Mr. Diez asked how other departments handled absences by students for department field trips and how other faculty made arrangements for these things. Mr. Williams responded that in his department it depended on the student. Mr. Murphy stated that his department made allowances as possible. Mr. Hoffmann stated that they made arrangements for students to take exams early if it is a University sponsored event. Mr. Mochoruk stated that one of the problems students may encounter is that there is not necessarily department policy or University policy, but, rather, handled by individual faculty. Ms. Goodwin stated that they try to accommodate, but the number of requests has increased and it can be difficult for faculty to deal with absences. Mr. Kupchella asked if it wouldn't be possible to have a reasonable accommodation within reasonable standards. Mr. Diez stated that he hoped there would be some method to deal with this so students would not be penalized. Mr. Williams added that there can be so many variables involved that it comes down to the instructor. Mr. Dearden stated that most departments have a procedure on resolving problems such as this.

FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The purpose of the Senate Scholarly Activities Committee (SSAC) is to stimulate and encourage scholarly activities and develop relevant institutional policies. The membership of the Committee is composed of six faculty members, each from a different college, the Vice President for Academic Affairs or designee, and the Director of the Office of Research and Program Development. One-third of the faculty members are elected by the University Senate at the April meeting each year.

The Committee assumes the following responsibilities for the University Senate:

- Address general issues of importance to establishing and maintaining strong research and development programs on campus.
- Stimulate interaction between disciplines and take a proactive role to establish centers of excellence at UND.
- Allocate available research funds based on pre-established policies and guidelines.
- Maintain Committee website.

MEETINGS

The Senate Scholarly Activities Committee has met five times in 2003-2004 (one more meeting will be held in May, 2004) for the following primary purposes:

- 1. Evaluation of UND faculty proposals for research and creative activity, travel, or publication awards.
- 2. Discussion of membership on the Committee. A recommendation was subsequently made to the Senate to increase membership to give more equitable representation across campus and was approved by the Senate on March 4, 2004.
- 3. The Committee website was updated and maintained by ORPD staff.

FUNDS

During the first nine months of the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the Senate Scholarly Activities Committee awarded \$99,764.48 to 89 faculty members in 42 departments. Awards were made as follows: \$40,000 for New Faculty Scholar awards, \$1000 for Publication, \$24,509 for Research and Creative Activity, and \$34,298 for travel (additional funds will be awarded for travel in May 2004). The Committee received a supplemental award of \$50,000 from the Vice President for Research, additional funds were provided by the Office of Research and Program Development, and several awards or portions of awards were returned to the Committee; thus, award amounts exceeded those of previous years.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

- New Faculty Scholar Awards (\$5,000) were given to: Matthew N. Cavalli (Mechanical Engineering), Ewan Delbridge (Chemistry), Rodney S. Hanley (Earth Systems Science Institute), Anne A. Kelsch (History), Jun Liu (Computer Science), Marcia L. Mikulak (Anthropology), Elizabeth A. Scharf (Anthropology), and Marcellin Zahui (Mechanical Engineering)/David J. Delene (Atmospheric Sciences). This represents an increased number of awards from past years (from 3 to 8) as the Committee has found additional funding.
- Professors James W. Hikins (School of Communication) and Glenda N. Lindseth (Nursing) represented the Senate Scholarly Activities Committee in the selection of recipients of the Fellows of the University Award for Departmental Excellence in Research and the UND Foundation Thomas J. Clifford Faculty Achievement Award for Excellence in Research for 2004.
- 3. The Committee reviewed and approved Policies for the Use of Indirect Rebate Funds for the School of Medicine and Health Sciences Southwest Campus, the Department of Surgery, and the Center for Innovation. A revised policy for the School of Communication will be reviewed at the May meeting.
- 4. The SSAC chair was designated as a representative for the Committee on the University Research Council.

