The December meeting of the University Senate was held at 4:10 p.m. on Thursday, December 1, 1988, in room 7, Gamble Hall. Elizabeth Hampsten presided.

The Chair called upon Richard Hill to report on the meeting of representatives from UND with people in the Bismarck-Mandan area regarding the "Crisis in Higher Education" in North Dakota. Mr. Hill reported that UND faculty made presentations and that a question and answer period followed.

4.

Judy DeMers moved a suspension of the Senate rules to add this item to the agenda: University Senate Resolution of Support for the UND Native American Expo (April 7-9, 1989). Mr. Ring seconded the motion. A vote was taken and there being no objection, the motion was approved and the vote recorded as a unanimous roll call vote. The Chair stated that this resolution would be added as the last item on the agenda.

5.

Mr. Stinnett moved approval of the minutes for the meeting of November 3, 1988. The motion was seconded and, there being no objection, the minutes were declared approved as distributed.

6.

Mr. Tomasek moved to receive the annual report of the Honorary Degrees Committee. Ms. DeMers seconded the motion. A vote was taken and there being no objection, the motion was approved and the vote recorded as a unanimous roll call vote.

7.

Mr. Warner moved to receive the annual report of the Library Committee. Mr. Oring seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the motion was approved with a dissenting vote from Mr. Ring.

8.

Ms. DeMers moved to receive the annual report of the Student Policy Committee. The motion was seconded. A vote was taken and there being no objection, the motion was approved and the vote recorded as a unanimous roll call vote.

9.

Mr. Kolstoe reported that the Senate Executive Committee reactivated the ad hoc committee to study admission requirements, and that the first meeting will be held during the week of December 5. He said that the State Board of Higher Education is also studying this topic. Ms. Clark reported that the first meeting of the group to develop the Board's proposed admission standards would be held on December 12. Mr. Ring moved that the University Senate go on record as urging the Board to require the ACT or SAT scores for admission to the University. Mr. Lewis seconded the motion. Discussion followed. A vote was taken and there being no objection, the motion was approved and the vote recorded as a unanimous roll call vote.

10.

Ms. Clark reported on Undergraduate Program Evaluation. Ms. Hampsten reported that a joint meeting of the Senate Executive Committee and the Curriculum Committee would be held in January before a recommendation regarding the role of the Curriculum Committee was brought to the February

Senate meeting. Ms. Clark stated that a public meeting for discussion regarding the document was held last April 26 and 27. The recommendations received were molded into the document and the revised form was sent to the Council of Deans, the Curriculum Committee and the Senate Executive Committee and will be going out to department chairs for implementation. She said that the role of the Curriculum Committee would not become paramount for approximately a year.

11.

Mr. Nielsen presented the tentative list of Candidates for Degrees in December, 1988, and moved that the list be approved for recommendation to the State Board of Higher Education for the awarding of the degrees indicated, upon satisfactory completion of the work of the present semester. The motion was seconded. A vote was taken and there being no objection, the motion was approved and the vote recorded as a unanimous roll call vote.

12.

Mr. Tomasek reported that an open town meeting was held last week to discuss "Publications as Criteria for Faculty Promotions". Approximately 30 people attended that discussion. Ms. Hampsten asked for discussion from the floor of the Senate. Discussion followed regarding the necessity of research and publication and the possibility of setting up different standards for those hired for specific duties.

13.

Mr. Tomasek presented the first reading of the proposed change in wording of the Senate Bylaws under the section, "Officers":

Present Wording

At the first meeting following the seating of the new members of the Senate, a Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be elected from the elected members. They shall serve terms of one year. Nominations shall be made from the floor.

Proposed Wording

At the first meeting following the seating of the new members of the Senate, a Chair and Vice-Chair shall be elected from the elected members. They shall serve terms of one year. Nominations shall be made by the Committee on Committees which must name at least two nominees for each position. The chair must always ask for nominations from the floor. Senate Governance Committee. H.T. Tomasek, Chair. (First Reading.)

Mr. Pynn moved adoption of the proposed wording. Mr. Oring seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the motion was approved on first reading.

14.

 ${\tt Ms.}$ DeMers presented a Resolution of Support for the UND Native American ${\tt Expo.}$ She moved to suspend the rules to allow three people to speak to the

Senate in regard to the resolution. The motion was seconded. There being no objection, Gerianne Davis, Earl Bullhead and Virgil Benoit spoke in favor of the resolution. Ms. DeMers moved approval of the following resolution:

UNIVERSITY SENATE RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR THE UND NATIVE AMERICAN EXPO (APRIL 7-9, 1989).

SUBMITTED BY: Judy L. DeMers, December 1, 1989.

WHEREAS: the University of North Dakota will host Native American Week as part of North Dakota's official Centennial celebration; and

WHEREAS: the University of North Dakota has scheduled the Native American Expo from noon Friday, April 7, to 6:00 p.m. Sunday, April 9, 1989, as part of Native American Week; and

WHEREAS: the Expo will be organized around the theme, "Experience the circle of many colors", words conveying the Native American philosophy of sharing, openness, and unity through education; and

WHEREAS: the circle of many colors further represents the races of humankind and the evolution towards increased recognition of their shared humanity; and

WHEREAS: more than 300 Native American students are enrolled in virtually all of UND's academic majors; and

WHEREAS: the Expo provides the opportunity for faculty, administrators, Native American students, and non-Native American students to work together during the upcoming semester to develop exhibits and displays; and

WHEREAS: working together on exhibits and displays for Expo will foster and enhance an interchange on the UND campus regarding Native American culture; and

WHEREAS: the Expo is viewed as a positive new beginning to bridging the gap between the Native American and non-Native cultures on the campus and within the State of North Dakota;

THEN THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY SENATE:

That the University Senate affirms the philosophy and goals of the Native American Expo and strongly supports its development and implementation;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:


That the members of the University Senate encourage the active participation of faculty, students, and administrators from their respective units across the University of North Dakota campus in the Native American Expo.

