See - Indians

I am very anxious to find out just exactly how you are getting along with the plan that you and Superintendent Cross proposed for the various Indian Reservations, and which had the approval of the Indian Bureau. I naturally want to be sure that you submit that to the Indian Agencies in North Dakota. I am dropping them all a line today telling them that you will be around to see them within the next few weeks, first to Elbowoods, then Belcourt, Fort Totten, and then back home. Be sure to do this at your earliest convenience.

In corroboration with our agreement your time will expire on the 31st day of May.
