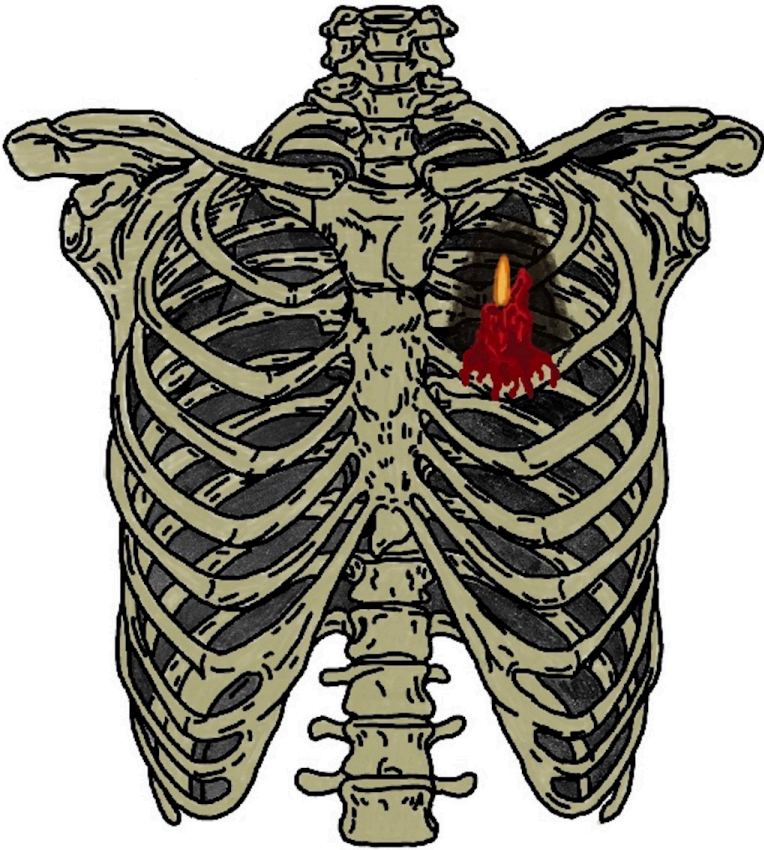
Flicker
