a. The Strategic Plan Rollout will be held at 2:30 p.m. on Friday, May 5, 2017.

- b. Provost DiLorenzo provided an update on the budget:
 - The General Fund is now determined by the Legislature.



Committee Recommendations

Primary Recommendation:

- 1. Develop New and Enhance Current Online and Distance Educational Opportunities at the University of North Dakota
 - UND's strategic plan will likely emphasize increasing online educational programs and
 courses. To be successful, this will require the shifting and re-focusing of current resources
 as well as the likely generation of additional resources. We urge the University Senate and
 the UND administration to engage this committee and use its members' expertise as a
 resource for developing strategies for increasing online and distance educational offerings
 and opportunities, while also enhancing the quality of existing online and distance
 programs.

Supporting Recommendations:

- Continue Developing, Promoting, and Providing Instruction in Best Practices for Online and Distance Instruction
 - Consistent with this year's strategic planning process, UND needs to ensure that it
 remains at the forefront of online and distance education. This goal is well served when
 our faculty is provided with frequent and varied learning opportunities in online and
 distance course and program development and implementation. It is critical that faculty
 members have the skills to integrate best practices into their courses and programs and
 that they participate through the discovery process in the further identification and
 refinement of best practices in online and distance education.
- 2. Establish Connections Between the Senate Online and Distance Education Committee (SODEC) and Other Committees Addressing Online and Distance Education
 - We strongly recommend that the University Senate Executive Committee assist in
 establishing avenues by which members of SODEC simultaneously serve as liaisons or
 members (voting or nonvoting) as appropriate on committees in academic affairs,
 budget/finance, or other areas having a scope of work pertinent to online and distance
 education. For example, VP Brekke included a member of SODEC on the Tuition Model
 Working Group established this year to arrive at recommendations for a tuition model
 consistent with the Board of Higher Education draft guidelines.
- 3. Advocate for Online/Distance-Friendly Policies and Competitive Tuition Structures
 - Accomplishing our committee's primary recommendation requires that the University Senate by itself and through our committee continue to advocate for university policies and tuition structures that facilitate and support the growth in online and distance education at UND.
- 4. Incent Online and Distance Program Development and Enhancement, the Enrollment of Online and Distance Students, and the Retention and Graduation of Online and Distance Students
 - Our committee recommends that programs, departments, and colleges be incentivized
 to strengthen existing and develop new online and distance education programs in a
 manner that recognizes the importance of increasing enrollments, retention, and
 graduation rates.

Summary of Committee Activities for AY 2016/2017

The Senate Online and Distance Education Committee (SODEC) met seven times during AY 2016/2017. Dr. Jeff Holm served as Chair of the committee this year, Dr. Carenlee Barkdull served as Past Chair, and during this year Dr. Heather Terrell was elected and served as Vice Chair. This year our committee focused on the following topics:

- 1. increasing awareness of our committee and its purpose as well as our committee members' expertise in online and distance education. We wanted to increase the committee's role and impact on academic and budgetary decisions affecting online and distance education. Early in the academic year we sent a "letter of introduction," a fact sheet, our committee's charge, and a list of committee members and their contact information (see appendix A) to several UND Vice-Presidents, all College/School Deans, several Associate Deans, and all Department Chairs. We also invited VP & Provost DiLorenzo and VP Brekke to discuss with our committee various matters of academic/programmatic and budgetary interest at our November meeting. One result of this work was the inclusion of one of our committee members on the Tuition Models Working Group constituted by VP Brekke this spring.
- 2. Educating faculty in best practices regarding online and distance education. For several years our committee has played a role in providing, sponsoring, and supporting workshops and fora for faculty on diverse topics germane to online and distance education. This year these included multiple sessions addressing such issues as the potential development of a Center for Teaching Excellence at UND, practical information about how to develop online programs, strategies for enhancing teaching in an online format, how to enhance and expand learning in multiple formats including online, open educational resources, and how to use the Blackboard learning management system.
- 3. Examining policies and procedures at UND that impact online and distance students especially those that serve as barriers to their enrollment, retention, and/or graduation. For example, online students pay several mandatory fees that they perceive as irrelevant and providing no benefit. We are continuing to address some of these issues and are in the process of preparing a brochure describing the services and resources available at UND for online students.

