#### The following announcements were made by the Chairman:

- The UND Student Senate has passed a resolution regarding presidential searches that is very similar to the resolution passed at the November 2001 University Senate meeting. Mr. Perry also stated that other NDUS institutions have also adopted similar resolutions
- B. The Senate Executive Committee has adopted a policy drafted by Randy Lee to update the Faculty Handbook. The standing committee created by this policy has met.

C. There will be two resolutions added to the agenda in the Business Calendar.

The minutes of the last University Senate meeting were approved with one correction: The addition of the words "the deletion of" to the end of the first sentence of the second paragraph in item #2 under section #9 of the minutes.

6.

The Chairman introduced the question period at 4:13 p.m. There were no questions.

7.

Three Annual Reports on the Consent Calendar from the Senate Library Committee, Legislative Affairs Committee, and the Student Policy Committee were received and filed after Mr. Gagnon moved to approve. The Senate voted unanimously to accept the reports. (Attachments #1, 2, and 3 on file in the Office of the Registrar)

Mr. Grijalva reported on the recent activities of the Council of College Faculties (CCF). He announced that the North Dakota Student Association and four other campuses have joined UND in asking for more participation in presidential searches. He expects CCF will consider a resolution at the next meeting. CCF is also considering improving communication in both frequency and content from the Board to the CCF, the campuses, and the public; funding for presidential compensation; and a policy change from the Board concerning faculty grievances and mediation. At CCF's request, the proposed policy package was amended to lengthen the time (from 10 business days to 20 calendar days) that faculty have to respond to certain steps in the grievance process. He also reported about discretionary funds allocated system-wide for projects related to Board objectives and towards equity with peer institutions. The next CCF meeting will be over IVN on December 11 at 10:00 a.m.

Ms. Jeno moved to approve the recommendations from the Curriculum Committee for new program and course requests. After discussion, the motion was approved unanimously. (Attachment #4 on file in the Office of the Registrar)

10.

Mr. Jackson moved to approve the list of candidates for degrees in December 2001. The motion carried unanimously.

11.

Mr. Perry updated the Senate on the work of the Seed Money Committee. This fall the committee has evaluated 40 proposals and recommended funding for 15. Additional funding of \$240,000 from the City of Grand Forks and matched three to one by the University are now available. Discussion continued about the Faculty Seed Money Committee and its formal relationship to the University Senate. The Senate Executive Committee will communicate to the Seed Money Committee and continue to report back to the Senate.

Mr. Bridewell moved to approve the following resolution:

Mr. Petros moved to adopt the following resolution:

One outcome of the recent State of the Faculty Conference was the commitment to enhance communication among the faculty of the campuses with their CCF representatives and the State Board of Higher Education (SBHE). Specifically, the participants at this meeting talked about requesting that the SBHE office put up on its web site all the materials that are sent to the board members so all who wish to follow the board activities can be fully informed prior to the meeting as to the nuts and bolts of upcoming issues.

Therefore, the University Senate of the University of North Dakota requests that the board office uploads to the NDUS web site at the time the agenda for the State Board of Higher Education Meetings is posted, all the documents and attachments that are sent to the SBHE members. This would allow CCF members to be better informed and to better communicate to the CCF representative at Board meetings. Further, this

change would allow campus senates to keep current about board activities and to better inform their CCF representatives as to their opinions and concerns about SBHE activity. In addition, since the Roundtable positions the NDUS as a major player in growing the state economy, all taxpayers in the state would have immediate access to the activities of the SBHE.

After discussion the motion was approved unanimously.

## UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA University Senate Library Committee Annual Report 2000-2001

#### Membership

#### **Committee Activities**

- The University Senate Library Committee met two times during 2000/2001.
- The Committee elected Professor Kenneth Hansen, Chair for 200/01.
- The Committee received reports on the 2000/01 Library budget, which projected a \$359,135 deficit.
- The Committee reviewed the Library's decision to eliminate the \$2 fee for Interlibrary Loan requests.

