Dear Mr. Winger:

This acknowledges your recent letter. You can be sure that I am sympathetic to and aware of your problem.

Yesterday by a nine- margin an amendment was defeated in the House which would have forbade purchase of land above the 1830 foot level for the Garrison dam.

I have absolutely no trust in the Army Engineers and I think Mr. Lenke and Senators Langer and Young feel the same way. We are outnumbered down here but we are fighting the many unfair practices which have been typical of the Army Engineers in the Garrison Dam project.
