The following announcements were made:

- a. Janelle Kilgore, Director of Financial Aid, described a change to final grading due to the Department of Education's last date of attendance rule. She described how faculty should determine the last date of attendance. Ms. Anderson illustrated how Campus Connection grading has been changed to accommodate this requirement. Discussion ensued.
- b. Mr. Zerr shared with the Senate the he will report when Senate actions have final approval. He then reported that the Definition of a Credit Hour, including online courses is officially approved as policy.

- c. The Committee on Committees reported the appointment of Jesse Rhoades to the Vice President of Research Policy and Procedures Committee. It was also reported that the Committee on Committees will be sending the preferences for committees request in January.
- d. Mr. Zerr indicated that the next possible Senate meeting is in January. He requested that senators please hold January 16 in case the meeting is needed. SEC will make the decision before the end of December. The February Senate meeting will be held as usual.
 - e. The Faculty Handbook Committee is working to split the current Handbook into two sections. The first will be the Organization and Services Guide. The Committee has updated the first of three parts of the Organizations and Services Guide. The second section will be called the Faculty Handbook. There will be more information coming later.

5.

Mr. Zerr called attention to the minutes of the November 7, 2013 meeting. There were no additions or corrections to the minutes. There was a motion of approval by Mr. Munski and a second by Ms. Stone. The minutes were approved as distributed.

6.

The question period was opened at 4:32 p.m.

- 1. There was an update on the Writers Conference from the question period at the last meeting. Dean Storrs spoke of the work that is being done to financially support the Conference. She requested any ideas to raise funds. The spring 2014 Conference will be April 2-4, which is a reduction in the number of days. The University has agreed to support the Conference. Crystal Alberts, co-chair of the Conference, gave a description of the conference and the authors attending. The question was raised on how faculty can assist in raising funds. Ms. Storrs spoke of how the faculty could share with the community the value of the Conference. Faculty can also give financially. Grants are being written and have been throughout the year. Eric Wolfe, co-chair of the Conference, shared the general cost and how the cost was covered in the past. His information revealed that with no University funding, there is a significant amount to raise.
- 2. Mr. Geiger asked Provost DiLorenzo about the reorganization of the Vice President of Research to report to the Provost. Mr. DiLorenzo described that the intent was to promote academics and research working more closely and this being a more seamless ways to support the faculty. There have not been many changes yet but he hopes to make more next semester. He will have information on metrics and benchmarks at that time as well. Mr. Geiger asked if there will be goals set. Mr. DiLorenzo responded absolutely and they will be articulated.

The question period closed at 4:44 p.m.

7.

Mr. Zerr called attention to the annual report from the Senate Legislative Affairs Committee. Ms. Smart moved to accept and file the two annual reports. There was a second by Ms. Gjellstad. The motion was approved.

8.

The Curriculum Committee report was presented. Mr. Zerr pointed out the new programs and two new courses in the section that required Senate approval. Ms.

Baker moved approval. Mr. Munski seconded the motion. Discussion ensued. The vote was taken and the Curriculum Report was approved.

9.

Mr. Zerr called attention to list of candidates for graduation in December. He indicated that there was one additional name, Silas Pera. Mr. Harsell moved approval. Mr. Towne seconded the motion. The list with the one addition was approved.

10.

The proposed Senate committee changes for the Senate Executive Committee, Committee on Committees and Legislative Affairs were reviewed. Mr. Munski moved to approve the proposed changes to all three committees. The motion was seconded by Mr. Oberg and approved.

11.

The recommendations by the Academic Cabinet to the Tenure and Promotion policy were reviewed. The first recommendation is to section ii.5.3.B.2 to remove the Graduate Dean from the process. The second is adding new language to section P II.8.2. Mr. Zerr asked for a motion to the two items. Mr. Munski moved to approve them as a package. The motion was seconded by Mr. Towne. Discussion ensued. Mr. Geiger asked about the procedure for the SMHS where the Provost is not the Vice President for that college. Mr. Sum indicated that there is a section in the Faculty Handbook that states this portion does not apply to the SMHS. There was a friendly amendment to remove "such as instructor" in part 11.8.2. P. b. The friendly amendment was accepted by Mr. Munski and Mr. Towne. Ms. Rakow moved to table until the next meeting. A second was made by Mr. Towne. Mr. DiLorenzo asked whether the second change was already in the handbook. It was clarified that it was all new handbook language. A vote was taken and the motion to table was approved. This item will be on the agenda for the next Senate meeting.

12.