Plans for AY 2017/2018

In addition to continuing to focus and address the three areas above, the committee has identified the following two goals for the coming year:

- 1. Develop a strategy for focusing appropriate resources on efforts to improve retention and graduation of online students
- 2. Advise and consult with administration regarding the impact of target enrollments for online education in the strategic plan including but not limited to the resources necessary to provide exemplary online instruction.
- 3. Seek out opportunities for committee members to consult to or serve as members on committees in academic affairs, budget/finance, or other areas having a scope of work pertinent to online and distance education.





Each year, more than 3,000 students take online, independent study courses from UND. SPEA courses are offered through collaboration with 25 UND departments.




Growing Enrollment

SENATE ONLINE AND DISTANCE EDUCATION COMMITTEE (SODEC)

(Revised Charge Approved by SODEC and submitted for approval to University Senate, September 27, 2016)

Purpose:

To provide oversight and advocate for the provision of teaching and learning experiences with an exceptional level of quality for online and distance education students within the state, region, and beyond.

Membership:

Faculty – Nine with two members from the College of Arts and Sciences, and one member from each of the other colleges (voting)

Immediate Past Chair (voting)

Distance Education Librarian of Chester Fritz Library (one, voting)

Office of Extended Learning (one, voting)

Center for Instructional Learning and Technologies (one, voting)

Office of Instructional Development (one, voting)

Director of Assessment and Regional Accreditation (one, voting)

Students (one undergraduate and one graduate, voting)

Terms:

Faculty – three years

Immediate Past Chair (one year)

Distance Education Librarian of Chester Fritz Library - concurrent with office

Office of Extended Learning – concurrent with office

Center for Instructional and Learning Technologies - concurrent with office

Office of Instructional Development - concurrent with office

Director of Assessment and Regional Accreditation - concurrent with office

Undergraduate student enrolled in an online or distance degree program (one year)

Graduate student enrolled in an online or distance degree program (one year)

Selection:

Approximately one-third elected by the University Senate in April and assuming responsibilities Fall Semester. Undergraduate student selected by Student Government in April and assuming responsibility Fall Semester; graduate student to be nominated by the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies and approved for membership by a majority vote of the Graduate Studies Committee.

Functions and Responsibilities:

Acting of its own volition, upon the request of the Senate and/or others, the committee shall assume the following responsibilities:

- Advocate for the use of "best practices" relative to faculty development, delivery methods, and the administration, teaching and evaluation of online and distance education courses and programs.
- 2. Foster collaboration to achieve the committee's purpose.
- Provide support, assistance and consultation to deans, departmental chairs and program directors relative to the management, monitoring, and evaluation of online and distance education courses and degree programs.
- 4. Provide oversight for quality and integrity in the online and distance learning environment, while being guided by the principle that academic standards reside with the Provost and Deans and within academic departments.
- Make resource recommendations to the institution congruent with achieving our purpose statement.
- 6. Promote campus-wide interest in and advocacy for UND's role in providing exceptional and enriching online and distance learning experiences.

Report to Senate:

Prepare an annual report and submit it to the Senate secretary two weeks before the March Senate meeting.

Background

A university-wide budget reduction process was initiated in January 2017. This was in response to legislative intent to cut appropriated funding to higher education as part of its plan to present a balanced budget to the Governor for the 2017/18 biennium. The cuts were necessitated by low revenue forecasts for the energy and agriculture sectors. At the writing of this report, the final budget reduction is not known. The University is planning for a 12% reduction across all primary and support units. The separately funded School of Medicine and Health Sciences is planning for a 10% reduction. The current budget reduction follows the 2016 allotment which required the university and the SMHS to trim about 9% of their appropriated funds from their 2015/16 biennium budget. The repeated budget reductions are occurring during a time of administrative transition. They also are concurrent with the University's ongoing efforts to migrate its budgeting process from an incremental model to a Model for Incentive-based Resource Allocation (MIRA), which began transitioning in FY 2017.

Committee activities

The SBRRC met three times in the fall. During this time it revised the committee's charge to more accurately reflect its developing role in providing advice and oversight to the administration in budget

matters and to codify its expanded membership. The committee also continued its efforts to keep informed about the evolving MIRA model. It provided feedback on the MIRA 103 presentation used to educate units about the new budget model.

