christian spirit.

In his letter accompanying these "Quotations of Comparable Judgments" the father, Karl V. Sandberger, writes he heard on the morning of Jan. 28 over radio that the authorities appointed to re-examine the verdicts have again decided the Nuernberger procedures to be above criticism. Hence, the execution of the 16 condemned might be carried out.

McCarthy still hopes the Inspector Genral's office may be inclined to review cases individually, which I doubt.

If the inclosed papers can bear any weight, you will know how and where.
