

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine & Health Sciences, founded in 1905, was a two-year school of basic medical science until 1973, when the North Dakota Legislature approved initiation of a four-year curriculum leading to the Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree. The school offers a statewide, university-based, community-integrated medical education program which places an emphasis on primary care. Practicing physicians, constituting the majority of the faculty, educate medical students in clinics and hospitals throughout the state.

The mission of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine & Health Sciences is to educate and prepare North Dakota residents as physicians, medical scientists and other health professionals for service to the people of North Dakota and the nation, and to advance medical knowledge through research. Through its federally funded Indians Into Medicine (INMED) Program, the school also seeks to address disparities in access to health care by educating American Indians as physicians and other health professionals.

The first two years of medical education are provided at the UND campus in Grand Forks. The third year is completed in hospitals in Fargo, Grand Forks, and Bismarck, and the fourth year consists of clinical rotations at Grand Forks, Minot, Bismarck and Fargo. Students may elect to take the majority of their third year in rural communities through a program called ROME, Rural Opportunities in Medical Education. Medical students also have the opportunity to experience training in other parts of the country and the world during fourth-year electives. Postgraduate residency training in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery, and psychiatry, as well as a one-year transitional program, is conducted in the state's four major cities.

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine & Health Sciences offers a combined MD/PhD program in which students pursue a terminal degree in one of the basic science disciplines while earning the doctor of medicine degree. Students who pursue the MD/PhD degree devote six or seven years to this goal and are usually interested in careers in research as they relate to the practice of medicine.

In addition to the medical education program, the school offers graduate study in clinical laboratory science, occupational therapy, physical therapy, and physician assistant studies, as well as in the basic sciences: anatomy and cell biology; biochemistry and molecular biology; microbiology and immunology; and pharmacology, physiology and therapeutics. Undergraduate study is offered in cytotechnology, athletic training, and clinical laboratory science.

Even under duress, I will not use my knowledge or my skills against humanity.

I will acknowledge my limitations and my mistakes so that I may learn from them.

To uphold these responsibilities, I will maintain my own well-being and the well-being of those close to me.

I will promote the integrity of the practice of Medicine.

In the tradition of my profession,

I honor all who teach me this Art.

Through honest and respectful collaboration with my colleagues,

I will uphold the highest standards in the service of patients.

I will seek new knowledge, reexamine ideas and practices of the past, and teach what I have learned.

Above all, the health of my patients will be my first concern. This Oath I take freely and upon my honor.

# Keynote Speaker



Rod J. Rohrich, MD, FACS

Rod J. Rohrich, MD, FACS, is professor and chair of the Department of Plastic Surgery at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas. Dr. Rohrich, a native North Dakotan, is certified by the American Board of Plastic Surgery. He completed undergraduate and postgraduate education at North Dakota State University and the University of North Dakota and received his medical degree from Baylor University College of Medicine, all with high honors. He also trained at the University of Michigan Medical Center, Oxford University, and Massachusetts General Hospital/Harvard Medical School.

Dr. Rohrich is a member of several top professional organizations, including the American Association of Plastic Surgeons and is a founding member of the Board of Governors of the National Endowment for Plastic Surgery; he's also president of the Association of Academic Chairmen of Plastic Surgery.

Dr. Rohrich was on the board of directors of the March of Dimes and the American Cancer Society Dallas chapter, among many others, and he is a founding member of the Dallas for Children Foundation, which assists in early childhood development programs for underprivileged children. Dr. Rohrich and his wife, Dr. Diane L. Gibby, have been Honorary Co-chairs of the Dallas for Children Foundation. Through the Rod J. Rohrich, MD Foundation, Dr. Rohrich annually supports a medical student who will practice primary care in North Dakota. He has performed and taught plastic surgery in Third World countries.

He holds a patent on a breast implant, has developed educational models for bringing emerging technology to plastic surgeons, and is editor-in-chief of *Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery*. Dr. Rohrich has been named among the Best Doctors in Dallas since 2000, Super Doctors in Texas since 2005, Best Doctors in America since 1996, Who's Who in America since 1993, Best Doctors in America by Good Housekeeping Magazine and named a Notable North Dakotan in 1998. Dr. Rohrich received in 2006 an honorary doctorate from the University of North Dakota. The Rohrichs have two children.


