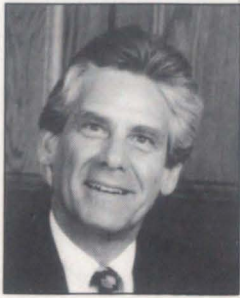

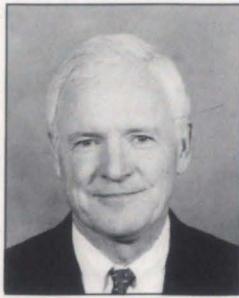

THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AND HEALTH SCIENCES, founded in 1905, was a two-year school of basic medical science until 1973 when the North Dakota Legislature approved initiation of a four-year curriculum leading to the doctor of medicine degree. The school offers a statewide, university-based, community-integrated medical education program which places an emphasis on primary care. Practicing physicians throughout the state constitute the majority of the faculty.

The mission of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences is to educate and prepare North Dakota residents as physicians, medical scientists and other health professionals for service to the people of North Dakota and the nation, and to advance medical knowledge through research.

The first two years of medical education are provided at the UND campus in Grand Forks, third year in hospitals in Fargo and Bismarck, and fourth year in clinical rotations at Grand Forks, Minot, Bismarck and Fargo. Portions of the curriculum are conducted in 29 smaller communities throughout North Dakota. Medical students also have the opportunity to experience training in other parts of the country and even the world.

The UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences also offers postgraduate residency training in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery and psychiatry, and a one-year transitional program. In recent years, the school has developed and initiated a combined M.D./Ph.D. degree which permits the student to pursue a terminal degree in one of the basic science disciplines while earning the doctor of medicine degree.

The educational program also includes graduate study in clinical laboratory science and physical therapy as well as the basic sciences of anatomy and cell biology, biochemistry and molecular biology, microbiology and immunology, pharmacology and toxicology, and physiology. Undergraduate study is offered in cytotechnology, athletic training, clinical laboratory science and occupational therapy. An intensive, one-year certificate program is offered for those wishing to become physician assistants.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Allen Van Beek, M.D., is a native of Westfield, N.D., the son of Lester and Florence Van Beek. He graduated from Pollock (S.D.) High School and attended Northwestern College in Orange City, Iowa, and North Dakota State University in Fargo, N.D. He earned the bachelor of science in medicine (B.S. Med.) degree from the UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences in 1966 (when the school offered only a two-year medical education program).

Dr. Van Beek earned the doctor of medicine (M.D.) degree at the University of Minnesota and went on to intern at Brooke Army General Hospital in San Antonio, Texas, in 1968. He took general surgery training at Indiana University School of Medicine in Indianapolis, Indiana, and later trained in plastic surgery at Southern Illinois University School of Medicine in Springfield.

He was a flight surgeon in the U.S. Army from 1969 to 1971 and served with the First Air Cavalry Division in Viet Nam.

Dr. Van Beek received the Kleinert Fellowship in Hand Surgery at the University of Louisville School of Medicine in Louisville, Kentucky, where he also was selected for the Kleinert Fellowship in Hand and Microsurgery.

He is a clinical associate professor of surgery at the University of Minnesota School of Medicine and associate professor of plastic surgery at Southern Illinois University School of Medicine. Associated with Plastic Surgery Specialists, P.A., in Minneapolis, he is the sole or contributing author of numerous professional journal publications and books, including *Microsurgery* (1978); *Principles of Microneurosurgery*, *Essentials of Plastic, Maxillofacial, and Reconstructive Surgery* (1987); *Hand Clinics* (1990), and *McCarthy Plastic Surgery* (1990).

In 1992, Dr. Van Beek was the focus of intensive, international media attention for his role in reattaching the arms of John Thompson of rural Hurdsfield, N.D., after a farm accident. The surgery was conducted at North Memorial Hospital in Minneapolis, one of the top microsurgery centers in the Midwest due primarily to Dr. Van Beek who has worked there since 1981.

He has been recognized with numerous awards and honors including the Distinguished Service Awards from the American Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery in 1995 and the Plastic Surgery Education Foundation in 1996. He served as president of the American Society for Reconstructive Surgery, the Minnesota Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, the Southern Minnesota Medical Association and the American Society for Peripheral Nerves. A member of the Alpha Omega Alpha honorary medical society, he serves on the board of directors of the American Association of Hand Surgery.

He and his wife, Sharon, have three sons, Gregory, Troy and Jeremy, and reside in Minneapolis.
