Dear Mr. Burdick,

As a representative of the Ladies Aides
of the Congregational churches of Dawson,
Tappen, Weiser Township, and Petibone,
North Dakota, I urge you to vote for
the naming of the waters impounded by the
Garrison Dam Lake Lakatawewa and not
allow the bill to be tabled. First and most
important, to give honor to the Indian
women who guided the Lewis & Clark
Expedition to the Northwest would greatly
strengthen the morale of our first Americans -
people who by treaty owned the land where
the waters are, and who for many years have
been unjustly treated. Secondly, we
should do everything possible to make our
great state interesting to tourists. What
better way is there than enriching our
historic settings?
