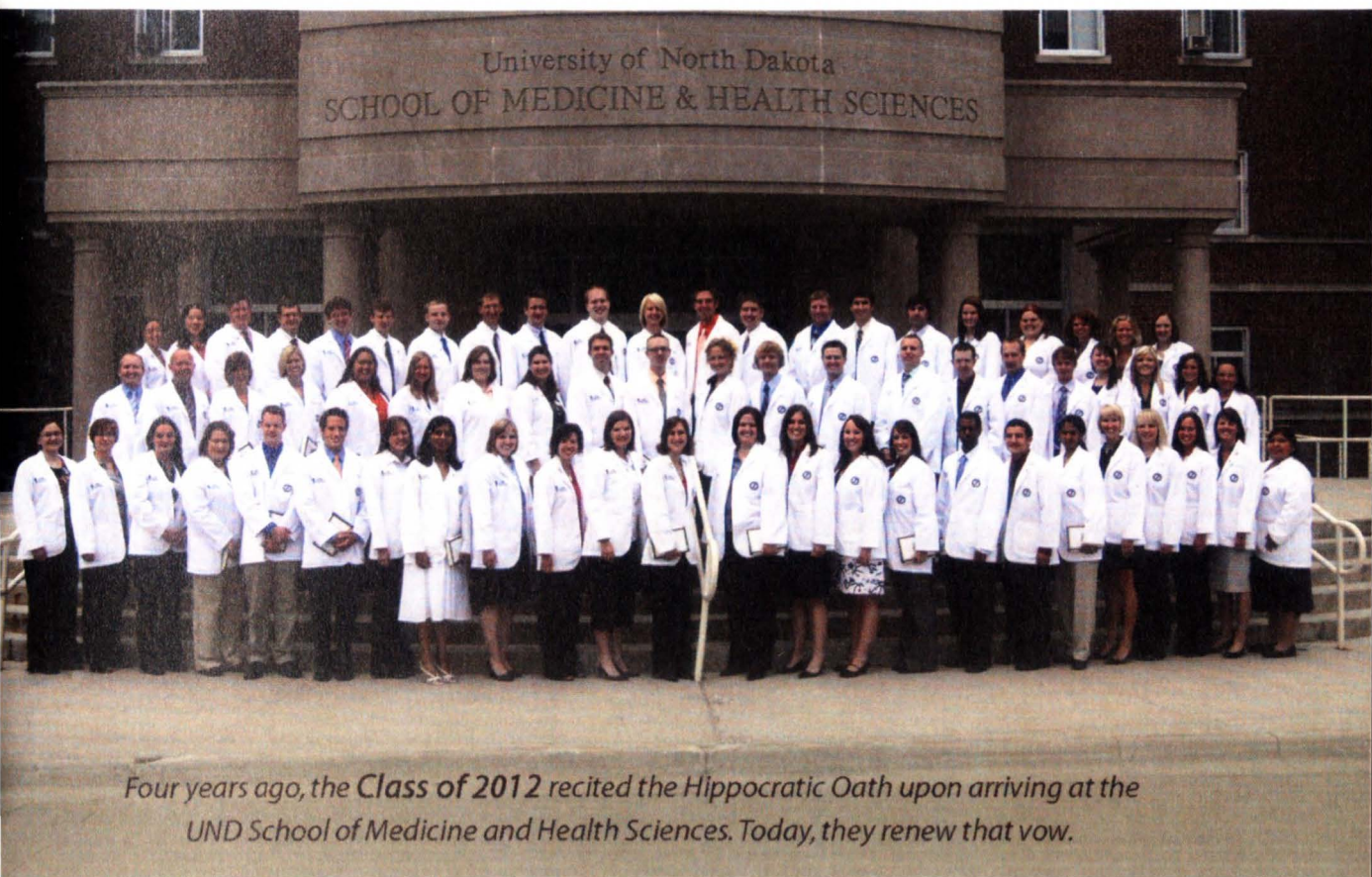

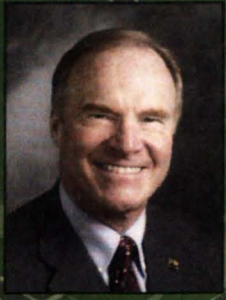

## History

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences, founded in 1905, was a two-year school of basic medical science until 1973, when the North Dakota Legislature approved initiation of a four-year curriculum leading to the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree. The School offers a statewide, university-based, community-integrated medical education program that places an emphasis on primary care. Practicing physicians, constituting the majority of the faculty, educate medical students in clinics and hospitals throughout the state.

