



History

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Science founded in 1905, was a two-year school of basic medical science until 1973, when the North Dakota Legislature approved initiation of a four-year curriculum leading to the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree. The School offers a statewide, university-based, community-integrated medical education program that places an emphasis on primary care. Practicing physicians, constituting the majority of the faculty, educate medical students in clinics and hospitals throughout the state.

The primary purpose of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences is to educate physicians, medical scientist and other health professionals, and to enhance the quality of life in No Dakota. Through its federally funded Indians Into Medicine (INMED Program, the School also seeks to address disparities in access to healthcare by educating American Indians as physicians and other health professionals.

The first two years of medical education are provided at the UND campus in Grand Forks. The third year is completed in hospitals in Fargo, Grand Forks, and Bismarck, and the fourth year consists of clinical rotations at Grand Forks, Minot, Bismarck, and Fargo. Students may elect to take the majority of their third year in rural communities through a program called ROME, Rural Opportunities in Medical Education. Medical students also have the opportunity to experience training in other parts of the country and the world through fourth-year electives Postgraduate residency training in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery, and psychiatry, as well as a one-year transitional program, is conducted in the state's four major cities.

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences offers a combined M.D./Ph.D. program in which students pursue a terminal degree in one of the basic science disciplines while earning the doctor of medicine degree. Students who pursue the M.D./Ph.D. degree devote six or seven years to this goal and are usually interested in careers in research as they relate to the practice of medicine

In addition to the medical education program, the School offers graduate study in medical laboratory science, occupational therapy, physical therapy, and physician assistant studies, as well as in the basic sciences: anatomy and cell biology; biochemistry and molecular biology microbiology and immunology; and pharmacology, physiology and therapeutics. Undergraduate study is offered in athletic training, sports medicine, and medical laboratory science.



Today, in the presence of family, friends, teachers and colleagues, I dedicate myself to the profession of medicine.

I pledge myself to the service of humanity.

I will use my skills to care for all in need, without bias and with openness of spirit.

The health of my patients will be my first concern.

I vow to hold sacred the bond between doctor and patient.

I will hold in confidence all that my patients entrust to me.

I will strive to alleviate suffering.

I will respect the dignity and autonomy of my patients in living and in dying.

As a physician, I recognize my duty to society.

I will work to promote health and prevent disease.

I will advocate for the welfare of my community.

Even under duress, I will not use my knowledge or my skills against humanity.

I will acknowledge my limitations and my mistakes so that I may learn from them.

To uphold these responsibilities, I will maintain my own well-being and the well-being of those close to me.

I will promote the integrity of the practice of medicine.

In the tradition of my profession, I honor all who teach me this art.

Through honest and respectful collaboration with my colleagues, I will uphold the highest standards in the service of patients.

I will seek new knowledge, reexamine ideas and practices of the past, and teach what I have learned.

Above all, the health of my patients will be my first concern. This oath I take freely and upon my honor.

This contemporary version of the traditional Oath of Hippocrates was composed by the Harvard Medical School Class of 1998.


Claire Pomeroy, M.D., M.B.A., President Albert and Mary Lasker Foundation

Claire Pomeroy is president of the Albert and Mary Lasker Foundation. Serves as chief executive officer of the Foundation and is responsible for overseeing the implementation of programs that advance the Foundation's mission to "foster the prevention and treatment of disease and disability be honoring excellence in basic and clinical science, and through public education and research advocacy."

An expert in infectious diseases, Pomeroy is a longtime advocate for patient especially those with HIV/AIDS, and public health. She passionately suppongoing investment in the full range of research. She continues to lead an active research team studying host responses to viral infections. She has a special interest in healthcare policy, with a focus on the importance of the social determinants of health. She has published more than 100 articles are book chapters and edited three books.

Pomeroy is a member of the Board of Trustees for the Morehouse School of Medicine and serves on the Board of Directors for the Sierra Health Foundat the Foundation for Biomedical Research; and PRIDE Industries. She is cochathe Blue Ridge Academic Health group and serves on the VA National Acade Affiliations Council. Past roles include chair of the Board of Directors for the Association of Academic Health Care Centers (AAHC), chair of the Council Deans, and board member of the Association of American Medical Colleges was elected in 2011 as member-at-large-representative for the American Association for the Advancement of Science medical sciences section. Pomerwas inducted into the Institute of Medicine in 2011.

Pomeroy received bachelor's and medical degrees from the University of Michigan and completed her residency and fellowship training in internal medicine and infectious diseases at the University of Minnesota. She earned an MBA from the University of Kentucky. She has held faculty positions at it is University of Minnesota, University of Kentucky, and University of California (UC) Davis; she is currently professor emerita at UC Davis. Pomeroy was chief of infectious diseases and associate dean for research and informatics at the University of Kentucky. She joined UC Davis in 2003 as executive associate dean and in 2005 was appointed CEO and vice chancellor of the Health System and dean of the School of Medicine. She became president of the Albert and Mary Lasker Foundation in June 2013.




