Dear Bill:

We are returning the letter addressed to you by James Hall of Elbowoods under date of January 24th.

Since that time we have conferred with Mr. Hall together with the Superintendent of the Agency, also the Agricultural Agent and the Chairman of the Tribal Council in this office as of February 17th. Those matters were thrashed out and we believe that Mr. Hall has written to you since.

In this conference we did not reach a determination as to whether it was advisable for this agency to reestablish their loaning functions on the reservation. there are so many complications involved, that it was decided that we wait for further developments which involve the completion of the State organization, which cannot be before March 24th.

We have been waching closely your activities regarding the Bureau of Indian Affairs. I have given those matters considerable thought myself and I believe you are strictly on the right tracl/
