



The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences, founded in 1905, was a two-year school of basic medical science until 1973, when the North Dakota Legislature approved initiation of a four-year curriculum leading to the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree. The school offers a statewide, university-based, community-integrated medical education program which places an emphasis on primary care. Practicing physicians, constituting the majority of the faculty, educate medical students in clinics and hospitals throughout the state.

The mission of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences is to educate and prepare North Dakota residents as physicians, medical scientists, and other health professionals for service to the people of North Dakota and the nation, and to advance medical knowledge through research. Through its federally funded Indians Into Medicine (INMED) Program, the school also seeks to address disparities in access to health care by educating American Indians as physicians and other health professionals.

The first two years of medical education are provided at the UND campus in Grand Forks. The third year is completed in hospitals in Fargo, Grand Forks, and Bismarck, and the fourth year consists of clinical rotations at Grand Forks, Minot, Bismarck and Fargo. Students may elect to take the majority of their third year in rural communities through a program called ROME, Rural Opportunities in Medical Education. Medical students also have the opportunity to experience training in other parts of the country and the world during fourth-year electives. Postgraduate residency training in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery and psychiatry, as well as a one-year transitional program, is conducted in the state's four major cities.

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences offers a combined M.D./Ph.D. program in which students pursue a terminal degree in a basic science discipline while earning the doctor of medicine degree. Students who pursue the M.D./Ph.D. degree devote six or seven years to this goal and are usually interested in careers in research as they relate to the practice of medicine.

In addition to the medical education program, the school offers graduate study in clinical laboratory science, occupational therapy, physical therapy, and physician assistant studies, as well as in the basic sciences: anatomy and cell biology; biochemistry and molecular biology; microbiology and immunology; and pharmacology, physiology and therapeutics. Undergraduate study is offered in athletic training, clinical laboratory science and cytotechnology.

Keynote Speaker

Stephen J. Tinguely, M.D., is associate professor and chairman of the Department of Pediatrics at the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences. Board-certified in pediatrics, he practices general pediatrics at MeritCare Clinic Southwest and is a member of the attending staff at MeritCare Children's Hospital in Fargo.

He grew up in Casselton, ND, and attended St. John's University in Collegeville, MN, where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1974. He earned the Doctor of Medicine degree from the University of North Dakota School of Medicine in 1978 and took general pediatrics residency training at the Mayo Graduate School of Medicine in Rochester, MN. As a medical student and pediatric resident, he received several awards including the Pediatric Travel Award and was named senior resident associate at the Mayo Graduate School of Medicine in 1980.

Dr. Tinguely serves on the MeritCare Infection Control Committee, the Children's Hospital Bioethics Committee and the Graduate Medical Education Committee. He is associate director of the Cystic Fibrosis Program and director of Pediatric Advanced Life Support at MeritCare Children's Hospital.

At the UND medical school, he has served on the faculty since 1982 and as chairman of pediatrics since 2001 when he also became a member of the school's Faculty Academic Council and Medical Curriculum Committee. He serves on several other committees devoted to curriculum, clinical education and student assessment. Numerous organizations and task forces that are dedicated to the care of children have benefited from his leadership and expertise.

During his career, Dr. Tinguely has received many awards and honors for outstanding teaching and service, including the Outstanding Pediatric Teacher Award in 1992. He has served as president and board member of the North Dakota Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), which received the Award of Chapter Excellence in 1997 and 1998, during his tenure as president. He was inducted into the Alpha Omega Alpha honor society in medicine in 2003.
