The following announcements were made:

- Mr. Crawford announced that the revised faculty handbook is now on the web.
- Mr. Crawford pointed out the flyer that was distributed at the meeting announcing the "Exploring the American Indian Experience" activities to be held during Spring, 2004.
- Mr. Crawford announced a meeting of the State Historical Society of North Dakota at UND on December 11, 2003 in the Memorial Union.

- D. Mr. Boyd thanked the campus for the tremendous cooperation in dealing with the disappearance of Dru Sjodin, and matters of other student problems. He stated that getting through these problems would not be possible without the cooperation of the faculty and staff.
- E. Mr. Baker announced that he talked with the Bookstore and they have 82% of the book orders in, and he thanked the faculty on behalf of the students.
- F. Mr. Tozer introduced Linda Neuerburg as the new staff senator replacing Philip Parnell, who resigned.

The Chair asked for corrections or additions to the November 6, 2003 minutes. Mr. Murphy asked that the minutes show that number 11 of the November 6 minutes include the following statements:

A motion to increase the royalties in Section IIIe to 60% died for lack of a second. Discussion continued and Mr. Kupchella said the minimum compensation of 30% was negotiable by faculty.

The minutes were approved as amended.

6.

The Chair opened the question period at 4:15 p.m. There were no questions.

7.

Mr. Crawford announced a request to move the report from the UND Ad Hoc Harassment Policy and Procedure Revision Committee from the consent calendar to the business calendar. This was approved by consensus.

8.

Mr. Marshall moved to approve the annual reports of the Senate Continuing Education, Distance Education and Outreach Committee and the Senate Library Committee on the consent calendar. The consent calendar was approved unanimously. men'i and an armed 9. Herebyees for the c

Ms. Krogh moved to approve the slate of candidates for degrees for December 2003. The motion was approved unanimously.

10.

Ms. Heitkamp moved to approve the report from the Curriculum Committee. After discussion, the report was approved on a vote of 59 in favor and 1 abstention.

11.

Mr. Murphy moved to ask the Curriculum Committee to look into the language of PPT 492 to investigate the number of hours attempted and report back to the Senate at the next meeting. The motion was approved unanimously.

12.

Mr. Murphy moved to accept the recommendations of the Conflict of Interest Committee to change the membership from five to six faculty members, to retain a quorum of three, and to change the non-voting ex officio member from the Director of the Office of Research and Program Development to the Vice President for Research or his or her designee. The motion was approved on a vote of 60 in favor with 1 abstention.

13.

Mr. Murphy moved to accept the recommendation from the Senate Scholarly Activities Committee to change its membership by increasing the faculty membership from six to nine, to include two representatives from the College of Arts and Sciences, with at least one of these members being from the humanities, and one representative from each of the other colleges and to replace the Director of the Office of Research and Program Development with the Vice President of Research or his or her designee as a voting ex-officio member.

Ms. Potvin moved to amend the motion by changing the recommendation "to include two representatives from the College of Arts and Sciences, with at least one of these members being from the humanities, and one representative from each of the other colleges" to "to include two representatives from different divisions from the College of Arts and Sciences and one representative from each of the other colleges." Discussion on the amendment ensued. Mr. Lee moved to postpone consideration of the motion indefinitely until such time as the committee can be present at the Senate meeting to explain their request. The motion was approved on a vote of 60 in favor and 1 opposed.

14.

Mr. Fivizzani and Ms. Goodwin presented the proposed revisions to the University Senate Bylaws for the first review. Discussion on the changes ensued. Mr. Lee asked the Senate Executive Committee to add a section making the changes in election of chair and vice chair to be effective August 15, 2003. Ms. Rakow asked to include in the Bylaws a requirement for Committee on Committee to publish the names of at least two nominees for each position in the agenda for the September meetings. There was discussion about whether that was appropriate to be included in the Bylaws or in the Committee on Committee's standing rules. Mr. Fivizzani and Ms. Goodwin will review the comments and return to the Senate for consideration.

15.

Mr. Fivizzani and Ms. Goodwin presented the proposed revisions to the Standing Rules of the University of North Dakota Senate. Ms. Rakow asked to insert language that there shall be at least two nominees for the committees included with the September agenda in the Standing Rules. It was agreed to take the comments back to the Senate Executive Committee for discussion.

16.

Ms. Hume presented the recommendations from the UND Ad Hoc Harassment Policy and Procedure Revision Committee. The committee asked for an extension for its report to the Senate until May, and to expand their charge to include solicitation of a broad range of input about the policies from UND community members. The motion was approved on a vote of 58 in favor with 2 opposed and 1 abstention.

Mr. Crawford asked the Senate members if the Senate should hold a January meeting on the third Thursday of January. It was agreed by consensus to meet again on the first Thursday in February.

The following are highlights of the topics reported to and discussed by the Committee during the year.

*Discussion of electronic services for students both on and off campus. The committee reviewed best practices from institutions like Washington State University and discussed which services should be available on the Internet and what should be available face-to-face.