The final item was a proposed change to the Constitution. Mr. Zerr indicated that this must be acted on at two Senate meetings. He gave background information for the proposed change. Mr. Munski moved to approve. There was a second by Mr. Sum. Mr. Towne shared information from the Faculty Handbook and urged careful consideration before acting on the matter. Discussion continued. Mr. Towne move to table until personnel issues in the Faculty Handbook could be gathered together and that the information is more easily found and understood. The motion was seconded by Ms. Rakow. Mr. Sum, chair of the Faculty Handbook Committee, indicated that the request for the new Faculty Handbook section will not be coming soon. There was discussion regarding tabling the matter. Motion to table failed. The vote occurred on the motion to approve the recommended Constitution amendment and the motion was approved. This matter will come again to Senate at the next meeting.

Dear Chairman Zerr:

On Thursday, August 29, 2013, members of the Senate Legislative Affairs Committee (LAC) met for first time this academic year. The current members of the committee are the following: Dr. R. Zerr (Senate Chair); Mr. N. Creamer (Student Body President); Dr. M. Gjellstad (President Designee); Mr. A. Oberg (Student); Mr. J. Mitzel (Student); Dr. D. Poochigan (Faculty/A&S); Dr. Julia Ernst (Faculty/LAW); Dr. Diane Darland (Faculty/A&S), Dr. T. Petros (CCF member), and Dr. N. Vogeltanz-Holm (Faculty/MED/Chair).

At this first meeting, convened by Senate Chair Zerr, the LAC considered three issues: (1) a request from a North Dakota State legislator regarding the LAC's position/response to certain issues under consideration by the ND Legislature's Interim Higher Education Funding Committee (HEFC); (2) discussion of the purpose and structure of the LAC; and (3) naming a Chair for the LAC. Dr. Vogeltanz-Holm was named chair and is currently also functioning as secretary. Dr. Zerr included three documents at the meeting: the LAC document from the UND Senate Committees Manual; and two documents from the ND HEFC.

Our second meeting was on Tuesday, October 15. The committee discussed potential changes to the current LAC document; and briefly discussed how the LAC might assist the UND Senate in increasing awareness about matters before the HEFC and working with the President's office on these issues. The group proposed the following changes to the LAC document: VP Walton would replace the President designee member and the UND Staff Senate President would be added as a member. Dr. Zerr agreed to discuss this potential change with VP Walton before the LAC proceeded with the proposal to the Senate.

Our third meeting was on Thursday, November 14. We continued our discussion of the purpose of the LAC. Dr. Zerr reported that VP Walton agreed to serve on the committee, pending Senate approval of the proposed change. Dr. Vogeltanz-Holm said she had informally asked Staff President Hillebrand if she would be willing and able to serve on the LAC if the change were approved. She said she would and that Staff Senate has been working toward placing their members on UND committees when possible. Further discussion of the LAC document resulted in agreement to edit certain sections and provide an updated version to the Senate for consideration. We continued to discuss the most effective ways the LAC could assist the UND Senate, UND administration, the CCF, and legislators. We continued to discuss Pathways and Performance-based funding. Student members of the committee discussed their work on proposed resolutions regarding both Pathways and Performance Funding. There was a clear consensus among the LAC members that having a more engaged and responsive UND campus community, with staff, students, and faculty working together, is the most effective way to ensure our views are considered when decisions are made at UND, the NDUS, the SBHE, and in state government.

This report to the UND Senate and the proposed changes to the Legislative Affairs Committee, UND Senate Committee Manual, was reviewed by LAC members.

The Committee may bring any resulting recommendations and/or resolutions to the University Senate

Because regular University Senate meetings during legislative sessions are spaced too far apart to allow the Senate to address legislative issues in a timely manner, the Committee may communicate to the appropriate legislative authorities its view, clearly identified as the Committee's view, with formal or informal consent of the Senate Executive Committee. The Committee shall then provide the text of its communication to

the Senate for ratification no later than the next regularly scheduled meeting.

When, because Senate agenda and meeting schedules and the schedule for an item of legislation are such that the Senate will not have an opportunity to speak to the legislation at an early enough time for its views to be taken into account, the Senate Legislative Affairs Committee may communicate to the appropriate legislative authorities its view, clearly identified as the Committee's view, so long as it first obtains the concurrence of the Executive Committee with or without a formal meeting of the latter, and, promptly after the committee has communicated its views to the legislative authority, provides the text of its communication for dissemination to the Senate with the Senate's next agenda.

Maintain and keep current committee website.

Acting of its own volition, upon the request of the Senate or Senate Executive Committee, the Committee shall conduct studies and bring recommendations to the University Senate and/or the Student Senate.

Areas of study and review shall include, but are not limited the following:

Recommendation: Seek University Senate approval to amend the Faculty Handbook to reflect the 2011 change to the Graduate Dean's review of promotion files and existing practice.