Since January 30 the SBRRC has been meeting every Tuesday 4:30-6:30 pm in Twamley Room 305. This dramatic change coincided with the initiation of the current budget reduction process. The frequency of the meetings was recommended by the Provost, who has made a special effort this year to communicate about the budget reduction process. The changed circumstances resulted in significant turnover in voting membership.

At the outset of this new phase, the SBRRC resolved to make communication an important part of its work. In collaboration with members of the Senate Executive Committee, the SBRRC initiated a weekly update on budget matters, which is distributed university-wide by email. Readers were encouraged to submit anonymous comments and questions through the University Senate Feedback web page. The University Senate's Budget Information web page was expanded to become a repository for the weekly updates, responses to feedback, and SBRRC minutes. This site is freely accessible to the public.

The tone and purpose of the weekly meetings has evolved over time. Initial sessions consisted mainly of free-ranging discussions of the budget reduction process. The meetings now have more focus, and the committee is attempting to address big issues that impact the budget as suggested by the Provost. The committee has heard from special guests including members of the MIRA implementation team, the Dean of Libraries and Information Services, and members of the data analytics team.

The IAC usually meets as a whole committee twice per school year and is divided into subcommittees that meet more regularly. The subcommittees are as follows:

- 3. Fiscal Integrity. Eric Murphy, chair
- 4. Equity and Diversity. Alycia Cummings, chair
- 5. Fan Experience/Behavior & Facilities. Thomasine Heitkamp, Chair

The 2016-2017 Academic year was a departure from year's past. President Kennedy in consultation with the Senate Executive Committee and the Athletics department asked the IAC to make recommendations by November 1, 2016 on the number of sports teams that UND should sponsor based on a budget deficit the department was facing. The two guiding factors the President presented were:

- · Competitive athletic programs, and
- Athletics programs we can afford and that is held within defined funding metrics.

With this added charge, the committee set out on an aggressive weekly meeting schedule, had many reports to view, variables to explore (Title IX, Diversity, Rosters, League affiliations, facility issues, and current and projected budget issues). Our meetings were attended by various University staff and the Grand Forks media. After very thoughtful deliberations, based on what the committee had learned throughout our meeting schedule, we forwarded our recommendation to the President. The motion was drafted by committee member Eric Murphy, and with the exception of one vote, was unanimously sent to President Kennedy. For the purpose of brevity, the motion was to retain our current number of sports teams (20), investigate changing league affiliation (BigSky to Summit and Missouri Valley), and increase the level of funding for UND Athletic teams to championship levels.

Each subcommittee met throughout the academic year and has submitted the reports below.

1. Academic Integrity & Student Athlete Well-being. Gary Schindler, chair

There are several Athletic Academic Services (AAS) available for student athletes at UND. The Schubert Athletics Academic Center, laptop check out program, exam proctoring, LifeSkills, Hawkacademy, and others programs in place to increase student athlete (SA) success in the classroom. There will be increased attention on the education of mental health issues. The Hawkacademy includes habitudes, lifeskills (time/finances/stress mgmt and sports nutrition is included for the Student Athletes. SAAC meets every other week and they are working on initiatives like "teams supporting teams" with a SAAC Cup competition between sports teams. The BigSky SAAC competition is a toiletry drive, with all UND donations collected going to the Community Violence Intervention Center (CVIC) in Grand Forks.

2. Governance and Compliance. Janna Schill, chair

The committee met and discussed the policies that pertain to lettering in a particular sport at UND, policies are unique to each sports' needs and are in alignment with other schools. The conference affiliation changes are ongoing at this time. Compliance meetings are held regularly within the department and throughout campus; this has been extended to involve the youth camps held at UND as well. There is work being completed on a campus policy for Minors On-Campus. Eligibility standards were also discussed at the meeting for students enrolling in Division I schools on or after August 1, 2016.

3. Fiscal Integrity. Eric Murphy, chair

We entered the fall with an unknown future as the State of North Dakota struggled with declining revenue, which ultimately impacted the ability of the University of North Dakota to continue to fund athletics as previously done. Often the levels of funding were beyond the legislative appropriation, necessitating the President finding funds within the institution to support Athletics. The IAC was charged by President Kennedy to closely examine the Department of Athletics to determine where savings could be realized. At the beginning of this process, IAC was examining all sports with a focus on costs, revenue, success in competition, student athletes served as well as overall public participation in the sporting events held by each team. In the middle of the process, the President determined that certain sports would not be considered for elimination. After much discussion, the committee accepted a motion to continue all of the current sports with an emphasis on taking a multi-faceted approach to raise additional revenue in lieu of making cuts.

