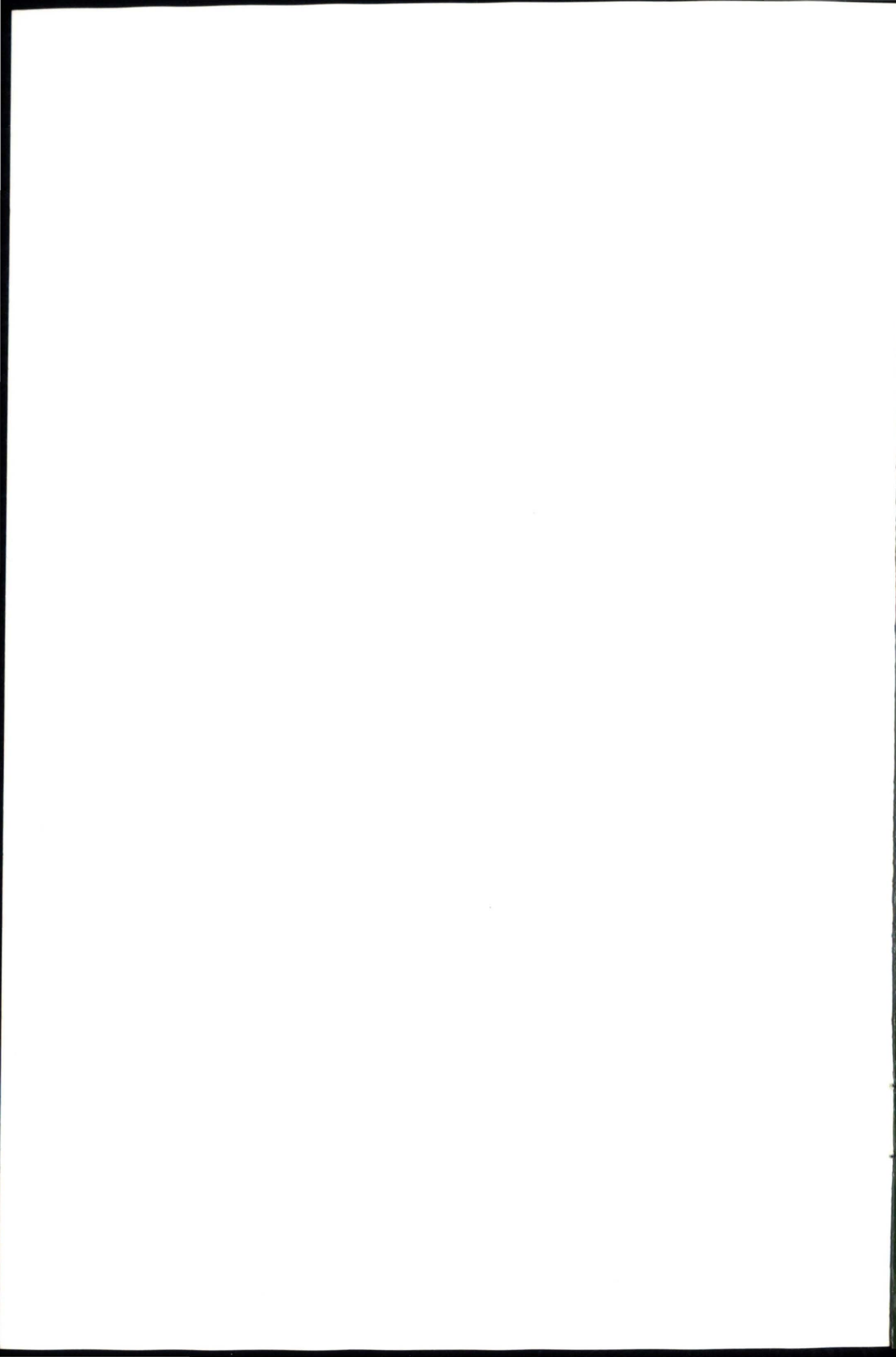

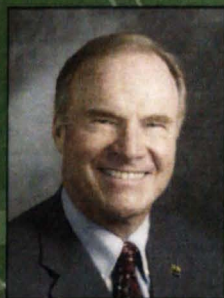

History

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences, founded in 1905, was a two-year school of basic medical science until 1973, when the North Dakota Legislature approved initiation of a four-year curriculum leading to the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree. The School offers a statewide, university-based, community-integrated medical education program that places an emphasis on primary care. Practicing physicians, constituting the majority of the faculty, educate medical students in clinics and hospitals throughout the state.

The primary purpose of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences is to educate physicians, medical scientists and other health professionals, and to enhance the quality of life in North Dakota. Through its federally funded Indians Into Medicine (INMED) Program, the School also seeks to address disparities in access to health care by educating American Indians as physicians and other health professionals.

The first two years of medical education are provided at the UND campus in Grand Forks. The third year is completed in hospitals in Fargo, Grand Forks and Bismarck, and the fourth year consists of clinical rotations at Grand Forks, Minot, Bismarck and Fargo. All students have exposure to rural medicine, and some elect to take the majority of their third year in rural communities through our Rural Opportunities in Medical Education (ROME) program. Medical students also have the opportunity to experience training in other parts of the country and the world during their fourth-year electives. Postgraduate residency training in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery and psychiatry, as well as a one-year transitional program, is conducted in the state's four major cities.

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences offers a combined M.D./Ph.D. program in which students pursue a terminal degree in one of the basic science disciplines while earning the doctor of medicine degree. Students who pursue the M.D./Ph.D. degree devote six or seven years to this goal and are usually interested in careers in medical research.

In addition to the medical education program, the School offers graduate study in clinical laboratory science, occupational therapy, physical therapy and physician assistant studies, as well as in the basic sciences: anatomy and cell biology; biochemistry and molecular biology; microbiology and immunology; and pharmacology, physiology and therapeutics. Undergraduate study is offered in cytotechnology, athletic training, sports medicine and clinical laboratory science.

Even under duress, I will not use my knowledge or my skills
against humanity.

I will acknowledge my limitations and my mistakes so that I
may learn from them.

To uphold these responsibilities, I will maintain my own
well-being and the well-being of those close to me.

I will promote the integrity of the practice of medicine.

In the tradition of my profession, I honor all who teach me
this art.

Through honest and respectful collaboration with my
colleagues, I will uphold the highest standards in the
service of patients.

I will seek new knowledge, reexamine ideas and practices of
the past, and teach what I have learned.

Above all, the health of my patients will be my first concern.

Keynote Speaker



Earl Pomeroy, JD, a native of Valley City, N.D., is an attorney with the Alston + Bird law firm in Washington, D.C. He is senior counsel with the firm's health policy group, advising clients on legislative and regulatory issues that affect health care delivery.

Pomeroy focused on health policy issues in 30 years of service in elected office in North Dakota, serving as state legislator, insurance commissioner, and for nine terms as the state's only representative in the United States Congress. In each of the positions he held, Pomeroy was a leader in a variety of health initiatives whose aim was to expand the availability of health insurance for the families of our state and nation.

Pomeroy attended Valley City State University before transferring to UND, where he earned a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. He went on to do graduate research in legal history at Durham University in England. Pomeroy received a Juris Doctorate from UND in 1979 and practiced law in Valley City for five years before embarking on his political career.

At the spring commencement on May 14, 2011, Pomeroy's alma mater bestowed him with an honorary Doctor of Letters degree. He joined the prestigious ranks of UND's honorary doctorates, including President John F. Kennedy, famed heart surgeon Michael DeBakey, philosopher Mortimer Adler, and basketball legend and UND alumnus Phil Jackson.