Report of the University Senate Fiscal Year 2004 Faculty Research Seed Money Council April 29, 2004

The goal of the Faculty Research Seed Money Council is to increase the amount of creative and scholarly activity on the University campus. Outcomes from this process involve external proposal submission and its subsequent economic development, as well as improving the quality of research, creative activities, and educational opportunities for faculty and students. To this end, the Senate and administration have informational needs with regards to the program's activities and success. During the fiscal year of 2004, the council has hosted two cycles of seed money proposal submissions, selection, and awarding of funds.

In November 2003, the representatives of the Faculty Research Seed Money Council met for final proposal selections and distribution of available funds for fall semester. The members present at that meeting included:

The Seed Money announcement for the fall semester received 35 proposals requesting \$1,051,212.48 in funding. The committee selected sixteen proposals, for a total of \$417,503. Funding for awards was provided through UND Office of Research (\$300,000), the Grand Forks City Council (\$100,000) and awards that were returned from previous winners (approximately \$20,000). A listing of these awards is included as an addendum of this report.

For the spring semester, eight subcommittees received 47 proposals requesting over \$1,552,000 in funding. Current funding levels are being determined at the time of this report, but a minimum of \$315,000 has been made available through UND Office of Research. Additional funding requests for this cycle (through the Grand Forks City Council) are in progress. The committee is in the process of making final selections and will make announcements of award winners when funding requests are completed.

Overall program evaluation

Interest in the program has continued to grow with the number of applications growing from 25 in the spring of 2003, to 35 in the fall of 2003, and now 47 in spring semester

2004. Funding requests have nearly doubled from\$1,314,000 in Fiscal year 2003 to \$2,603,000 for fiscal year 2004.

Since the Faculty Research Seed Money project's inception, \$2.4 million in funds have been disbursed to nearly 100 different research groups. As of November 2003, 85 proposals have been submitted to external agencies requesting over \$30 million in funding. In a report to the Grand Forks City Council in December 2003, we reported the Office of Research and Program Development documents showed current and committed external funding amounts to \$8.28 million. Our own report projected that \$4.6 million would be used in salary support of faculty and staff. Data that is not included in this summary is also important to consider, such as scholarly presentations, graduate student educational experiences, or creation of new ideas.

- (1) Whereas the State Board of Higher Education (SBHE) has decided to defer the payment of wages to many University of North Dakota employees from July 1-15, 2004 and other time periods during the new fiscal year; and
- (2) Whereas this plan is being implemented for the convenience of a computer software package and to facilitate the changeover to a new payroll system ("PeopleSoft"); and
- (3) Whereas a member of the SBHE has gone on record as insisting this will be "a positive change" for the University of North Dakota, as reported in the Jan. 30, 2004 issue of <u>The Dakota Student</u>; and
- (4) Whereas a member of the SBHE has gone on record as expressing a concern about the expense of adjusting the software to accommodate the current UND payroll schedule, rather than recognize the hardship of those employees deprived of 15 days of their wages at the time they are earned; and
- (5) Whereas as reported in January 30, 2004 issue of <u>The Dakota Student</u>, a member of the SBHE has gone on record stating that the software can be configured to accommodate the University's current payroll schedule, however it is an "off-the-shelf model" and any customizing "would add great cost" to its implementation; and
- (6) Whereas a 15-day "pay lag" is recognized by all those affected who will not receive their pay until they retire or otherwise leave their current job, as equivalent to not receiving wages or salary for 15 days of work, that is, a "pay reduction"; and
- (7) Whereas an option to be allowed to borrow salaries as a no-interest loan, which then must be paid back in full over the course of the following 9 or 11 months is in no way equivalent to actually being paid salary or wages when they are earned;
- (8) **Be it therefore resolved** that the UND University Senate does not concur with the SBHE in its judgment that the payroll software system should be implemented at the expense of, and delayed payment of wages to, those affected University of North Dakota employees at the time these wages are earned; and
- (9) **Be it further resolved** that the SBHE plan to deprive UND employees of the timely payment of 15 days salary or wages is entirely unacceptable as a fair business practice; and
- (10) **Be it further resolved** that UND's University Senate, on behalf of all employees at this institution, urges in the very strongest way that the SBHE work to replace this unacceptable financial burden on UND employees, with a more acceptable plan that does not impose so difficult a hardship on workers here and elsewhere in the state, many of whom will not easily, or perhaps not at all, be able to manage their financial commitments if the University does not pay them for the work they do on its regular schedule.