The primary purpose of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences is to educate physicians, medical scientists and other health professionals, and to enhance the quality of life in North Dakota. Through its federally funded Indians Into Medicine (INMED) Program, the School also seeks to address disparities in access to health care by educating American Indians as physicians and other health professionals.

The first two years of medical education are provided at the UND campus in Grand Forks. The third year is completed in hospitals in Fargo, Grand Forks and Bismarck, and the fourth year consists of clinical rotations at Grand Forks, Minot, Bismarck and Fargo. All students have exposure to rural medicine, and some elect to take the majority of their third year in rural communities through our Rural Opportunities in Medical Education (ROME) program. Medical students also have the opportunity to experience training in other parts of the country and the world during their fourth-year electives. Postgraduate residency training in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery and psychiatry, as well as a one-year transitional program, is conducted in the state's four major cities.

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences offers a combined M.D./Ph.D. program in which students pursue a terminal degree in one of the basic science disciplines while earning the doctor of medicine degree. Students who pursue the M.D./Ph.D. degree devote six or seven years to this goal and are usually interested in careers in medical research.

In addition to the medical education program, the School offers graduate study in medical laboratory science, occupational therapy, physical therapy and physician assistant studies, as well as in the basic sciences: anatomy and cell biology; biochemistry and molecular biology; microbiology and immunology; and pharmacology, physiology and therapeutics. Undergraduate study is offered in cytotechnology, athletic training, sports medicine and medical laboratory science.

against humanity.

I will acknowledge my limitations and my mistakes so that I  
may learn from them.

To uphold these responsibilities, I will maintain my own  
well-being and the well-being of those close to me.

I will promote the integrity of the practice of medicine.

In the tradition of my profession, I honor all who teach me  
this art.

Through honest and respectful collaboration with my  
colleagues, I will uphold the highest standards in the  
service of patients.

I will seek new knowledge, reexamine ideas and practices of  
the past, and teach what I have learned.

Above all, the health of my patients will be my first concern.

# Keynote Speaker



Judy L. DeMers, R.N., M.Ed., a Grand Forks native, served as associate dean of student affairs and admissions at the UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences from 1983 through 2010.

She was University of North Dakota valedictorian and graduated summa cum laude with a degree in nursing in 1966. DeMers is both a registered nurse and certified public health nurse who earned an M.Ed. from the University of Washington in 1973.

DeMers joined UND in 1969 as an instructor in public health nursing and was the associate director of, and instructor in, the MEDEX project in the SMHS Department of Family and Community Medicine from 1970 to 1972.

DeMers then spent time as a research associate in the Office of Research and Medical Education at the University of Washington's medical school through 1977 before returning to UND as assistant professor and director of the Family Nurse Practitioner Program, where she served until 1982. She also was director of the UND medical school's Focal Problems Course until 1989, and she served for a year as director of undergraduate medical education in the Department of Family Medicine.

From 1982 through 1983, DeMers was associate director of the SMHS Office of Rural Health and was promoted to associate professor.

She served with distinction in the North Dakota House of Representatives from 1982 to 1992 and the North Dakota Senate from 1992 until 2000.

As a nurse, health educator, and administrator, DeMers has earned several dozen awards and honors, garnering the Beck Award for Nursing in 1965, several Nurse of the Year awards, including the statewide award in 1983, and several listings in *Who's Who in America* and *Who's Who of American Women*. She was named to the North Dakota Nurses Association Hall of Fame in 2002.

In 2009, DeMers received the SMHS Hippocratic Dignity Award. She earned the Outstanding Service Award from the Association of American Medical Colleges Central Group on Student Affairs at the group's national meeting in Austin, Texas, in 2010. In June 2011, the Grand Forks–East Grand Forks Chamber of Commerce recognized DeMers with the Regional Athena Leadership Award, which recognizes exemplary leadership and reflects Plato's adage of "What is honored is cultivated." The North Dakota Women's Network named DeMers Woman of the Year in October 2011.
