Many Nodaks, recognizing the value of a good vacation, are attending the Reunion and taking their vacation on these dates instead of during the regular summer months.

There are a lot of dividends in such a procedure. In the first place Camelback is recognized by the many guests who come here from every state in the Union as one of the world's most interesting resorts.

All the wonderful facilities, which have attracted the cream of the nation's families, are offered to the UND visitors at a rate of \$13.50 per person for two persons in a twinbedded room with bath. This fee also includes a cocktail party and considerable entertainment.

## Graduation Speaker Selected

Alexander Budge of Honolulu, prominent Hawaiian business executive and former University of North Dakota student, will be the principal speaker for UND commencement exercises at 2 p.m. June 7.

Budge, who attended UND in 1908-09, is the son of William Budge, one of the persons instrumental in the founding of the University at Grand Forks. With two other men, William Budge donated the land on which the University was established and was instrumental in an 1893 fund drive which kept the institution from closing when the Legislators made no appropriation for its operation.

Alexander Budge is pictured in a March issue of Life Magazine as one of the business leaders of the nation's newest state. He is shown with two other men, the caption stating that the trio "help run three of the five main trading companies in Hawaii."