*Review of the Division of Continuing Education's Annual Report and Strategic Plan. The Annual Report outlines either steady or growing enrollments and the addition of new off-campus degree programs as well as new non-credit programs.

*Incentives for faculty were also discussed in relation to UND reaching the strategic goal of 1800 student headcount from off campus enrollments. This is an area that the committee will monitor and discuss as new revenue models are discussed within the Council of Deans.

*Assessment of courses offered at a distance was also addressed by the committee. Associate Provost worked with the committee in outlining assessment processes at UND and how UND's off campus programs need to fall within the process. Modifications have been made to assessment instruments for programs delivered at a distance to fit within the UND processes.

*Items for continuing discussion by future committee members include: Making connections to serve rural and under served populations Balancing convenience with maintaining quality Monitoring quality of distance courses Experimenting with various delivery mechanisms Demonstrations of new delivery modes Providing input on what is needed from the library Showcasing IT developments at UND Meeting the needs of students with a variety of equipment Working with multiple course development tools Introducing students at a distance to the library Providing documentation to technologies available at UND Discussing academic property rights Providing faculty and student development Discussing faculty rewards in relation to the development and delivery of courses at a distance

Committee Activities

- The University Senate Library Committee met 4 times during 2002/03.
- The Committee elected Professor Lawrence Peterson, Chair for 2002/03.
- The Committee received reports on the 2002/03 Library budget. The budget allowed for increases in the book budget and continuation of all serial subscriptions.
- The Committee reviewed the Director's presentation about the status of the Library, which was given to the University Planning and Budget Council.
- Tony Stukel, Director of ODIN, met with the Committee to discuss future ODIN activities. The Committee received reports on the status of the Online Dakota Information Network (ODIN) and the project to implement new computer hardware and software to support statewide library services.
- The Committee discussed UND's need for scholarly information and the Library's strategies for meeting those needs.

Selected Library Accomplishments

- The Library added over 13,400 new titles to its holdings.
- The Library continued to experience increases in ILL activity requesting more than 11,500 loans from other libraries and information suppliers.
- The Library instruction program has contact with over 5,000 students.
- The Library served as a beta library for the conversion of records and creation of policy tables for the new automated library system to be installed by ODIN.
- The Library participated in Student Government UNiPrint project to subsidize computer printing for students.
- The Library received \$15,000 from the UND Student Senate to support a "Popular Reading Collection" at UND. The Collection contains best sellers and award winners in different literary genres. The Collection is located in the Reading Room.
- The Library offered six wireless laptops and six wireless cards to students working in the facility.

Conflict of Interest Committee Membership

According to Senate policy, the membership of the Senate Conflict of Interest/Scientific Misconduct Committee consists of five faculty members plus the Director of the Office of Research and Program Development (non-voting, ex-officio member), with approximately one-third of the members replaced each year. Currently, with only five voting members, it is difficult to obtain a quorum for meetings.

A motion was made and approved at the September 18, 2003, Committee meeting, that a recommendation be made to the University Senate to increase the membership of the Conflict of Interest/Scientific Misconduct Committee from five to six faculty members, with one-third of the faculty members to be replaced each year, beginning with the 2004-2005 Academic Year. The Committee also would like to retain a guorum of 3.

Since the University now has a Vice President for Research, the position of the Director of the Office of Research and Program Development will become the Associate Vice President for Research when it is filled in 2004. Therefore, the Committee recommends that the Director of the Office of Research and Program Development (the current ex officio Committee member) be replaced with the Vice President for Research or his/her designee.

November 2003 Report from the UND Harassment Policy Subcommittee

The Harassment Policy Subcommittee is composed of a diverse group of members representing faculty, staff, student, and administrative positions. The committee members were chosen with Presidential approval and we have just started forming a working relationship. The committee members include:

and Faythe Thureen (Senate/Languages).

The scheduling of meetings has been very difficult. The committee has met twice this semester and has two more meetings scheduled prior to the end of the year. The committee would like to solicit feedback about the current policies from UND community members during the spring 2004 semester, as it goes over the policies to recommend possible improvements.

To accomplish the **spirit** of the charge it was given by the UND Senate, the committee would like the Senate to broaden its charge to the committee and allow more time to accomplish the charge. Specifically, this committee would like the charge to include solicitation of a broad range of input about the policies from UND community members, a request to obtain copies of "lower level" policies in place in various departments and colleges (those which would apply before the concern reaches the level of the overall policy being examined by the committee), and an extension of the time until May 2004 to complete the original charge and this new expanded charge.

If the new charge is approved; at the next meeting the committee will finalize plans of how input will be solicited during the Spring 2004 semester and members will begin discussing the materials they already have to consider such as the current policies, the previous Senate Ad Hoc Committee recommendations, and examples of policies at other institutions. While the committee, which was formed in the midst of the Fall semester, has had difficulty scheduling meeting times and agreeing on a direction to take it seems that various perspectives have been aired and received and now some serious work can begin. We hope you will allow us to encourage the UND community to look at these policies and become informed and that you will give us the time to improve these policies so they can become even more effective for the UND campus.
