Letter from Asst. Atty. General Sheets to Fred J. Traynor

Dear Fred:

I returned this morning from Fargo after being engaged there continuously in the Grain Inspection case since I rode down with you.

I immediately went to the Library and proceeded to look up the questions of law regarding which we spoke with reference to the case of State vs. Stepp. I had no more pricked the surface when I was informed that the Supreme Court has already decided the case and had reversed it and sent it back for a new trial. The Supreme Court may be complained of for many reasons but certainly not for expeditiously handling business.
