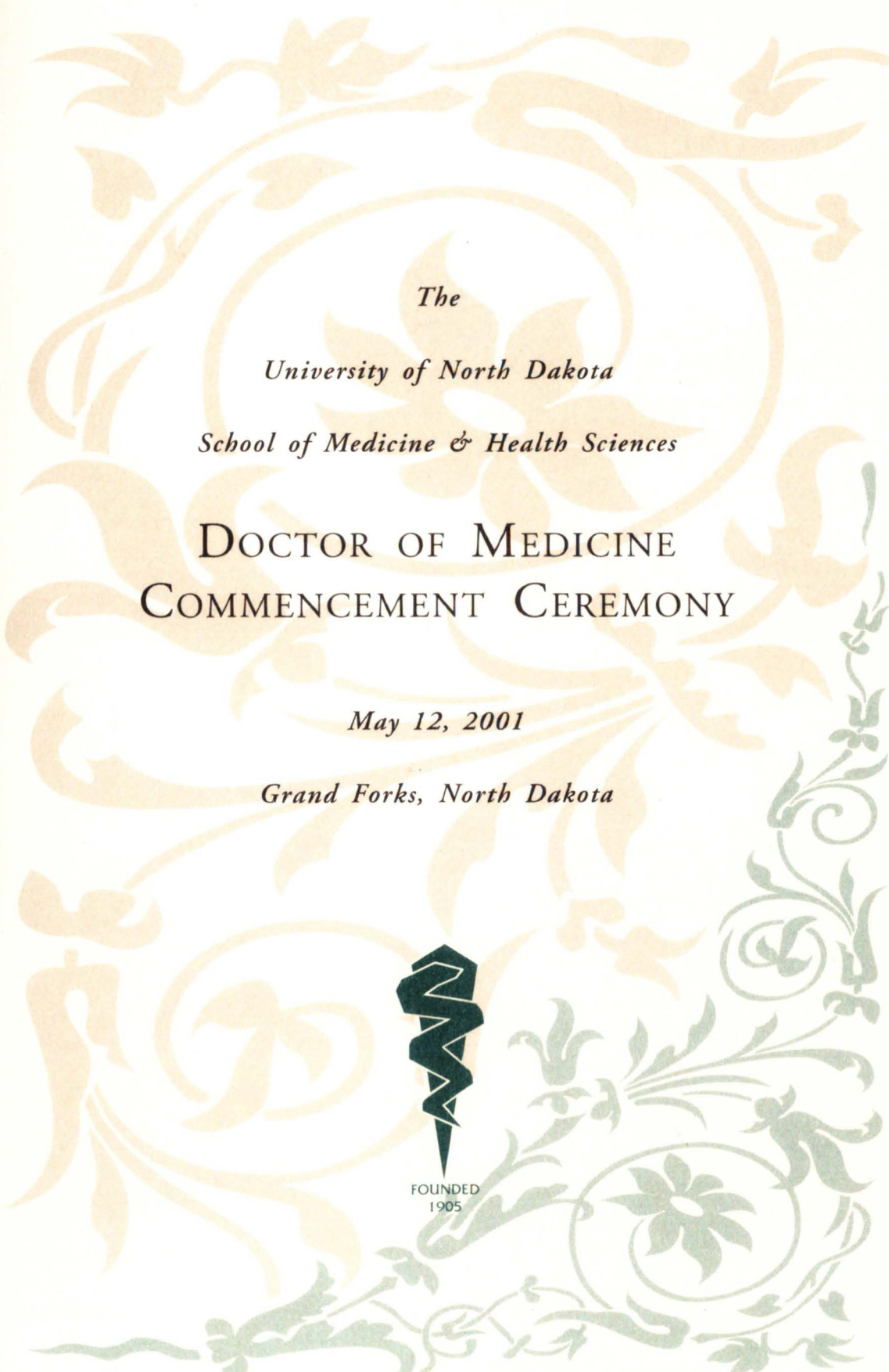

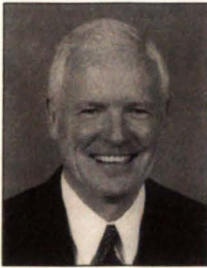

THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AND HEALTH SCIENCES, *founded in 1905, was a two-year school of basic medical science until 1973 when the North Dakota Legislature approved initiation of a four-year curriculum leading to the doctor of medicine degree. The school offers a statewide, university-based, community-integrated medical education program which places an emphasis on primary care. Practicing physicians, constituting the majority of the faculty, educate medical students in clinics and hospitals throughout the state.*

The mission of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences is to educate and prepare North Dakota residents as physicians, medical scientists and other health professionals for service to the people of North Dakota and the nation, and to advance medical knowledge through research. Through its federally-funded Indians Into Medicine (INMED) Program, the school seeks to address disparities in access to health care by educating American Indians for careers in medicine and other health professions.

