



The UND School of Law

Founded in 1899, the School of Law is among the oldest degree-granting units of the University of North Dakota. It was the first of UND's professional schools to begin operations. Its first dean was Guy H. Corliss, who had served as the

first Chief Justice of the North Dakota Supreme Court.

Until it was moved to the campus during World War I, the School of Law was located in downtown Grand Forks. Despite its meager resources, the School grew quickly in popularity. The occupation had considerable prestige, and there was much demand for lawyers in the new state. In his history of UND, University of the Northern Plains, Louis Geiger observed that "perhaps no other college paid off so quickly in broadening the University's influences in North Dakota."

Since 1911, the School of Law has been a member of the Association of American Law Schools. The School of Law was approved in 1923, by the American Bar Association's Section of Legal Education

and Admission to the bar and has been continuously reaccredited since. Today, the school has an enrollment of 250 students from across the United States and around the world.

The Honorable Ralph R. Erickson

Commencement Speaker

One of two active U.S. District Judges in North Dakota, Ralph Erickson earned his undergraduate degree from Jamestown College and his J.D. from the University of North Dakota School of Law in 1984.

Following his graduation from Law School, Judge Erickson was in the private practice of law in West Fargo with a broad general trial practice.

Prior to his appointment to the federal bench Erickson served as a state district judge, a judge of the county court, and a county court magistrate. While on the state bench he presided over civil, criminal and juvenile matters. He was the first judge of the Juvenile Drug Court in the East Central Judicial District.

Erickson serves as a member of the 8th Circuit Judicial Council and is a member of the Defender Services Committee (CJA), Chair of the Jury System Committee, Pattern Jury Instruction Committee, and the Tribal Court Committee. He is a member of the State Bar Association of North Dakota, the Cass County (ND) Bar Association, and the Ronald N. Davies Inn of Court.

He and his wife Michele currently reside in Fargo, ND and have two school aged daughters.