University Senate Resolution on Council of College Faculties Compensation Report

Whereas the Council of College Faculties released its report on employee compensation to the State Board of Higher Education on April 15th which called upon the State Board of Higher Education to support the following recommendations:

- The State continue to fund 100 percent of employee health insurance premiums with no changes in deductibles or co-payments.
- At a minimum, provide a salary adjustment based on the annual change in the Consumer Price Index that allows faculty and staff to maintain purchasing power and an additional market maintenance adjustment that prevents NDUS salaries from falling further behind the market, and that the a total combined increase of at least 4.2 percent for each year of the 2005-07 biennium be recommended.
- That the College Council of Faculties convene a task force, with the help and membership of appropriate partners, to determine by December 2004 the feasibility, cost, and possible mechanisms of bringing salaries to 85% of regional averages within the next six years, and within 95% of regional averages by 2017, as is consistent with the NDUS strategic plan, and

Whereas the CCF Compensation Report cited a number of causes for concern including:

- In 2002, 67 percent of staff and 55 percent of faculty leaving the NDUS have had less than five years of experience. In 2002, over 50 percent of departing employees reported that low salary greatly influenced or somewhat influenced their decision to leave the NDUS.
- In 2002-03, nearly one-half of all faculty and over one-third of staff were age 50 or over. Twelve percent and 5 percent, respectively, were over the age of 60. The NDUS will have a significant number of faculty and staff positions to fill over the next ten years.
- ND Standard of Living Index continues to rank below the regional average. The real purchasing power of NDUS wages remains below the average real purchasing power for the region.
- To increase faculty salaries to regional average, one-time increases of between 22.3 percent and 29.2 percent would be needed. To increase staff salaries to market averages, one-time average increases of between 4.1 percent and 23.2 percent would be needed. ND's average faculty and staff salaries have not kept pace with and continue to be well below their respective market averages.
- ND ranks 8th in the 12-state region in the value of total benefits provided. The value of our benefit package is slightly below the average for our region and while it is an important recruitment and retention tool, it does not offset the salary differential, and


Whereas, the State Board of Higher Education, following the recommendations of its Budget and Finance Committee, but against the strong objections of the non-voting faculty member from the Council of College Faculties, proposed a 3% increase in the needs-based budget, instead of the 4.2% increase contained in the Compensation Report, that it must submit to the Office of Management and Budget, and

Whereas, the Economic Development Roundtable emphasized the central importance of Educational Excellence and the State Board of Higher Education has repeatedly emphasized that faculty are central to the mission of positioning the North Dakota University System as a vital link to the state's future, and

Whereas, the University Senate is disappointed that the State Board of Higher Education did not endorse the 4.2% salary increase recommendation in the Council of College Faculties Compensation Report

Be it therefore resolved:

- That the University Senate of the University of North Dakota affirms the recommendations contained in the Council of College Faculties Compensation Report,
- That it strongly urges the State Board of Higher Education to reconsider its recommendation, and
- That it requests the State Board of Higher Education to join with the Council of College Faculties and university and faculty senates across the state in both raising awareness of the gap between state and regional faculty salaries and in actively pursuing reasonable remedies for the worsening problem.

In response to concerns raised at the past Senate meeting, I am submitting a revision of the policy on faculty study that was approved. A copy has been forwarded to the Registrar for consideration by the Senate Executive Committee. Pending action by the Senate Executive Committee, I am asking that the revised policy be placed on the agenda of the next Senate meeting.

