Student Union Prepares for Big Expansion

The Memorial Student Union at the University of North Dakota begins closing down its facilities on Feb. 1 to make way for the \$1.2 million construction and renovation project. Completion data for the project, including the new addition, is September 1964.

Full scale evacuation begins about April 1 but the ballroom and cafeteria will remain open until at least May 1, said Craig Millar, Union director. The building and moving schedule is arranged to coincide with the opening of Princeton Hall, a new men's dormitory opened on Feb. 1. The Union is taking advantage of the food service and meeting space in Princeton and other dormitories, said Millar.

The four-story addition to the east side of the existing building will more than double present space. Renovation will change most of the east side of the existing building, he said. The first areas to be closed down will be the front entrance, the Red River Room and information booth, followed by the basement game room.

Establish New Law Scholarship

Lyman A. Brink, '34, and his law partner, Dennis M. Sobolik, '59, have established a new law scholarship at UND. It carries a \$200 stipend, and will be awarded annually to a deserving law student selected by the Law School Scholarship committee. Brink and Sobolik are law partners at Hallock, Minn.

The committee will be split into smaller sections, each assigned to visit one of the University's ten academic divisions. These visits are scheduled for the morning of April 16. The purpose of these visits is to provide committee members with the opportunity to talk with the division dean and his faculty in order to learn "first hand" what the division is doing and what problems it faces, Stone explained.

"This committee is a good example of how our alumni help and support the University, and of the faith they have in its future," said UND President George W. Starcher.

A similar "Committee of 50" met at the University in 1962 to analyze the needs of UND during the next decade. "Members of the 1963 North Dakota Legislature expressed appreciation to this committee for the excellent report it submitted to the University and the State Board of Higher Education," Stone said.

Development Fund Records Growth

Hundreds of loyal UND Alumni made 1963 a year of great progress for the University and the Development Fund, with contributions and gifts passing the \$114,000 figure, according to J. Lloyd Stone, executive vice president of the association. This total includes land contributions and the gift of the Carillons.

Fred Dezotell died Dec. 24 at Grand Forks, N. D. He was familiar to students and the University of North Dakota community as building manager of the UND Memorial Student Union. He was employed at the Union from 1950 to 1960, when illness forced him to discontinue his work.

Myrtle G. Halvorson, '15, passed away November 26, 1963. She was a member of Kappa Alpha Theta Sorority and had maintained a high interest in UND since her graduation. She resided in Floral Park, New York, with her husband, Harold L. Wilson.

Walter W. Athey, a student at UND from 1919 to 1921, passed away of a heart attack at Ritzville, Washington at the age of 66 on December 18. He was county engineer of Adams county at Ritzville for 25 years, is survived by his wife, a son and a daughter.

Esther B. Ray, '04, died in December, 1963. She was formerly from Fosston, Minnesota and at the time of her death, had been living in Seattle, Washington.

Lt. Col. Grant N. Nelson died suddenly on January 14 while playing golf on the New Mexico Military Institute course. Death was attributed to a heart attack. A 1925 graduate of UND, Col. Nelson came to New Mexico Military Institute in 1943 and was an instructor in chemistry, associate professor of natural sciences, and director of the Audio-Visual department at that school. He was 61 years old at the time of his death, and an outstanding leader in community and civic affairs in Roswell, New Mexico. He is survived by his wife and a son.

John E. Bryans Sr., died at the age of 83 in San Diego, California. A retired lawyer and former North Dakota district attorney and mayor, Bryans had lived in California for the past 34 years. He was district attorney of Renville county for 16 years, and mayor in Mohall. He is survived by his wife, five sons, five brothers and five sisters.

Mrs. Katherine Gue Leonard died at the age of 91 on December 4 at La Jolla, California. Her husband, Dr. Arthur G. Leonard, a research geologist and former North Dakota state geologist, died in 1931. Mrs. Leonard was one of the original patronesses of Kappa Alpha Theta and UND and she and her husband were keenly interested in the welfare of UND students. Mrs. Leonard had left a short, dignified obituary, written in her own handwriting, with blanks for the date of death and age.

Herbert A. Mackoff, a Dickinson lawyer from 1919 to 1959 and president of the North Dakota Bar Association, died at the age of 75 in Miami Beach, Florida. He was a member of the firm of Mackoff, Kellogg, Muggli and Kirby in Dickinson. He received his law degree from UND in 1912, is survived by his wife, two daughters and two sisters.

Josephine L. Olson, '29, passed away October 21, 1963. She had been employed as an Art and Crafts Instructor in the Florida State School for the Deaf and Blind at St. Augustine, Florida. She was a Phi Beta Kappa and a member of Delta Phi Delta Honorary Art Fraternity.

McManus, consultant theologian to the II Vatican Council, spoke at a Newman Forum during January. Fr. McManus is professor of Canon Law at Catholic University, Washington, D. C.

Five Year Research Grant: an expanded program of research training in microbiology at UND will result from a five-year grant of \$115,000 awarded the University by the National Institutes of Health.

A \$200 scholarship has been established at the University of North Dakota by Mrs. Charles Pollock of Fargo and the alumni of Phi Delta Theta social fraternity. The D. Bruce McDonald—Phi Delta Theta Scholarship, to be awarded annually to a junior male student at UND, is the outgrowth of a fund established last year by Mrs. Pollock. She is the former Mrs. Bruce McDonald of Devils Lake.

McDonald, who graduated from the UND Law School in 1913, was the first student to be initiated into the University's chapter of Phi Delta Theta. He was county judge in Ramsey County at the time of his death in 1953.

The scholarship will be awarded annually and the recipient will receive \$100 each semester of the academic year. It will be awarded on the basis

of need, leadership qualities and scholastic ability. The recipient must be a member of a fraternity. Money for the scholarship will come from interest on a principal investment of Mrs. Pollock and contributions from Phi Delta Theta Alumni.

"It is the hope of Phi Delta Theta alumni to increase this amount to make an even larger scholarship available in future years," said Ted Maragos 1955 of Minot, who is representing the fraternity's alumni.

Grove, Ill., which recently merged with International Telephone and Telegraph Co. He is vice-president in charge of sales and a member of the board of directors.

In making the award Meeg said, "I am pleased that I am able to contribute to the fine work that is being done at the University of North Dakota."

The Skulason Scholarship was established and supported for many years by Bardi Skulason, Portland, Ore., who graduated from UND in 1895. For several years the scholarship was provided by the late Albert Kegan of Chicago, 1930 alumnus and the second Skulason Scholar.

The last Skulason Scholarship was awarded to Francia Luessen of Valley City in 1960.

Mrs. Meeg is the former Jean Morrow, formerly from Erie, and a graduate of the University of Montana. They have one daughter, Janice, a graduate of Northwestern University.