The committee followed the below listed University and Board of Higher Education criteria in its evaluation of nominated candidates to be presented to the Senate:

A. University

- Achievement of distinction in scholarship, or in professional or creative achievement.
- 2. Recognized and outstanding service to the nation, to the state, or to the University of North Dakota.
- 3. Attendance at or graduation from the University of North Dakota, except as the individual is outstanding with reference to criteria 1 and 2.
- 4. Non membership on the faculty of the University of North Dakota.
- 5. Scholarship specialization in an area in which the University normally grants an earned degree.

B. Board of Higher Education

- The candidate should have had association with the State of North Dakota. This association may be by virtue of birth, of residence, of education, of service to the state, the Board, or one of the institutions governed by the Board.
- The candidate must have achieved a level of distinction which would merit comparable recognition in his or her profession or area of excellence.
- 3. The renown of the candidate should reflect favorably on the Board, the institutions it governs, and the State of North Dakota.

During the 1987-88 academic year, the committee received one nomination. The College of Business and Public Administration nominated M. Merlin Dewing for an honorary degree. The committee recommended his nomination to and received approval from the University Senate. Mr. Dewing received an honorary degree at the 1988 Spring Commencement Ceremony.

As in the past, nominations were solicited through the University Newsletter.

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT TO THE UNIVERSITY SENATE

for

1987/1988

Members of the 1987/88 Committee were Donald Bostrom (Accounting), Raymond Fischer (Speech), Patricia Fry (Law), Janice Goodwin (Home Economics & Nutrition), Randy Lee (Law), Roland Mower (Geography), Virginia Norman (Nursing), D. Jerome Tweton (History), and Lonny Winrich (Computer Science). Student representatives were Andy Lewis and Frank Doherty. D. Jerome Tweton served the Committee as Chairperson.

The Committee met four times during the year, directing most of its attention to the continuing matter of insufficient funding for materials as well as the anticipated library automation project.

During the course of discussions focusing on strategies for dealing with now-chronic insufficient funding for materials, the Committee suggested that the Library analyze periodicals subscriptions available and/or received in microformat, with the thought of by-passing the paper copies as a means of effecting savings. It was found that substantial savings (up to 80 percent) could be realized with respect to a number of selected titles if the morefrequent paper copies were to be relinquished for lessfrequent microfiche versions of the same titles when originally purchased. Moreover, initial purchases in microformat would obviate major preservation costs (i.e., binding or microform in lieu of binding) in connection with original purchases in paper format. The Committee approved a project to review currently-received titles with respect to need, together with a determination of the feasibility of receiving needed titles on microfiche, during the 1988/1989 year.

Excess income amounting to \$100,000, was transferred to the Chester Fritz Library by the University in the spring of 1988. Of this, \$55,000 was allocated to the periodicals budget to cover anticipated cost increases of between 11 and 12 percent; the remainder was allocated to book purchases.

In the early spring of 1988, President Clifford indicated that the University would commit funds to enable the three University libraries (the Chester Fritz, the Harley E. French Library of the Health Sciences, and the

Thormodsgard Law Library) to proceed with plans to automate those libraries. The campus project soon blossomed into a statewide public higher education project, with commensurate increases in benefits to University faculty, students, and staff.

REPORT TO UNIVERSITY SENATE 1987-88

During the 1987-88 academic year the University of North Dakota Student Policy Committee was comprised of five students (Brian Spielvogel, Derek Dunham, Cathy Puetz, Sue Noah, Dan Dufault) and five faculty members (Mary Wright, Carol Berg, Scot Stradley, Brian Reynolds, Sue Hunter) who met weekly. The Vice President of Student Affairs serves as the advisor for the committee.

Activities of the committee included: a) the review and approval of student organization constitutions; b) review and recommendations for the revision of the UND Code of Student Life; and c) participation in the disciplinary hearing process for a UND student organization.

A total of 19 student organization constitutions were reviewed and approved by Student Policy Committee. Among those approved were 11 new student organizations. The Coordinator of Student Organizations provided assistance to the organizations submitting constitutions to the committee.

A primary focus of the Student Policy Committee was the updating of the UND Code of Student Life. The last time the Code went through a major revision was in 1976-78. Initial steps in revising and formulating recommendations for the Code were outlined and implemented by the 1987-88 committee. Statements were approved for inclusion in the Appendices of the Code regarding Diversity in the University Community, Instructions for Petitioners, Native American Symbols, and Donated Goods/Alcohol Sponsorship Policy. The process for completing the Code revisions is continuing and the plan is to seek approval from University Senate in Spring 1989.

Input regarding the revision of the Code was sought from members of the University community during the spring semester of 1987-88. Questionnaires were distributed to all student organizations and to University departments. Faculty and staff were invited to participate through a questionnaire in the UND Letter. Two public hearings were set to provide opportunity for input.

Student Policy Committee also held a conduct review of a student organization which was initiated by the Dean of Students Office. SPC's sanctions included suspension of the organization until specific committee recommendations are enacted. An appeal by the student organization was made to University Senate Executive Committee and the decision by SPC was upheld.