University Senate Library Committee

- The Committee reviewed the Library's Strategic Plan.
- The Committee received reports on Library activities to leverage access to information through cooperative agreements with other libraries.
- The Committee received the Library's report of \$280,000 in administrative supplemental funding to support library services. The funding was made available in December 2000.
- The Committee Chair prepared a letter to the President expressing concern about funding for the Library.

#### Library Accomplishments

- Mr. Wilbur Stolt was appointed Director of Libraries effective July 1, 2000.
- The Library maintained current subscriptions to periodicals and funded the purchase of books in support of academic programs.
- In cooperation with the Alumni Association, the Library conducted the 5th Annual Books Open Doors fund-raising campaign and a second solicitation, "Building Opportunities in the Next Millennium.
- The Library received supplemental funding through the President and the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost to purchase books.
- The Library completed a strategic plan as part of the campus strategic planning activities.
- The Library experienced significant increases in ILL activity.

#### **Issues and Challenges Facing the Library**

Many of the issues and challenges are the same as previous years.

- The Library was very fortunate to receive supplemental funding to support the acquisition library resources and the library's operations. This was one-time funding, which does not carry forward. Inflation rates for scholarly materials have annually reached 8 to 15 percent. The current Library budget will not be able to sustain current levels of support for journals, books, electronic resources, automation, and day-to-day library operations without significant, continuing funding increases.
- As academic departments add new programs, the Library is asked to support the
  research needs of new faculty and graduate students. Without funding to support new
  acquisitions, the Library will be forced to reallocate funds from current programs to
  support new programs.
- More information is being produced in electronic formats, requiring a well-developed computer and networking infrastructure to deliver the information. Costs to deliver information within a constantly changing technological environment requires continuing funding for hardware, software and training.
- Continuing changes in the production and delivery of information require a
  knowledgeable professional and career staff. Recruitment and retention of good staff is
  a major challenge for the Library. UND has benefited from dedicated and
  knowledgeable librarians and staff. It is important to retain these people.
- Cooperative alliances with other libraries and related organizations can result in cost savings and resource sharing opportunities. The Library must continue to seek cooperative agreements, which benefit the University of North Dakota. Cooperation, however, does carry a cost. Resources will have to be allocated to cooperative ventures to realize the advantages from those activities.

In the fall of 2000-2001 the Legislative Affairs Committee met to develop a proposal in response to the Interim Legislative Committee recommendation to the State Legislature regarding increased authority to the University System. A proposal was introduced and passed at the October Senate meeting calling for strengthening the importance of shared governance if more authority is granted to the system and the universities. The Committee Chair and University Senate President participated in a reception at the President's House to get acquainted with local state legislators.

In the spring of 2001, the Committee Chair was not invited to participate in the University delegation to the Senate Appropriations Committee for the Budget presentation. After the committee contacted President Kupchella, the Committee Chair was invited to be part of the entourage at the House Appropriations Committee Budget presentation. The President's Office also forwarded information from the Board of Higher Education to committee members to help them track important bills so they could react in a timely manner.

The Committee supported the Interim Legislative Committee recommendation that provide more autonomy to campuses but did not take any formal action. Two important pieces of legislation were followed and discussed at the University Senate. SB 2291 would have stripped campuses of virtually all control of transfer credits within the system. The University Senate, at its March meeting went on record to oppose this bill. With extensive lobbying, it was defeated. Another bill, HB 1435 was an anti-affirmative action bill. We could not act officially in a timely manner but did lobby for its defeat and it was subsequently defeated. To help deal with the time crunch during the Biennial Legislative session, the University Senate passed, at its March meeting, an amendment to the "functions and responsibilities" of the committee to enable the Committee to get endorsement by the Executive Committee to assure quick responses to legislative actions.

The Committee has been reviewing its procedures and preparing for the next legislative session. Among other activities, the committee is developing a web site to provide quick access to timely issues as they arise.
