Van Hook, North Dakota, Dear Mr. Stenersons The resolution of your local dated May 3 just came to my office this norming. I appreciate very much receiving the opinions of you falls. I hope that you will give me the benefit of your ideas at other times. Mr. Lenize and I are doing everything we can to keep the Garrison pool level down to 1830 feet. The Army Engineers are a toughtoutfit to buck and we will need all the help we can get from an organization such as your own out in North Dekota. Hearings have been completed on my bill to cancel seed and feed loans, and we expect a report from the conmittee within mahort time. I intendeto keep pushing this bill all I can, but an not too hopeful of securing any action before the sumer adjournment. The comodity credit corporation storage program is tied up by disagreement between the Senate and the House over who shall control the appointment of the directors of the corporation. I surely hope that the matter can be struightened out soon so that the program can be put into effect for this year's crop. I hope you will pass this information on to the nembers of your local.
