The May meeting of the University Senate was held at 4:05 p.m. on Thursday, May 2, 2002, in Room 7, Gamble Hall. David Perry presided.

The following announcement was made:

Mr. Ettling presented Mr. Perry with a plaque thanking him for his service to the Senate for the 2001-2002 year.

5.

The Chairman asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes of the April 4, 2002 Senate meeting. There being none, the minutes were approved as distributed.

6.

The Chairman announced the question period at 4:12 p.m. Mr. Rice commented that the Governor's announcement about CONNECT ND included no information about support and asked how it will be funded. Mr. Frost answered that students will pay a fee of \$3.50 per credit hour up to a total fee of \$42 per semester. The Governor did not include CONNECT ND in the budget, and the students hope it will be addressed at the next legislative session.

7.

Mr. Perry introduced the consent calendar's annual reports from the Scholarly Activities Committee, the University Curriculum Committee, the Faculty Research Seed Money Committee and the Restructuring and Reallocation Committee. Mr. Murphy raised a question about the Faculty Research Seed Money Committee report concerning the philosophy of the Committee in requiring a proposal for external funding. Mr. Perry recognized Kevin Young, chairman of the Faculty Seed Money Committee, and asked him to address the question. Mr. Young replied that applicants must tell the Committee they are going to apply for some outside funding, and if they reapply they must prove that they have applied externally. Mr. Davis raised a point of order and asked a question as to whether this committee was accountable to the Senate, and if not, what is the Senate's role? Ms. Krogh raised a point of order that the report was on the consent calendar agenda and must be moved to the business calendar to be discussed. Mr. Fivizanni stated that this report contained many issues to be addressed and said that this agenda may not be the place to do it. Mr. Mochoruk moved to receive and file the reports. There was unanimous consent and the reports were received and filed. (Attachments #1, #2, #3, and #4)

8.

Mr. Perry restated the motion to approve the revisions of the UND Constitution which was under consideration at the adjournment of the April Senate meeting. Mr. Bridewell moved to consider the constitutional revisions with a brief informal discussion. Mr. Fivizanni offered a friendly amendment to limit discussion to ten minutes which was accepted by Mr. Bridewell. The motion carried unanimously. Informal discussion followed. Mr. Bridewell moved to table this agenda item. The motion carried 37 to 12 with 3 abstentions.

9.

Mr. Mochoruk moved to approve the roster of candidates for degrees for the May 2002 graduation. The roster was approved unanimously with one abstention.

10.

Mr. Mochoruk moved to approve the recommendations from the University Curriculum Committee. The motion carried 44 to 2 with 2 abstentions.

11.

Mr. Lovseth moved to accept the Ad Hoc Faculty Evaluation Form Committee's request to increase the membership to three students and three faculty members and to include the phrase "and implementation policies" in the description of the functions and responsibilities of the Committee. Discussion ensued. Mr. Murphy offered a friendly amendment to require at least one graduate student, which Mr. Lovseth

did not accept; therefore, Mr. Murphy moved to amend the motion to require one student member be a graduate student. Discussion continued. The amendment to the motion carried 39 to 7 with 3 abstentions. Discussion on the motion continued. Mr. Fivizzani moved to substitute the word procedure for policy in the motion. Discussion resumed. Mr. Antes moved to call the question and the motion carried 47 to 2 with 1 abstention. Mr. Bridewell requested that the motion be divided into two questions: (1) to increase the membership of the committee to three students, including one graduate student; and (2) to change the first sentence of the functions and responsibilities to "To review the current University faculty evaluation form and implementation procedures and recommend changes." The motion to increase membership was approved 44 to 2 with 2 abstentions. Discussion continued on the second question. The motion carried 29 to 13 with 7 abstentions.

12.

Mr. Geoff Vining, student member and the co-chair of the Student Policy Committee was recognized by the Chairman to address the Senate about the proposed revisions to Section 2 of the Code of Student Life.

13.

Mr. Petros moved to extend the meeting until 5:45 p.m. The motion carried 36 to 12.

14.

Mr. Stofferahn moved to table the revisions for the *Code of Student Life* until the University general counsel is consulted. Motion carried 41 to 2 with 3 abstentions.

15.

Mr. Bridewell moved to accept the changes to the policies for incomplete and in progress grades and to the grade change policy as submitted by the Admissions and Academic Policies Committee. Discussion ensued.

16.