11.2.1 Faculty Study

A faculty member at any rank may take course work toward a degree at the University if he or she has the approval of the dean of his or her college. Members of the Graduate Faculty must also obtain approval of the Graduate Dean. Upon enrollment in a graduate program, their graduate faculty membership and any faculty rank or role in the department or departments in which the course work is being taken, will be suspended. The suspended faculty rank and role, including Graduate Faculty membership, will be automatically reinstated upon completion of the graduate degree or departure from the degree program. Any member of the faculty may, with the approval of the dean and of the instructors concerned, take courses for credit as non-degree seeking students without changing his or her graduate faculty status. Arrangements to audit classes or to take courses for credit are made through the Graduate School and/or the Registrar's office.

Re: Expanded Course Description Pilot Study results

Method: Several departments and faculty were contacted and asked to participate. The Dept. of Antropology & Archeology, Dept. Nutrition & Dietetics, Mathematics, Professors Munski and Kenney agreed. Each was provided a sample of an expanded course description and a list of questions and answers to use in developing their course and faculty descriptions; these were sent to CILT and staff posted them on a static web page as well as on Blackboard. CILT staff also posted the student survey and instructions for accessing the descriptions. Participating departments and faculty were asked to complete a short survey. Results for both are summarized.

Department/faculty survey results

- Average time to prepare 1 course description: 10- 20 min (1 dept); 21- 30 min (1 dept); 31-40 minutes (1)
- Average time to prepare faculty description: < 10 minutes (1 dept); 10-20 minutes (2)
- Likeliness to develop course descriptions for all courses if implemented campuswide: likely/very likely (2 dept.); unlikely (1)
- Why unlikely to develop for all courses: lack expertise to develop web pages, difficult to keep descriptions current, department lacks financial and technical resources
- If required to develop expanded course descriptions for all courses, what would be needed to develop and maintain descriptions: additional computer technological support (1), education on developing web sites (2 dept.; 1 individual).
- Likeliness to develop faculty descriptions: likely/very likely (2 dept.); unsure (1 individual)

Actions taken: The committee revised the harassment policies by proceeding point by point through the recommendation document presented to the Senate during Spring 2003. The committee solicited and accepted input from the entire UND community and examined lower-level policies across campus.

Based on all the above, committee members agreed to several changes in the policy. A copy of the revised policy will be given to the President and his Cabinet, after which it will be sent to the Office of Civil Rights for a review of the policy which may take a couple of months, so there will be no end product for the Senate to review until the fall semester.

An explanatory sheet about Harassment procedures will be developed by the Office of General Counsel at a later date.

The committee thanks the Senate for the opportunity to serve and be involved in this important project. Should further revisions be necessary, we would be happy to reconvene.

While the committee has completed the review and revision of the policy they would like to make several recommendations to the Senate which seemed beyond the predefined scope of this committee.

Suggestions: Perhaps others could develop a flow chart to illustrate the flow of the typical process.

Senate should form a committee to examine and encourage the possibility of uniform reporting by the various entities across campus (not just Harr. Policy but Faculty Grievance, etc.) so these numbers can be shared while protecting individual rights. This awareness should make people more comfortable about making complaints if they have one and help the community develop faith in the system.

Throughout the period of time this committee has been meeting, members have perceived a campus wide "them vs. us" or "administration vs. others" divide, reflected in the grievance process. The committee has attempted however, to make the policy as fair and effective as possible, and Senate is encouraged to address the perception issue separately. Addressing the perception is essential to assuring the UND community that conflict of interest concerns are minimized, and everyone has access to fair and impartial conduits for reporting harassment.

The committee further recommends that the Senate provide Faculty Handbook orientation sessions and/or models for mentoring processes, in an effort to encourage awareness of professional responsibilities and expectations. This would assist the university community in dealing more effectively with conflict, avoiding harassment, and maintaining a positive environment.