Brief summary: In 2011, the Academic Cabinet changed the process in which the Graduate Dean (now the Graduate Studies Dean) reviews promotion files.

In short, promotion applications currently follow this process:

Departmental Committee review & advice to Chair

Department Chair recommendation

College Committee review & advice to Dean

Dean's recommendation

University Promotion Committee review & advice to Provost

Committee of Deans' review & advice to Provost

Provost's recommendation

President's decision

Prior to 2011, the Graduate Dean reviewed promotion applications of all members of the Graduate Faculty and provided written advice to the promotion candidate's Dean, in the form of a memo supporting (or not supporting) promotion. This required the Graduate Dean to review dozens of files in a very short timeframe, between the time allowed for departmental and college review and the Dean's review. It also was questioned by some whether the Graduate Dean's relatively narrow first-hand knowledge of a promotion candidate was sufficient basis for such advice. In 2011, this was changed so that the Graduate Dean no longer provided separate written advice, but instead joined the Committee of Deans. The Committee of Deans provides advice to the Provost on all promotion applications, during the timeframe between the University Promotion Committee's review and the Provost's review.

In reviewing the Faculty Handbook, we saw that this change in process likely requires a formal amendment to the Faculty Handbook: Under II-5 Promotions, section 5.3.B.2 states, "The dean of the college or school involved must seek the written advice of deans for whom the candidate for promotion has done considerable work and the written advice of the Dean of the Graduate School when the candidate for promotion is a member of the graduate faculty."

Recommended action: Propose to the University Senate the following amendment to section II.5.3.B.2 of the Faculty Handbook:

2. Groups and Persons Advisory to the Recommending Authorities. The department chairperson must seek the advice of a department committee. The dean of the college or school involved must seek the written advice of deans for whom the candidate for promotion has done considerable work and the written advice of the Dean of the Graduate School when the

candidate for promotion is a member of the graduate faculty. The Vice President for Academic Affairs must seek the advice of a University Promotion Committee appointed by the President, and of a committee of four or more deans selected by the deans and including the Graduate Studies Dean. Except for the committee of deans, all advisory groups must be composed of faculty. All advisory groups must record votes for and against promotion, and the record of the votes must be made a part of the promotion file. All written advice must be part of the promotion file.

Recommendation: Clearly and appropriately communicate to faculty that the University generally will not recommend granting tenure to a faculty member who does not also achieve promotion to Associate Professor.

Brief summary: Under II.5.3.A of the Faculty Handbook, "assistant professors in their sixth year in rank" are reviewed for promotion to associate professor if such promotion has not been recommended earlier. Under SBHE Policy 605.1.3.c, "Eligibility for tenure requires a probationary period of six years of continuous academic service to the institution," with limited exceptions. Accordingly, it is typical that most faculty apply for both promotion from Assistant to Associate and tenure in their sixth year.

In the past, it was an occasional practice that a faculty member who did not achieve promotion to Associate would nevertheless be granted tenure. It appears that this practice was meant to avoid the "up or out" consequence of denying tenure (SBHE Policy 605.1.4.c.vi requires, "A terminal appointment with notice of nonrenewal must be given to a faculty member no later than the end of the sixth year of probationary appointment if the decision is made to deny tenure.").

More recently, under President Kelley's leadership, the practice has been that a faculty member who does not achieve promotion to Associate should not be recommended for tenure.

Recommended action: Consider amending an appropriate section of the Faculty Handbook to reflect this practice. Section II.8.2, UND Administrative Guidelines for Development of Tenure Recommendations, appears to be issued by the VPAA & Provost (last issued or amended 11/14/2002). The following provision could be added to this section:

P. A tenure-eligible Assistant Professor ordinarily must put forth an application for both promotion to Associate Professor and tenure in his or her sixth year. If the Assistant Professor does not achieve promotion to Associate Professor, then the President will recommend that his or her tenure application also be denied.

II. THE UNIVERSITY LEGISLATURE

1. Legislative Bodies

- a. The University Legislature shall consist of the Council and its Senate. The faculty's legislative powers shall reside in the Council and its University Senate.
- b. The Council consists of the following: The President; the Vice Presidents; Associate Vice Presidents who concurrently hold faculty rank; the Registrar; the Director of Libraries; all deans; all department chairpersons; all of the <u>full-time benefited faculty of any rank</u>, including lecturer, instructor, assistant professor, associate professor, and professor of the rank of instructor, assistant professor, associate professor, and professor; program directors, coordinators, assistant and associate deans who concurrently hold faculty rank; professional librarians; and such other academic personnel and administrative officers as the Council may designate.