Mr. Murphy moved to extend the meeting by five minutes. Motion carried 29 to 15 with 3 abstentions and 1 other vote.

17.

Mr. Murphy moved to table the motion. The motion failed 29 to 15 with 1 abstention.

18.

Mr. Frost moved to extend the meeting until 6:00 p.m. Motion carried 33 to 7 with 3 abstentions.

19.

The Chairman called for a vote on the motion. Motion carried. Mr. Davis raised a point of order that the membership was not clear about the motion that was being voted on. Mr. Perry ruled the point of order not well taken and that the vote was valid. Mr. Bartsch offered a point of order that the motion was offered after the adjournment time of 5:50. The Chairman ruled the point of order not accepted. Mr. Smith moved to

reconsider the vote on the changes to the policies for incomplete and in progress grades and to the grade change policy. Discussion ensued. The motion to reconsider carried.

20.

The motion to accept the changes to the policies for incomplete and in progress grades and to the grade change policy as submitted by the Admissions and Academic Policies Committee was reconsidered. Discussion ensued. The motion was defeated.

21.

Mr. Murphy presented a letter to Chancellor Isaak from the Senate Intellectual Property Committee and the University Senate concerning the proposed modifications to SBHE 611.2 and 611.3. Mr. Mochoruk moved to approve the letter. The question was called. The motion carried. (Attachment #5)

The meeting was adjourned at 6:00 p.m.

FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Constitution and By-Laws of the University Senate charge the Committee to stimulate and encourage faculty research, develop institutional policy on faculty research and to allocate research funds available to the Senate Scholarly Activities Committee on the basis of applications submitted to it.

MEETINGS

The Senate Scholarly Activities Committee meets for two primary purposes:

- 1. The evaluation of UND faculty proposals for research and creative activity, travel, or publication awards.
- 2. Discussion of UND policies related to research and discussion of ways to encourage research activity at this University.

FUNDS:

During the first nine months of the 2001-2002 fiscal year, the Senate Scholarly Activities Committee awarded \$77,209 to 84 faculty members in 42 departments. Awards were made as follows: \$30,000 for New Faculty Scholar awards, \$3,120 for Publication, \$19,017 for Research and Creative Activity, and \$25,072 for travel (additional funds will be awarded for travel in May 2002). The Committee received a supplemental award from the President to be expended during Fiscal Years 2000-2001 and 2001-2002; thus, award amounts exceed those of previous years.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

- 1. New Faculty Scholar Awards were given to Christopher C. Austin (Biology), Charlene D. Chamberlain (Communication Sciences and Disorders), Kim W. Fink (Art), Wayne W. Seames (Chemical Engineering), Sandra E. Short (Physical Education and Exercise Science), and Kara B. Wettersten (Counseling) in February, 2002.
- Professors Thomas E. O'Neil (Computer Science) and Garl K. Rieke (Anatomy and Cell Biology) represented the Senate Scholarly Activities Committee in the selection of the recipients of the Fellows of the University Award for Departmental Excellence in Research and the UND Foundation Thomas J. Clifford Faculty Achievement Award for Excellence in Research for 2002.
- 3. The Committee reviewed and approved Policies for the Use of Indirect Rebate Funds for the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology and the School of Communication.

During the Fall semester of 2001, the Committee had protracted deliberations on the philosophy and procedures to be used to apportion Seed Money funds, with the intention that the method of apportionment be as fair and useful as possible. The Committee adopted the following principle for apportioning funds among the subcommittees and applicants: funds will be distributed proportionally among the subcommittees, the percentage given to each being determined by the number of applicants from each subcommittee divided by the total number of applicants. This principle was adopted to aid the equitable distribution of funds across all the disciplines in the University. Nonetheless, because the purpose of the Committee is to support as many of the best proposals as possible, the Committee retained the freedom to make relatively minor adjustments in the numbers of awards approved from each subcommittee. Therefore, the final distribution of funds among subcommittees will not be determined solely by strict arithmetical adherence to the proportional principle, but is to be guided by that principle.

The Committee also devised the following guidelines: Application for Seed Money Awards, Evaluation by Subcommittees, Evaluation by the Full Committee, and Conditions for Accepting Awards. These were distributed to persons applying for and involved in the second round of applications.

