Mr. Selbyg announced that the Senate Executive Committee, in accordance with the Senate decision of March 5, 1987, has established an ad hoc committee to study the possibility of adding academic advisement to the criteria for promotion in rank. This ad hoc committee was requested to report back to

the Senate Executive Committee this spring.

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Mr. Selbyg also announced that the Senate Executive Committee selected the faculty participants for the Conflict Resolution Workshop to be held in May. The Senate Executive Committee also approved cancelling the January Senate Meeting.

There being no objection, the minutes of the October 1, 1987, meeting were declared approved as written and distributed.

5

Mr. Kolstoe, Chair of the General Education Requirements Committee, presented that committee's annual report. Mr. Dando moved to file the report. The motion was seconded and approved by a unanimous voice vote. (See attachment #1.)

6.

Bern Zachmann, Chair of the Student Policy Committee, presented the annual report of the committee. Mr. Warner moved to file the report. The motion was seconded and approved by a unanimous voice vote. (See attachment #2.)

7.

F.D. Holland, Jr., Chair of the Library Committee, presented the annual report of the committee. Mr. Warner moved to file the report. Ms. Helgeson seconded the motion which was approved by a unanimous voice vote. (See attachment #3.)

8.

Mr. Nielsen presented the tentative list of Candidates for Degrees in December, 1987, and moved that the list be approved for recommendation to the State Board of Higher Education for the awarding of the degrees indicated, upon satisfactory completion of the work of the present semester.

The motion was seconded and approved by a unanimous voice vote. (See attachment #4.)

9.

Mr. Schwartz moved a recommendation from the Senate Executive Committee that the Curriculum Committee be temporarily charged with the undergraduate program evaluations until the second cycle is completed and that no later than April, the Senate Executive Committee will review the procedures and responsibilities of the Curriculum Committee. Ms. Clark seconded the motion. Discussion followed. A roll call vote was taken and the motion was approved. (See attachment #5 for roll call vote.)

10.

Mr. Norman moved a recommendation from the Academic Policy Committee that

the University grant full-time student status to students enrolled in Cooperative Education 337, irrespective of the number of actual credit hours in which the student is enrolled. Mr. Naismith seconded the motion. Discussion followed. Mr. Kolstoe moved the previous question. Ms. Helgeson seconded the motion. The motion to vote immediately was unanimously approved by voice vote. The Chair stated that there being no objection, the vote on the main motion would be recorded as a unanimous roll call vote.

11.

Mr. Norman moved a recommendation from the Academic Policy Committee that in order for students to receive Senior Honors in the Senior Honors System, they must meet all existing requirements and receive a grade no lower than a "B" on the Senior Thesis. This requirement could be inserted into page 49 of the Undergraduate Bulletin with the addition as underlined:

"This study, whatever its nature may be, will appear on the student's record with the number 499 and the title "Senior Honors." The study may be departmental or interdepartmental. To qualify for Senior Honors, the student must receive a grade no lower than a "B" for this work. Theses will be bound and deposited in the University library."

The motion was seconded. A vote was taken and the Chair stated that there being no objection, the vote would be recorded as a unanimous roll call vote.

12.

Mr. Norman moved approval of the recommendation from the Academic Policy Committee to change the policy listed on page 10 of the 1986 - 88 Undergraduate Bulletin, under the heading, "Admission of New Freshmen," to read:

"Students who are currently attending high school may be allowed to enroll in courses at the University of North Dakota with the special permission from the Director of Admission, the Dean of the University College, and the student's high school principal and counselor. Students may receive credit for courses taken at an accredited University/College while in high school if those courses are acceptable for credit at the University of North Dakota. Courses which would apply toward College requirements must be approved by the Dean of the College. Courses to be applied to meet major requirements must be approved by the Departmental Chair.

Mr. Warner seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the Chair stated that there being no objection, the vote would be recorded as a unanimous roll call vote.

13.

Mr. Norman moved approval of the recommendation from the Academic Policy Committee to revise the final examination policy to read:

An examination is held at the end of most courses according to the

published examination schedule. Alternate evaluation methods and schedules may be used when recommended by the departmental faculty and approved by the dean of the college. Any change in time from the published schedule requires the recommendation of the chairperson of the department and approval of the dean of the college. Any student who would be disadvantaged by such a change should report this in advance to his or her academic dean, who will ensure that satisfactory arrangements will be made by the instructor.

Any student who is absent from a regularly scheduled examination without an excuse considered valid by the instructor is normally given an F for the course. If the excuse is valid, the policy on incompletes will apply.

