





History

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences, founded in 1905, was a two-year school of basic medical science until 1973, when the North Dakota Legislature approved initiation of a four-year curriculum leading to the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree. The School offers a statewide, university-based, community-integrated medical education program that places an emphasis on primary care. Practicing physicians, constituting the majority of the faculty, educate medical students in clinics and hospitals throughout the state.

The primary purpose of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences is to educate physicians, medical scientists and other health professionals, and to enhance the quality of life in North Dakota. Through its federally funded Indians Into Medicine (INMED) Program, the School also seeks to address disparities in access to health care by educating American Indians as physicians and other health professionals.

The first two years of medical education are provided at the UND campus in Grand Forks. The third year is completed in hospitals in Fargo, Grand Forks and Bismarck, and the fourth year consists of clinical rotations at Grand Forks, Minot, Bismarck and Fargo. All students have exposure to rural medicine, and some elect to take the majority of their third year in rural communities through our Rural Opportunities in Medical Education (ROME) program. Medical students also have the opportunity to experience training in other parts of the country and the world during their fourth-year electives. Postgraduate residency training in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery and psychiatry, as well as a one-year transitional program, is conducted in the state's four major cities.

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences offers a combined M.D./Ph.D. program in which students pursue a terminal degree in one of the basic science disciplines while earning the doctor of medicine degree. Students who pursue the M.D./Ph.D. degree devote six or seven years to this goal and are usually interested in careers in medical research.

In addition to the medical education program, the School offers graduate study in medical laboratory science, occupational therapy, physical therapy and physician assistant studies, as well as in the basic sciences: anatomy and cell biology; biochemistry and molecular biology; microbiology and immunology; and pharmacology, physiology and therapeutics. Undergraduate study is offered in cytotechnology, athletic training, sports medicine and medical laboratory science.

To uphold these responsibilities, I will maintain my own well-being and the well-being of those close to me.


I will promote the integrity of the practice of medicine.

Keynote Speaker

Patrick Carr, Ph.D., associate professor in the Department of Anatomy and Cell Biology at the School of Medicine and Health Sciences will deliver the keynote address titled "Essentials of Career Management." Carr was raised in western Manitoba and completed his undergraduate education at Brandon University and a doctoral degree in physiology at the University of Manitoba. He then completed further training at the University of Manitoba, the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Md., and at Wright State University in Dayton, Ohio. He joined the University of North Dakota in 1998, where he is currently the director of the basic sciences component of the first-year medical curriculum and assistant dean for Faculty Development for the School of Medicine and Health Sciences. Medical students have honored Carr with 14 Instructor Awards. His research has focused on understanding the neurochemistry and neurophysiology of pain and motor control. His teaching responsibilities currently include gross anatomy and neuroscience.