Those applicants who received funding during this academic year are appended on the next two pages. The complete list of applicants for these first two rounds of funding are appended, as well. The historical list of applicants is also appended, which includes applicants prior to constitution of this Committee and includes external funding applied for and/or received by these faculty members.

First round of Seed Money Awards

At the meeting of November 27, 2001, the Committee distributed \$400,000. A total of 20 awards were funded out of 48 proposals, yielding a funding rate of 42%.

Second round of Seed Money Awards

At the meeting of April 16, 2002, the Committee distributed \$291,500 – \$240,000 in new money plus \$51,500 in funds returned unused by previous awardees. A total of 15 awards were funded out of 31 proposals, yielding a funding rate of 48%. In addition to these awards, funds in the amount of \$24,664 were designated for the Mathematical and Natural Sciences subcommittee to be distributed to one or more of the next highest ranked applications, as determined by that subcommittee.

Annual Report of the Faculty Senate Reallocation and Restructuring Committee

April 22, 2002

The committee elected Ahmad Ghassemi to serve as chair of the committee through fall 2002.

The committee discussed the current role and the responsibilities of the committee as described by the University Senate handbook. It was evident that the role of the Reallocation and Restructuring Committee has begun to overlap with those of the University Planning and Budget Committee, a committee appointed by the president.

The committee members felt that it is essential to have faculty input in policies related to restructuring/reallocation and that in order to have as representative a group as possible, those faculty should be determined by University Senate election. Therefore, the committee members unanimously agreed that the RRC should retain its role and function by providing advice to the President and the Planning and Budget Committee regarding its recommendations on restructuring and reallocation.

The committee also discussed the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Faculty Rights (SCFR) regarding the procedures for termination of tenured faculty other than for adequate cause. It was agreed that the RRC could in the future be the vehicle for implementing the Board's policy on termination of tenured faculty, as suggested by the SCFR. In that case, the RRC recommends that its membership consist of tenure track and long-term non-tenure track faculty.

It is anticipated that the committee will meet next fall to perform a thorough review of its policies in preparation for any issues arising in the State legislative session in 2003. The committee will also be ready to receive and review restructuring/reallocation proposals form the administration (if any), and to assume other responsibilities (see attached for the complete listing of the RRC responsibilities).

Current Incomplete Policies

Current Undergraduate Policy*:

The mark "I", Incomplete, shall be assigned only to the student who has been in attendance and has done satisfactory work up to a time within four weeks of the close of the semester, including the examination period, and whose work is incomplete for reasons satisfactory to his or her instructor. Incompletes are so entered on a semester grade sheet. In addition, the instructor shall indicate on a separate form what grade the incomplete should automatically be converted to, if the student fails to complete the assigned work within the allowed time period. An "I", Incomplete, in a course taken for undergraduate credit must be completed during the first four weeks of the succeeding semester that the student is enrolled in institutional credit. An Administrative Procedures Committee petition for an extension of time of an incomplete may be submitted to the Office of the Registrar by a student with the approval of the instructor of the course and the dean of the college offering the course. An "I" once recorded may be removed or converted as indicated above but cannot be expunded from the record. After seven years, all outstanding "Incomplete" grades will be marked as permanent "Incomplete." A student may complete the course work to remove a permanent "Incomplete" after seven years with the permission of the chairperson of the department offering the course and the dean of the college offering the course.

(* Other policies relating to incompletes are not published in the catalog but are found in Senate minutes or in registrar's office procedures documents. These include the policies for non-convertible incompletes.)

Current Graduate Policy:

University policy specifies that the grade of Incomplete is to be given only when circumstances beyond the student's control have prevented completion of the course within the official dates of the session, provided the work completed up to four weeks before the end of the semester was satisfactory. The grade of "I" is temporary and indicates that the student's work must be made up and completed without repeating the course.

A graduate student who receives a grade of "Incomplete" is obligated to complete the necessary work and submit it to the instructor in a timely manner in order that the "Incomplete" can be replaced by a permanent grade. The letter grade must be submitted to the Registrar by the date specified by the instructor on the Incomplete grade form or within the first five weeks of the beginning of the next regular semester, whichever date occurs first. If the Incomplete is not replaced before the deadline, it will be converted by the Registrar to the grade specified on the Incomplete grade form submitted by the instructor.

The grade of "Incomplete" received for registration in Thesis (998), Dissertation (999), Independent Study (997), Research Design (Engineering 595), English 591, Professional Exhibition (VA 599), or Research (leading to the thesis or dissertation), activities which usually span several sessions, need not be replaced until the conclusion of the activity, usually a student's final semester.

