Dear Mr. Comissioner:

In further reference to Ar. Spaulding's report to you regarding the Tribal Council's resolution requesting additional surplus connectities.

In my telephone conversation with Mr. Spaulding, due to poor telephone connections, he evidently misunderstood and included that we had been promised figs.

Since our resolution we have been promised the same number of potatoes we received last year, two carloads of apples, honey, and dried milk. We have not as yet been assured dried fruit, although last year we received quantities which proved very helpful.

We want to assure you that we appreciate any help you can give us in obtaining surplus food commodities, as we had been informed that we would not receive any great amount of surplus commodities.