However, no undergraduate student should be obliged to write three or more finals on the same day. If the student has three or more finals scheduled the same day, the student wishing an accommodation regarding final exams should contact her or his instructors to establish a mutually acceptable time to reschedule one or more of the exams. Any student request for the rescheduled final exam must be presented to the instructor before the end of the tenth week of the semester; otherwise, the student's rescheduling right is forfeited. If an accommodation cannot be reached, he or she should contact the department chair(s) to find a mutually agreeable time. If no agreement is reached, the appropriate dean(s) should be contacted. The final appeal, if no mutually convenient time has been found, will be to the Vice-President of Academic Affairs.

Mr. Rhodes seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the Chair stated that there being no objection, the vote would be recorded as a unanimous roll call vote.

1986-1987 Academic Year

During the 1986-87 Academic year, the Committee met 15 times. The Committee also met four times in September 1987 to complete carry-over topics from the spring. The principle concerns of the Committee centered around the published statements which appear in the time tables and in the undergraduate catalog. Activities for the year included:

- a. Student Petitions
 Students submitted a total of 58 petitions concerning general education credits in their programs of study. The Committee
 - education credits in their programs of study. The Committee approved 42 and disapproved 12 petitions. Four petitions were returned to the students or tabled.
- b. GER credits for courses

Three courses were approved for GER credit. Two courses were removed from the approved group (at the request of the department involved) and one section from Arts and Science 250 (used for integrated studies) was granted GER science, math and technology credits for the fall term 1987 only.

- c. Published statements concerning GER Most of the meetings during the year centered on the philosophy of general education and the statements that appear in the time tables and in the undergraduate catalog. A new statement was prepared and appeared in the time tables for Fall semester 1987. A new statement was also prepared and approved to appear in the new undergraduate catalog to be published for the 1988-90 academic years.
- d. Discussions were held concerning the problems of transfer credits plans for transfer credits.
 - 1. The Department of English reported to the Committee on their plans for transfer credits. The GER Committee instructed the registrar's office to accept any credits granted by the Committee in English, but the GER Committee would continue to act as an appeals committee for petitions denied by the Department of English.
 - 2. Discussion continues on transfer credits for General Education credits.

Chair for the first semester was Bethany Lawton. Bern Zachmann was Vice-Chair. Upon Bethany's resignation, Bern Zachmann assumed responsiblity of Chair. The Vice Chair position remained open.

One of the functions of SPC is recognizing student organizations by approving their constitutions and constitutional modifications. SPC approved the following 26 constitutions in 1986-87.

Changes in the Code of Student Life:

Section 1-4, F:

To establish membership, policies, and actions of the organization (in accordance with the Code of Student Life and UND policies) by a vote of only those currently registered UND students.

Section 1-4, G:

...At the same time, it should be made clear to the academic and larger community that students or student organizations speak only for themselves in their public expressions or demonstrations.

Section 2-3, B:

Individuals, groups, and organizations associated for religious purposes may co-sponsor religious activities on university property only with a recognized student organization or faculty organization, or with an academic or administrative division of the University.

Section 2-3, C:

Departments may develop internal policies and procedures to define specific applications of Section 2-3 subject to appropriate approval. Further information can be obtained from the Central Scheduling Office.

In addition, the committee approved a "Summary of Policies and Programming with Alcohol for UND Student Organizations" to become Appendix VII of the Code of Student Life. (See attached.)

Change in SPC's Model Constitution:

The committee approved the following addition in their model constitution:

Article VIII, D: The financial records and ledger must be submitted for an annual audit to the coordinator of the Student Organizations office at the end of each spring semester.

Actions Taken:

- 1. The Student Policy Committee will not approve any constitution that is not received by the individual members of 12:00 (noon) on the Monday before the meeting. (11-6-86)
- 2. Student Policy Committee will only deal with constitutions twice a month unless necessity dictates otherwise. (11-6-86)
- 3. The committee will not consider any constitution received after Monday noon of the week which they are to be reviewed. (11-6-36)

- 4. Beginning with spring semester, Student Policy Committee will only deal with constitutions on the first and second meetings of the month. (11-6-86)
- 5. A motion was made to establish two subcommittees consisting of three members to review constitutions each committee responsible for one of the two constitutional meetings per month.

Unfinished Business or Business in Progress:

- 1. Ongoing systematic review of policies that affect students (contained in the Code of Student Life.)
- 2. Continuation of the reviewal of deficient or new constitutions.