Students may not register in courses in which they currently hold grades of Incomplete. This rule does not apply to registration for Thesis, Dissertation, Research, or Engineering Research Design. For students to remain on the graduation list for a given semester, Incompletes in all courses/seminars/practica, etc. must have been made up by the date designated in the academic calendar.

Proposed Policies

Incomplete Grades

It is expected that students will complete all requirements for a course during the time frame of the course. For reasons beyond a students's control, and upon request by a student. an incomplete grade may be assigned by the instructor when there is reasonable certainty the student will successfully complete the course without retaking it. The mark "I", Incomplete, shall be assigned only to the student who has been in attendance and has done satisfactory work up to a time within four weeks of the close of the semester, including the examination period, and whose work is incomplete for reasons satisfactory to his or her instructor. Incompletes are entered on the final grade sheet. Incomplete grades convert to grades of "F" if a grade change is not submitted by the instructor within two calendar months¹ after the month in which the course ends or by an earlier date specified on the incomplete form by the instructor.² An incomplete may be extended for up to twelve calendar months by submitting a petition to the Office of the Registrar with the approval of the instructor of the course and the dean of the college offering the course for undergraduates and the Dean of the Graduate School for graduate students. An incomplete grade may not be changed after twelve calendar months from the ending date of the class.3 An "I" may be converted as indicated above but cannot be expunged from the record. Students may not register in courses in which they currently hold grades of incomplete. A student will not be allowed to graduate with an unconverted incomplete grade on the academic record.

In Progress **

The Graduate School or the Honors Program may assign a grade of "SP", Satisfactory Progress or "UP", Unsatisfactory Progress, to Honors Thesis (489), Thesis (998), Dissertation (999), Independent Study (997), Research Design (Engineering 595), English 591, Professional Exhibition (VA 599), or Research (leading to the thesis or dissertation). The "SP" or "UP" grade for these activities, which usually span several sessions, need not be replaced until the conclusion of the activity, usually a student's final semester. Grades of "SP" or "UP" are not calculated into term or cumulative GPA values and will be expunged from the record upon submission of final grades for the course.

(**Note: The bold text is new text added to the current graduate incomplete policy. The committee wanted to add the UP as a way of indicating lack of satisfactory progress by students. If the student recovers and goes on to complete successfully, the UP goes away and is replaced by the final grade. If the student does not complete, there is a record of satisfactory or unsatisfactory progress on the academic record.

Grade Changes

Submitted grades, except for grades of incomplete, are final and may only be changed to correct an error. Grades may not be changed by additional work or submitting additional materials. Students should report any error to their instructor within 90 days of receipt of the grade. The instructor must file a change of grade form to the Registrar signed by the instructor, the department chair, and the dean of the course. Reasons for the change must be fully explained and justified.

The phrase "at the end of two calendar months" is meant to simplify due dates and results in grades being due on the last day of the applicable month, i.e. a course which ended on December 15 would have a two calendar month incomplete due date of February 28.

² Procedural Note: The incomplete form submitted with the grade would allow the faculty to specify an earlier date, default to the two calendar months date, or petition to extend.

³ The phrase "twelve calendar months" is meant to simplify due dates and would result in grades being due on the last day of the month one year after the course ended.

Dear Chancellor Isaak:

The members of the Senate Intellectual Property Committee and the University Senate at the University of North Dakota have read the proposed modifications to SBHE 611.2 and 611.3 and enthusiastically support the adoption of said revisions. We have found that this policy is dramatically updated and very fair with regards to faculty's intellectual property interests and rights. Further, we feel this policy will be very conducive in promoting development of intellectual property at the University of North Dakota.

We did find some confusion within the document in section 4 covering the General Copyright Policy. We feel additional information should be included in section 4A, which would make this section more consistent with the definitions applied to copyrightable software under sections 2.2, 2.7, 4D.1 and 4E. In 4A, we feel addition of this phrase at the end of the first sentence would aid in avoiding confusion with regards to copyrightable software which is part of scholarly work This phrase is: except for copyrightable software see 4E.

We have found that this policy protects equally the institution and the faculty. We feel that its adoption by the SBHE is paramount to providing the NDUS and its faculty a fair, equitable intellectual property policy that will stimulate the pursuit of intellectual property at our University.
