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PREFACE

The sixteenth volume of the Work Papers from the Summer Institute of Linguistics at the University of North Dakota covers a wide variety of topics.

The first section includes four papers dealing with American Indian Languages. Two of these deal with analysis of verb systems and two with phonology.

The second section consists of four papers dealing with tone. Two consider the relation of tone to register, while a third presents an argument against a commonly held position on the derivation of tone. The fourth offers an analysis of the tonal system of a language from Chad.

The final section includes a single paper: a contribution to the rapidly growing field of linguistic use of data processing.

The papers included in this volume are written in pre-publication form. Therefore, if anyone should want to copy or quote from these articles, he should first obtain permission from the individual authors.

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
