X-War Crimes Trials

Dear Reverend Strieter:

With further reference to previous correspondence concerning the case of Dr. Martin Sandberger, I have been informed by Senator Joseph McCarthy that the Expenditures Committee decided several weeks ago that it would make no investigation of the Nuremberg cases. The Committee felt it would have no jurisdiction because of the Four-Power nature of the trials.

I am glad I was able to obtain the information for you, but I regret that my report to you isn't more favorable.