In the spring semester the continued decline in revenue at the level of the State of North Dakota resulted in a significantly reduced amount of legislative support for the University of North Dakota, necessitating that the Department of Athletics would make budget reductions. This resulted in the decision to no longer field varsity teams in women's ice hockey and in men's and women's swimming and diving. While some stakeholders question the decision, in part, because the requested savings were less than that realized by the cuts made, there were factors with scholarship numbers for other sports required by our future conference affiliation, the need to enhance funding of successful programs, and a one-time funding offset by the NCAA for cost of attendance, that necessitated greater savings. This was the prudent decision to make under the circumstances and will permit a continued upward trajectory in performance by the remaining teams in the Department of Athletics.

4. Equity and Diversity. Alycia Cummings, chair

It is a challenge for Athletics to recruit and retain minority student athletes (SAs), coaches, and staff. This is due in part to the demographics of UND and the greater Grand Forks area. That being said, the number of minority SAs, coaches, and staff members at UND was consistent and/or slightly higher than in previous years. Importantly, Athletics has a greater number of minority SAs than what is found in the general student body. With the

elimination of women's ice hockey and men's and women's swimming, the overall diversity of SAs will decrease for the next few years. However, other sports are planning to do more international recruiting, which will eventually improve the overall diversity of Athletics. Title XI and equity are being closely monitored with the sport eliminations. Currently the number of male SAs is slightly lower than the number of female SAs. Participation numbers, scholarship allocations, and individual sports' budgets will be managed in different ways to ensure equity while also adequately supporting championship teams.

5. Fan Experience/Behavior & Facilities. Thomasine Heitkamp, Chair

The success of our sports teams was emphasized and the increase attendance at sporting events noted. At the time of the meeting women's volleyball and men's football had already won the conference championship. Later men's and women's basketball won the conference championships. In swimming and diving 16 records were broken including 80 new swims in the all-time top-10 in school history. 4 relay championships; 1 individual championship; 2 NCAA Zone diving qualifications and 15 NCAA "B" cuts. The committee wished to emphasize the outstanding year for sports at UND!

The new smartphone apps are getting folks engaged in the games. They can vote for most valuable player on their app. The live streaming of games has not only increased fan involvement but increased revenue. Concerns were raised about the limitations of the wireless capacity at the Alerus. That is being addressed in the new agreement. New Fighting Hawks logos were placed all over campus in March.

RE: Criteria for new tenure-track hires

At our regular SBRRC meeting on 20 March 2017, members appointed a subcommittee to investigate the criteria that the Provost, Deans, and Chairs ought to use when the hiring freeze for tenure-track faculty lifts. The Provost had posed this question to the committee earlier in the semester: "When the decision is made to restart tenure seeking hires (write-ups and decisions), how should that be made?"

The subcommittee members (Mary Askim-Lovseth, Melissa Gjellstad, and Thomasine Heitkamp) examined current UND strategic planning documents, faculty handbook language, and policies at other universities. They then presented a set of draft recommendations to the full SBRRC for discussion on 27 March 2017. During committee discussion, the SBRRC suggested amendments to the recommendations but favored approving the list and forwarding it to the Provost. The SBRRC wanted a copy of the memo sent to the University Senate Executive Committee (SEC) and members of the Deans' Council. The SBRRC will consider the revised list, listed below, for approval at the 04 April 2017 meeting. (Approved 04.04.17)

Pertinent <u>UND Faculty Handbook</u> language can assist in guiding this discussion. Under Part I, Section 8.1 restates verbatim <u>SBHE Policy 605.1</u>. Refer to subsections 1C, 3B, and 6 for specific information from SBHE on the fiscal connections to tenure. Section 8.2 states the UND implementation of SBHE 605.1. Refer to subsections A, B, G, K, and M for specific information from the university on the same topic.

Recommendations for Evaluating Requests to Recruit Tenure-Track Faculty

The purpose of hiring faculty in tenure-seeking lines is to improve the quality of the academy (University/College/School/Department) to advance scholarship, teaching, learning, and the academic climate. The request for recruitment of a faculty member to serve in a tenure-seeking line should take into consideration the following objectives.