The first two years of medical education are provided at the UND campus in Grand Forks. The third year is completed in hospitals in Fargo and Bismarck, and the fourth year consists of clinical rotations at Grand Forks, Minot, Bismarck and Fargo. Students may elect to take the majority of their third year in rural communities through a program called ROME, Rural Opportunities in Medical Education. Medical students also have the opportunity to experience training in other parts of the country and even the world during fourth-year electives. Postgraduate residency training in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery and psychiatry, and a one-year transitional program is conducted in the state's four major cities.

The University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences offers a combined M.D./Ph.D. program which permits the student to pursue a terminal degree in one of the basic science disciplines while earning the doctor of medicine degree. Students who pursue the M.D./Ph.D. degree devote six or seven years to this goal and are interested in careers in teaching and/or research as they relate to the practice of medicine.

In addition to the medical education program the school offers graduate study in clinical laboratory science and physical therapy as well as the basic sciences of anatomy and cell biology; biochemistry and molecular biology; microbiology and immunology, and pharmacology, physiology and therapeutics. Undergraduate study is offered in cytotechnology, athletic training, clinical laboratory science and occupational therapy. An intensive, one-year certificate program is offered for those wishing to become physician assistants.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Heidi Heitkamp, J.D., former attorney general and tax commissioner for the State of North Dakota, was born and raised in Mantador in southeastern North Dakota. She served as attorney general from 1993 to 2000 and tax commissioner from 1986 to 1992. She ran as a candidate for governor of North Dakota in the fall of 2000.

A 1977 graduate of UND where she earned a bachelor of arts degree in political science, she went on to complete a law degree at Lewis and Clark Law School in Portland, Oregon, in 1980.

During her tenure as North Dakota's elected attorney general, her major accomplishments included rewriting the state's juvenile justice law and open records and meetings law, implementation of a statewide anti-drug strategy and the establishment of the state's Blue Ribbon Panel on Tobacco.

Heitkamp gained national recognition for her involvement in the lawsuit brought by 46 states against the tobacco industry to recover the costs of treating illnesses attributed to smoking. The outcome of the lawsuit has resulted in a settlement which is expected to funnel more than \$800 million to North Dakota over the next 25 years.

As tax commissioner, she led an effort to implement a fair share program, a major audit initiative which resulted in the collection of more than \$300 million of unpaid taxes; a state Taxpayer's Bill of Rights, and litigation of *Quill v. State of North Dakota*, a U.S. Supreme Court case concerning the collection of sales and use taxes on mail-order catalog sales.

Heitkamp and her husband Darwin Lange, M.D., a 1982 graduate of the UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences, have two children and reside in Mandan, North Dakota.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT



Richard Olafson, M.D., of Fargo, an alumnus and former faculty member and administrator of the UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences, receives today the Honorary Doctor of Letters degree from the University of North Dakota.

Dr. Olafson has dedicated more than 30 years to the development and growth of the UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences. He was a pioneer in advancing medicine and medical education in North Dakota, playing an important role in the expansion of the UND medical school from a two-year, basic science school to a complete, four-year, M.D. degree-granting institution.

A native of Drayton, North Dakota, Richard Olafson received his bachelor of arts degree, cum laude, from UND and the bachelor of science in medicine degree, cum laude, from the UND School of Medicine. He went on to earn the M.D. degree at the University of Pennsylvania where he also received postgraduate training. He took a fellowship in neurological surgery at the Mayo Graduate School of Medicine. He is certified by the American Board of Neurological Surgery.

Throughout his career, he served the UND medical school in several capacities including as a faculty member in neuroscience; assistant dean for the Southeast Campus; director of graduate medical education, and director of the transitional residency, a one-year training program for medical graduates. In his role as associate dean for veterans affairs, he strengthened the relationship between the medical school and the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Fargo. He also served as interim chairman of the Department of Neuroscience and as chief of its neurosurgery division. He currently holds the title of Professor Emeritus of Neuroscience.

He has been a tireless advocate for medical students and residents, always seeking the best educational experiences for them. He has served as mentor and role model, encouraging and guiding students concerning decisions about their careers in medicine.

Retired in 1998, Dr. Olafson has had a significant impact on the positive, cooperative efforts that have led to improved health care services in the Fargo-Moorhead community. This impact can still be seen today in the community which offers an example of community-based medicine worthy of being emulated nationally.

Dr. Olafson's commitment to medical education and the highest standards in the medical profession has resulted in an environment which offers exemplary health care for citizens of North Dakota and the Upper Midwest region.
