The Chair asked if there were any corrections or business arising from the minutes of the November meeting. There being none, he declared the minutes approved as distributed.

4

The Chair announced that the Executive Committee had responded to a letter

on procedural guidelines for promotion and had given attention to how notification to students and faculty regarding committee meeting times could be improved.

5.

Mr. Nielsen presented the tentative list of Candidates for Degrees in December, 1989, and moved that the list be approved for recommendation to the State Board of Higher Education for the awarding of the degrees indicated, upon satisfactory completion of the work of the present semester. Mr. O'Kelly seconded the motion. A vote was taken and there being no objection, the motion was approved and the vote recorded as a unanimous roll call vote.

Mr. Frein moved that the remainder of the agenda be suspended and the Senate spend the meeting time discussing the consequences of the vote on the tax referral. Mr. Lewis seconded the motion. The motion was voted upon and approved with Sandra Donaldson voting against the motion. Informal discussion was held. Mr. Bostrom reported for Mr. Pynn, Chair of the Senate Committee on Referral Contingencies, regarding the committees activities thus far and requesting Senate input on a sense of direction for the future. The committee is considering active research to obtain input from the rest of the campus. Further discussion concerned maintaining morale and quality of education. Ms. Clark indicated that the presidents were asking the State Board for autonomy on their own campuses in deciding where cuts should be made. The Board has not yet taken action on this request. Mr. Frien stated that the Senate should resolve to support the presidents' request for autonomy. Discussion continued and the Chair asked the group if there was a motion to suspend the rules to continue the meeting beyond the 5:30 p.m. adjournment time. Mr. Markovich moved that the rules for adjournment be suspended to extend the meeting for 15 minutes or until Mr. Frein's motion for a resolution was completed. The motion was seconded and there being no objection, the meeting continued. Mr. O'Kelly provided the following wording for the motion and Mr. Frein moved approval:

This Senate supports the presidents of the North Dakota Higher Education institutions in their insistence on institutional autonomy in meeting any required budgetary reductions; it is especially important in difficult times that there be more rather than less faculty participation in the decision-making process.

The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried unanimously.

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT TO THE UNIVERSITY SENATE

1988/1989

Members of the 1988/89 Committee were Raymond Fischer (Communications), Janice Goodwin (Home Economics & Nutrition), Randy Lee (Law), Donald Lemon (CTL), Shahin Rezania (Civil Engineering), Kathryn Tiongson (Nursing), D. Jerome Tweton (History), and Lonny Winrich (Computer Science). Student representatives were Frank Doherty and Andy Lewis. Randy Lee served the Committee as Chairperson.

The Committee met four times during the year and, as in previous years, directed most of its attention to the problem of maintaining collections in the face of continued inadequate funding, and also discussed ways to build the collection.

The Committee and the Library administration explored alternatives to traditional approaches to purchasing journals. The viability of (1) selectively substituting microformat for hard copy when originally purchasing periodicals; (2) selectively eliminating subscriptions to expensive titles held both at UND and NDSU in favor of guaranteed short-time turn-around for articles via telefacsimile; and (3) selectively searching indexes and abstracts online in place of purchasing hard copy format were explored.

The Committee decided to test some of the notions discussed by proposing them to a sample of departments for which numerous expensive periodicals are purchased. The Director and one or more Committee members attended meetings with faculty in the Biology, Geology, Mechanical Engineering, and Physics departments. The meetings, taken together, indicated that if employed judiciously and with appropriate faculty input, the various alternatives are viable on a selective basis. Library staff are proceeding with these options on a department-by-department basis.

The Committee reviewed and approved proposed revisions in circulation policies and procedures which include changes in borrowing privileges, overdue notices, processing fees, fines, suspension of borrowing privileges and the like for faculty, staff, and students. Some changes have been implemented; others will be implemented when the record-keeping components of the automated system are in place.

The Student Policy Committee met weekly except for official breaks and holidays throughout the 1988-89 academic year. Two special meetings were held for comprehensive review and subsequent approval of the revised UND Code of Student Life.

Gordon Henry, Vice President for Student Affairs, served as advisor of the committee. The Coordinator of Student/Greek Organizations assisted the committee and student organizations with their constitutions.

Committee activities were as follows:

- 1. Review and approval of student organization constitutions. Seventy student organization constitutions were reviewed. Of these, 48 were approved, 13 will be approved upon receipt of a clean copy, 7 will be approved upon receipt of a letter defining their affiliation with a national group, and 2 were not approved. Due to the committee's priority involvement with the revisions of the Code of Student Life, a Student Organization Agreement was developed. This agreement allowed organizations to make changes in their present constitutions contingent upon the approval of the Coordinator of Student/Greek Organizations. The Student Organization Agreement is a temporary measure. The organizations completing this agreement may be required to submit a complete constitution in the future. Seven Student Organization Agreements were approved.
- 2. Revision of the model constitution for student organizations. The model constitution was revised to provide clear guidelines to organizations in developing their constitutions and to provide statements required of every organization. The model constitution provides a model format for writing constitutions plus suggests ideas that may be included.

- 3. Revision of the Code of Student Life. The Code of Student Life was last majorly revised in 1976-78. In 1988 the Student Policy Committee held open hearings for students, faculty, staff and departments. Surveys were distributed to student organizations and university departments. Input from the above was received and incorporated as appropriate. The revised Code of Student Life was submitted to University Senate for approval and received approval on May 4, 1989.
- 4. Review and make recommendations related to the UND student organization placed on suspension 1987-88. The Student Policy Committee reviewed the status of the UND organization. The organization was moved from suspension status to conduct probation status January 1, 1989. Recommendations were made to assist the student organization with removal of the conduct probation status. Student Policy Committee reviewed the progress of this student organization April 21, 1989, and based on progress it related and prior recommendations from the committee and from significant others, conduct probation was continued. The student organization will be reviewed again December, 1989.
