Honorable William Langer United States Senator Washington, D. C.

Dear Sir:

In re settlement of damages in connection with the purchase of certain Indian lands from the Indians of Standing Rock Reservation, I am enclosing herewith a formal petition for extension of the date of expiration of Public Law 870, 81st Congress, H.R. 5372, Under the Act which was approved September 30, 1950, the time of expiration is January 31, 1953. Present indications indicate there is grave danger that this contract, together with the reports in connection therewith, will not be properly executed within the time necessary for filing with the Congress.

Please submit this petition to the Congress for thwith and try and obtain the necessary extension. It may be the Congress willnot feel that they should extend this Act to the Cheyenne Tribe. If there is any objection on that feature, they can extend it to the Standing Rock Indian Tribe.

Will you kindly wire me the prospects pertaining to this extension so I can report to the Army, the Indian Service and the Tribe.
