Mr. Young introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs

A BILL

To provide for the acquisition of a site and the erection thereon of a permanent museum building to house the relics and other items of historical value of the Fort Berthold Indians.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the
- 4 Bureau of Indian Affairs, is authorized and directed (1) to
- 5 acquire by purchase, condemnation, or otherwise, a suitable
- 6 site in the State of North Dakota, and to enter into contracts
- 7 for the construction thereon of a suitable building, including
- 8 all necessary equipment and appurtenances, for the purpose
- 9 of providing a permanent museum building to house the
- 10 relics, records, and other items of historical value of the Fort

- 1 Berthold Indians as hereinafter provided in section 2 of
- 2 this Act, and (2) to accept, on behalf of the United States,
- 3 for installation in such museum, relics, records, and other
- 4 items of historical value which may be offered by the Fort
- 5 Berthold Historical Society as additions to the museum.
- 6 SEC. 2. The museum building and site provided for
- 7 under the provisions of this Act shall be administered by
- 8 the Secretary of the Interior, through the National Park
- 9 Service, subject to the provisions of the Act entitled "An
- 10 Act to establish a National Park Service, and for other pur-
- 11 poses", approved August 25, 1916 (39 Stat. 535).
- SEC. 3. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated
- 13 such sum, not in excess of \$100,000, as may be necessary
- 14 to carry out the provisions of this Act.