- 1. Support the mission of the University and College/School in meeting the benchmarks established and outlined in existing strategic plan(s).
- 2. Create the capacity to increase the diversity of the faculty, particularly in historically underrepresented groups.
- 3. Attract candidates from a national search with the promise of excellence in teaching and the potential to distinguish themselves in research.
- 4. Ensure the capacity to maintain the integrity of the profession in meeting all accreditation guidelines and state licensing requirements. Non-accredited units should maintain national/international best practice standards for their discipline.
- 5. Recruit <u>new</u> students to the University, either in existing quality programs or in new programs that address strategic and unmet needs.
- Advance academic priority areas outlined (e.g. Grand Challenges) and explain how the person in the tenure hire would engage in activities that complement current faculty efforts in the Department/College/School.
- 7. Build on an established track record of supporting tenure-seeking faculty with appropriate resources. Include a written statement explicating expectations for promotion and tenure, mentorship and coaching—including funds for startup money and considerations of space management. If that does not exist, units wanting to hire must describe how this will be improved prior to approval to recruit.
- 8. Ensure cross disciplinary/inter-professional work as a component of the faculty hire.
- Describe how the position serves the needs of ND as a state administered institution to include addressing workforce development.
- 10. Ensure sound fiscal management of the unit that supports the academic priorities of the institution.

Summary of SBRRC actions in response to University Senate Resolution "Exploration of Sustainable Budget Models for UND Libraries"

March 7, 2017: The resolution and accompanying "Roadmap to a Sustainable Library Budget" document were distributed at the SBRRC March 7 meeting. The resolution charged the SBRRC to examine the possibilities listed in the Roadmap, determine the feasibility of one or more of the options listed therein, (or additional options that may arise), and then consider implementation of options deemed feasible. The Roadmap consisted of eleven options that could be grouped into projects that would require working with the UND Alumni Association & Foundation, fees that would require Student Senate input, revenue that would be dependent on MIRA, cost-saving measures that could be initiated by the library.

April 4, 2017: SBRRC Committee members were surveyed in advance of the meeting about perceptions of each Roadmap option. Questions included estimating time needed to achieve sustained funding, anticipated funding range, potential barriers to implementation, and additional suggestions. Nine responses were aggregated.

The Dean of Libraries and Information Resources was invited to attend the April 4 meeting in which the committee discussed the Roadmap's various funding/cost-saving options.

The following general take-home messages emerged from SBRRC discussion:

- 1. Work with the UND Foundation where the Foundation believes it can be of the most help.
- 2. Develop and maintain an open dialogue with students about the benefits and needs of the library: seek partnerships for funding opportunities.
- 3. Prioritize funding options: There is no need to continue with ODIN if better more cost effective alternatives exist.
- 4. Integrate the budgetary needs into the MIRA framework: Make the case to the Support Unit Allocation Committee for data-driven, strategically justified budget requests.

The results of the survey and these recommendations were forwarded to the Dean of Libraries and Information Services on April 5.

This document was approved by the SBRRC at its April 11, 2017 meeting.

If transfer students completed fewer than **60** transferable semester credits, they must verify high school graduation by submitting all official high school transcripts directly to the UND Office of Admissions.

If transfer students have completed fewer than 24 transferable semester credits and are under the age of 25, they must submit official ACT or SAT test scores.

Applicants who have enrolled in a college or university other than the University of North Dakota and who are applying for admission must submit all required official documents to the Office of Admissions before any information regarding their status will be provided. In addition, students who have attended an institution of higher education outside of the United States, including those who participated in Study Abroad programs, must submit a course-by course evaluation through World Education Services at: www.wes.org (http://www.wes.org). Most Canadian universities do not require a course-by-course evaluation. A student will be notified if a course-by-course evaluation is needed. All claims for transfer credit must be made within the semester in which the student matriculates.

The Office of the Registrar evaluates and records transfer credit. Students with unsatisfactory records, as well as students who have been asked to withdraw from other institutions due to unsatisfactory scholarship or behavior, ordinarily will not be allowed to enter the University. If special permission for admission is granted, the student is placed on academic probation.

Students who owe money to previous institutions and who cannot submit an official transcript are not eligible for degree seeking admission.