IV. Preventive Medical Protocol

1. The University shall adopt standard medical preventive protocol procedures to protect specific employee groups or students who may have potential exposure to such significant infectious diseases either in the workplace or in an educational setting.

V. Confidentiality

1. Information regarding any person affected by infectious

disease as defined within this policy shall be treated with the same confidentiality as provided for all medical records under University policy.

2. Any request for information regarding persons affected by infectious disease, whether from within or outside the institution, is to be directed to the Director of Student Health Services, who will act as spokesperson for the institution.

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APPENDIX VII, SUMMARY OF POLICIES ON PROGRAMMING WITH ALCOHOL FOR UND STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

The following policies apply to all recognized student organizations at the University of North Dakota:

- 1. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited on *any* UND property, including UND vehicles.
- 2. Serving, selling, or providing alcoholic beverages to persons who are not of legal age is prohibited by law and by University policy.
- 3. Student organizations may not participate in any promotion or special activity with a liquor license holder in any situation where the organization enters into a "quasi-partnership" arrangement with the liquor license holder. This shall include (but is not limited to) any of the following arrangements:
- a. The student organization sells or otherwise shares in the profit from sales of alcohol or serves as a co-sponsor of an event with a liquor license holder for an event involving alcohol.
- b. The student organization collects a cover charge "at the door" or as an admission fee which entitles the guest to one or more free drinks or discounted drinks.
- c. The student organization is responsible for verification of the age of guests or for dispensing alcoholic beverages.
- d. The student organization advertises or distributes advertising for special programs or activities sponsored by the liquor license holder.
- e. The cost of alcoholic beverages is included in a banquet, meal, or entertainment charge.
- f. The availability of alcoholic beverages is advertised, mentioned, or referred to in any promotion.
- g. The student organization receives free room rental in exchange for holding an event with alcohol or for meeting a bar minimum.
- 4. The student organization may not utilize free drinks or alcoholic beverages as contest prizes.

- 5. No University funds (including those raised by the organization) may be used either directly or indirectly for the purchase of alcoholic beverages.
- 6. In programs or activities that involve alcohol, the student organization is expected to demonstrate responsible use of alcohol. The following recommendations are made:
- a. Whenever possible, the bar should be in a separate room from the event.
- b. Alternative or non-alcoholic beverages should be provided in sufficient quantity and in the same manner as alcoholic beverages.
- c. Food or unsalted snacks should be provided in sufficient quantity.
- d. Designated driver and key check-in programs should be available at no charge to guests. Intoxicated members and guests should not be allowed to drive.
- e. Direct access to alcoholic beverages should be limited to persons who are designated as servers, who are non-drinkers for the event. There should be no open access to alcoholic beverages. Alcoholic beverages should not be served to someone who is intoxicated.
- f. The event should have a designated beginning and ending time, with no drinks being served later than four hours after the beginning time of the event. Access to alcoholic beverages should be unavailable at least one-half hour prior to the end of the event.
- g. No social event should include any form of "drinking contest" in which the consumption of alcoholic beverages is encouraged in the activity.
- h. If injury should occur at an event, first aid should be provided only by professional, trained ambulance crews except where life threatening conditions exist (high blood loss, no breathing, etc.).

Members of the 1986/87 Committee were Michael Anderegg (English), Donald Bostrom (Accounting), Raymond Fischer (Speech), Patricia Fry (Law), William Gard (History), Janice Goodwin (Home Economics & Nutrition), F.D. Holland, Jr. (Geology), Virginia Norman (Nursing), and Lonny Winrich (Center for Aerospace Studies). Student representatives were David Glessner and Eric Graney. F.D. Holland, Jr., served the Committee as Chairperson.

The Committee met three times during the year, giving most of its attention to the continuing matter of funding which is inadequate to maintain--let alone enhance--the Library's collections. Discussions centered on strategies for dealing with anticipated cutbacks in book purchases and periodicals subscriptions.

The Committee rejected the notion of supporting the College of Nursing through the "Book Monies Allocation Formula," in that funding via the Medical Library and occasional support via Chester Fritz Library general funds appeared adequate relative to the support given other programs.

The Committee voted unanimously to support a \$10 non-waivable administrative fee to be levied against delinquent borrowers, following an initial courtesy notice seeking the return of materials, at such time that it can be implemented.

Possibilities for automation were discussed; and, Library staff continued to explore options by way of vendor demonstrations as well as available literature.
