


Four years ago, the Class of 2015 recited the Hippocratic Oath upon arriving at the UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences. Today, they renew that vow.

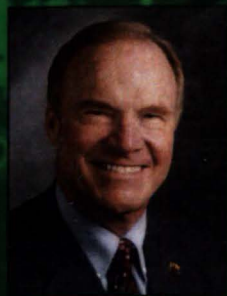

History

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences, founded in 1905, was a two-year school of basic medical science until 1973, when the North Dakota Legislature approved initiation of a four-year curriculum leading to the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree. The School offers a statewide, university-based, community-integrated medical education program that places an emphasis on primary care. Practicing physicians, constituting the majority of the faculty, educate medical students in clinics and hospitals throughout the state.

The primary purpose of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences is to educate physicians, medical scientists and other health professionals, and to enhance the quality of life in North Dakota. Through its federally funded Indians Into Medicine (INMED) Program, the School also seeks to address disparities in access to healthcare by educating American Indians as physicians and other health professionals.

The first two years of medical education are provided at the UND campus in Grand Forks. The third year is completed in hospitals in Fargo, Grand Forks, and Bismarck, and the fourth year consists of clinical rotations at Grand Forks, Minot, Bismarck, and Fargo. Students may elect to take the majority of their third year in rural communities through a program called ROME, Rural Opportunities in Medical Education. Medical students also have the opportunity to experience training in other parts of the country and the world through fourth-year electives. Postgraduate residency training in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery, and psychiatry, as well as a one-year transitional program, is conducted in the state's four major cities.

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences offers a combined M.D./Ph.D. program in which students pursue a terminal degree in one of the basic science disciplines while earning the doctor of medicine degree. Students who pursue the M.D./Ph.D. degree devote six or seven years to this goal and are usually interested in careers in research as they relate to the practice of medicine.

In addition to the medical education program, the School offers graduate study in medical laboratory science, occupational therapy, physical therapy, and physician assistant studies, as well as in the basic sciences: anatomy and cell biology; biochemistry and molecular biology; microbiology and immunology; and pharmacology, physiology and therapeutics. Undergraduate study is offered in athletic training, sports medicine, and medical laboratory science.

Today, in the presence of family, friends, teachers and colleagues,
I dedicate myself to the profession of medicine.

I pledge myself to the service of humanity.

I will use my skills to care for all in need, without bias and
with openness of spirit.

The health of my patients will be my first concern.

I vow to hold sacred the bond between doctor and patient.

I will hold in confidence all that my patients entrust to me.

I will strive to alleviate suffering.

I will respect the dignity and autonomy of my patients
in living and in dying.

As a physician, I recognize my duty to society.

I will work to promote health and prevent disease.

I will advocate for the welfare of my community.

Even under duress, I will not use my knowledge or my skills
against humanity.

I will acknowledge my limitations and my mistakes so that
I may learn from them.

To uphold these responsibilities, I will maintain my own
well-being and the well-being of those close to me.

I will promote the integrity of the practice of medicine.

In the tradition of my profession, I honor all who teach me
this art.

Through honest and respectful collaboration with my
colleagues, I will uphold the highest standards in the
service of patients.

I will seek new knowledge, reexamine ideas and practices of
the past, and teach what I have learned.

Above all, the health of my patients will be my first concern.

This oath I take freely and upon my honor.

Keynote Speaker



Timothy D. Henry, M.D., Director of Cardiology, Cedars-Sinai Medical Center, Professor of Medicine, Cedars-Sinai Medical Center and UCLA, alumnus (BS Med '80)

Timothy D. Henry is an interventional cardiologist, the director of Cardiology at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center in Los Angeles, California, and a professor of medicine at Cedars-Sinai and UCLA. Henry is the former director of Research at the Minneapolis Heart Institute Foundation at Abbott Northwestern Hospital, and professor of medicine at the University of Minnesota. Henry grew up in Westhope, North Dakota, and spent three years at Minot State College before graduating from the University of North Dakota in 1978. He attended UND Medical School for two years before graduating from the University of California, San Francisco in 1982, where he was named to Alpha Omega Alpha, the medical honor society. He was an internal medicine resident and chief medical resident from 1982 to 1986 at the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center. He completed his training as a cardiology fellow, chief cardiology fellow, and interventional cardiology fellow at the University of Minnesota in 1991.

Henry has coauthored over 300 manuscripts and book chapters in prominent peer-reviewed journals, including *Circulation Research*, *Journal of the American College of Cardiology*, *Journal of the American Medical Association*, *Lancet*, *European Heart Journal*, and the *New England Journal of Medicine*. He is a nationally recognized expert in the treatment of patients with refractory angina and acute myocardial infarction. In addition, he is a national leader in cardiovascular stem cell therapy and is a principal investigator of the National Institutes of Health Cardiovascular Cell Therapy Research Network. He is widely sought after as a guest lecturer on both the national and international level.

Henry is a recipient of numerous awards and research grants, including the Innovator Award from the American College of Cardiology, the LUMEN Global Lifetime Achievement Award in Myocardial Infarction, and the Minnesota American Heart Association Heart & Stroke Hero Award in Research. He was named one of the Best Doctors in America (2007-14) and one of Minnesota's 100 Most Influential Health Care Leaders.
